


Entire South Bay Harbor Trail

Project Goals

- Deficient Pedestrian Accommodation | Improve Pedestrian Accommodation
- Deficient Bicycle Accommodation | Improve Bicycle Accommodation
- Deficient Safety | Improve Safety
- Deficient Connectivity | Connect to the Existing South Bay Harbor Trail at Gillette Property



Project Scope

- Construct expanded ramps at roadway intersections and other necessary locations
- Construct a separated bicycle path parallel to the existing sidewalk along Frontage Street NB
- Re-stripe the West 4th Street Bridge to include a buffered bicycle lane in the westbound direction and a designated bicycle lane in the eastbound direction
- Re-stripe the Broadway Bridge to include a buffered bicycle lane in the eastbound direction
- Re-stripe Dorchester Avenue between the Broadway Bridge and the Fort Point Channel to include buffered bicycle lanes in each direction and between the West 4th Street Bridge and the Broadway Bridge to include buffered bicycle lanes in the southbound direction
- Reconstruct Foundry Street between Dorchester Avenue and Greenbaum Street to narrow the travel lane and include a cycle-track at-grade with the sidewalk.
- Add safety features, including lighting, as needed




ALERT: Traffic Impacts

- Alternative routes may be suggested at the West 4th Street bridge and Broadway bridge





















EXISTING CONDITION - 10' SHARED USE PATH

















EXISTING CONDITION - WEST FOURTH STREET BRIDGE
















EXISTING CONDITION - BROADWAY BRIDGE
































EXISTING CONDITION - FOUNDRY STREET

















EXISTING CONDITION - DORCHESTER AVENUE


GO BOSTON 2030 BETTER BIKE CORRIDORS

Excerpted map showing South Bay Harbor Trail in context with other nearby priority projects






Proposed SBHT Route in Context with Street Network
