National Register Significance

- Eligible under Criteria A & C
- Significant associations with the City of Boston's agrarian history and suburban development
- Rare surviving example of late 18th/early-19th century farmstead in Boston
- Well-preserved example of Georgianstyle farmhouse and Italianate-style barn

Village of Mattapan, Dorchester

- Mattapan originally a village in Dorchester (settled in 1630)
- Economy was primarily agricultural
- Mid-19th century, the Old Colony Railroad connected Dorchester with Boston
- 1870, Dorchester annexed to Boston and Mattapan became a neighborhood in the city





Samuel Fowler Farm


- Property originally settled by Samuel Fowler in the late 18th century
- Fowlers built house between 1786 and 1806
- Sold out of Fowler family in 1820

Henry and Mary Clark Farm

- Acquired by Henry and Mary Clark in 1837
- Clarks built the extant barn ca. 1860
- Second generation of Clarks subdivide farm in 1895; lots sold and developed between 1910 and 1918
- Farm owned by three generations of Clarks until 1940

Jorge and Ida Epstein Farm

- Sold to Jorge and Ida Epstein in 1941
- Epstein operated architectural salvage from the property, est. in 1955
- Epsteins (in trust) owned the property until 2015
- Sold to Historic Boston Inc., current owners





The House

- Georgian Revival-style
- Additions from ca. 1806, late 19th c., and ca. 1967
- Interior mural and decorative painting dates to mid-20th c.

- Italianate-style architectural details
- Intact original exterior and interior finishes
