Shifting Timelines & Major BuildBPS Projects

COVID-19 disrupted our project timelines and caused delays across the board:

- Active construction projects like My Way Cafe, BAA
- Horace Mann swing space identification
- Jackson Mann planning
- McCormack & BCLA Merger
- Announced closure of all middle schools
- Planned expansion of K-6 Elementary and 7-12
 Secondary Schools

As a result, we've narrowed our focus prioritized 5 key projects we need to make progress on:

- Horace Mann & Jackson Mann facilities
- Edwards School Closure
- McCormack-BCLA Merger
- 7-12 Expansion at Charlestown High School & adding
 7th grade at East Boston High School
- Dual Language Expansion

BuildBPS Update for McCormack & BCLA

Recent Background

- 11/14/2020: Last Community Meeting with BCLA & McCormack Communities
- 12/02/2020: School Committee Presentation on BuildBPS, including reconfiguration updates for BCLA & McCormack
- 12/16/2020: School Committee voted the close the McCormack Middle School and merge it with BCLA
- 12/22/20: Facilities subcommittee met with architects to share input on the design of science labs and life skills spaces
- Design Team continues to meet weekly, with some breaks for the holiday

Decisions Shared on 11/14

- The new 7-12 will be an open enrollment school serving the same populations as are currently served by McCormack and BCLA
- SY20-21: School will operate on two campuses
 - Grades 7-9 at Columbia Point (McCormack)
 - Grades 10-12 at Hyde Park Complex (BCLA)
- SY22-23: All students in grades 7-12 will attend the Columbia Point campus
- Strong partnership with UMass Boston
- McCormack facility will add two science labs and a life skills room for SY21-22
- In discussion about other facility and outdoor field and spaces design / upgrades / renovations

Decisions Made to Date

- Student Supports Offered: the merged BCLA-McCormack school will continue to serve their current student strands:
 - General Education
 - Inclusion
 - Sheltered English Immersion (SEI) Spanish
 - o Emotional Impairment (EI)
 - Students with Limited or Interrupted Formal Education (SLIFE)
 - Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA) for students with Autism

Work in Process

- School Culture: Design Team is working with Leading Learners Institute to craft the mission & vision of the new school to reflect shared values
- School Leadership: Selecting a Head of School for the new 7-12 school will be led by the two Secondary School Superintendents, Elia Bruggeman & Lindsa McIntyre, in partnership with the two school communities
- Facility Renovations: The Design Team and central office are collaborating on assessing the financial investment and priorities for renovating the McCormack building
- Partnership with UMass: The Design Team is working with Laura Hayden, the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs, to identify partnership opportunities

Decisions Ahead

- Grade Band: Have not yet determined if the BCLA-McCormack school will serve students in 6th grade in SY21-22
- School Times: Finalizing school hours and school start time
- School Status: Will the school be a pilot school or a traditional school in the long term?
 - The Pilot status of the school is currently under consideration
 - The Design Team has recommended converting the school to a traditional (non-Pilot) school, which is one of the options under consideration.

School Choice Process

- All current BCLA & McCormack students will be assigned to the new merged school for SY21-22
- If families want to change their preference, they can do so in the appropriate round in 2021:
 - Round 1 is 1/5 1/29 (grades K0, K1, 6, 7, 9)
 - Round 2 is 2/8 4/5 (all other grades)
- The new 7-12 school will be called "Boston Community Leadership Academy-McCormack" on all School Choice materials
