## Appropriation and Tax Order for the fiscal year Commencing July 1, 2015 and ending June 30, 2016

#### ORDERED:

I. That to meet the current expenses of the City of Boston, in the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2015 and ending June 30, 2016, the respective sums of money specified in the schedules hereinafter set out, be, and the same hereby are, appropriated for expenditure under the direction of the respective boards and officers severally specified, for the several specific purposes hereinafter designated and, except for transfers lawfully made, for such purposes only said appropriations, to the extent they are for the maintenance and operation of parking meters, and the regulation of parking and other activities incident thereto (which is hereby determined to be \$20,500,000), being made out of the income from parking meters and, to the extent they are for other purposes, being made out of the proceeds from the sale of tax title possessions and receipts from tax title redemptions in addition to the total real and personal property taxes of prior years collected from July 1, 2014 up to and including March 31, 2015, as certified by the City Auditor under Section 23 of Chapter 59 of the General Laws, and out of available funds on hand, (which is hereby determined to be \$40,000,000) as certified by the Director of Accounts under said Section 23, and the balance of said appropriations to be raised by taxation pursuant to Section 23 of Chapter 59 of the General Laws:

Dear Councilors:

I retransmit herewith an appropriation order for the Boston Public Schools for Fiscal Year 2016, in the amount of \$1.0135 billion, submitted pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224 of the Acts of 1936, as amended by Chapter 190 of the Acts of 1982, as further amended by Chapter 701 of the Acts of 1986, Chapter 613 of the Acts of 1987, and Chapter 108 of the Acts of 1991.

Projected cost growth exceeding City revenue growth, and reductions in federal and net state aid presented challenges for BPS in developing the FY16 budget. However, thanks to a City appropriation increase of \$38.6 million, this budget provides the financial support for many key investments. These include continuing to expand our early education program by 100 new K1 seats; expanding inclusive opportunities for students with disabilities; maintaining hiring autonomy for schools to attract, hire, retain and develop, talented teams of highly-qualified, diverse educators; offering extended learning time to 16 additional schools; enhancing digital learning opportunities through technology infrastructure and program expansion; continuing to invest in underperforming schools; and supporting the BPS network structure. Most significantly, this budget increases investment in Weighted Student Funding to schools increase by \$21 million.

The recently concluded Superintendent search demonstrated the passion that our City has for the future of its children. The unparalleled level of transparency and public dialogue through this process revealed the problems, progress, and opportunities of our school system. As we transition to a new era within BPS, my commitment to our students remains steadfast. We must meet the system's numerous challenges head on and operate more efficiently to achieve better results. This budget moves the City in the direction of better outcomes for all students through further efficiencies and targeted investments. I commend Interim Superintendent McDonough and the School Committee for their work in developing this budget.

I respectfully request your support of the FY16 appropriation for the Boston Public Schools.

Dear Councilors:

I retransmit herewith for your approval, an order appropriating \$40,000,000 to the Other Post Employment Benefits (OPEB) Liability Trust Fund authorized under Chapter 32B, §20, as added by Chapter 479 of the Acts of 2008. Your annual approval of the OPEB contribution will bring the total aggregate amount appropriated toward the City's and Public Health Commission's unfunded liability to \$307 million. The OPEB actuarial valuation as of June 30, 2013, estimated the City's unfunded liability at \$2.1 billion.

Building on the changes agreed to under the first Public Employee Commission (PEC) agreement which resulted in greater employee and retiree cost sharing of health care costs, the City and its unions successfully signed a second five-year PEC agreement in January 2015. We will continue to work with our unions to ensure the sustainability of health care benefits within the means of the City's current budget, both now and in the future.

The City of Boston acknowledges that the MSBA's grant program is a non-entitlement, discretionary program based on need, as determined by the MSBA, and any costs the City of Boston incurs in excess of any grant approved by and received from the MSBA shall be the sole responsibility of the City of Boston, and that the amount of borrowing authorized pursuant to this vote shall be reduced by any grant amount set forth in the Project Funding Agreement that may be executed between the City of Boston and the MSBA.

#### Dear Councilors:

I hereby transmit for your approval an Order authorizing the City of Boston to appropriate the amount of Six Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$6,500,000) from the City's Capital Grant Fund in order to provide funding for a Street Rule Book Project and a new Parking Meter and Management System to be managed by the Boston Transportation Department ("BTD"). The funds shall be credited to the Capital Grant Fund from the Parking Meter Fund.

Through the Street Rule Book Project, the City will catalogue a block by block inventory of parking rules in the City of Boston. This accurate record will allow BTD to craft more effective policies for the City's on-street parking inventory so that the supply of curb space and the demand for on-street parking are better matched.

A new Parking Meter and Management System would allow the City to upgrade its system of over 8,000 parking meters. The system would include at least three technological advances: the ability to allow residents to pay meters with credit cards, the ability to implement dynamic pricing policies, and the ability of drivers to access real-time parking availability information.

I urge your Honorable Body to adopt this Order as soon as possible so that the City of Boston may use the funds to proceed with the above-mentioned projects.
