

## Boston PILOT Assessment Summary

### Tufts University

Calendar Year 2016

This report responds to the City of Boston's inquiry about services provided to residents by tax exempt institutions.

#### Process Summary

Community Relations collected data on activities, programs, volunteer efforts, and services that Tufts students, faculty, and staff have provided to benefit the City of Boston and/or its residents. For the purpose of this survey, we concentrated on activities that occurred during calendar year 2016. This includes financial aid. The total is **\$9,577,588.20**.

We solicited information from each of our schools. The data outlined on the following pages represents the results collected. Please note that we did not put a dollar value on the use of space on campus even though many other organizations were charged a rental fee. Also, this report does not include salaries paid to residents of the City of Boston (560 employees; \$39 million).
