

## Location Plan for 3 Proposed Artistic Bike Racks
















Translation of Cast Iron Railing Concept to Artistic Bike Rack by Artists for Humanity

Please accept this letter of support for the custom bike racks proposed by Washington Gateway Main Street (WGMS).

#### Locations

WGMS approached BTD early in their planning process to understand our placement guidelines and processes for bike rack installation. I have visited the proposed locations with WGMS at least twice and have reviewed their site plans for our compliance with our guidelines. The proposed locations are within the "furnishing zone" and an accessible pedestrian path is well-maintained

#### Design

The proposed racks are stainless steel, a durable material well-suited for outdoor use. While Cityinstalled racks are generally powder-coated black, we have found that this treatment increases maintenance needs when the paint is chipped and the underlying metal begins to rust. While stainless steel can be painted, the potential for chipping could mean these new racks may begin to look a bit ragged. Additionally, the proposed design provides two points of contact for a parked bike, which will help minimize bicycles falling over and becoming a tripping hazard.

#### Installation and Maintenance

Thanks to WGMS early outreach, we have set aside money within our annual bike rack budget to install these racks through our City contractor. We will remain responsible for ensuring they are firmly fastened to the ground. If the racks themselves are damaged (bent, defaced, etc.), BTD will not be responsible for fixing or replacing them.
