Goal: Grow capacity to use technology and data to drive programming and partnerships to improve health outcomes.





Child, Adolescent and Family Health

Addresses physical and mental health needs of Boston children, youth and families, particularly those whose health is compromised by social inequality.

FY20 Accomplishment

Provided over 900 families with home visiting services and links to resources through its Healthy Baby Health Child Boston program.

Homeless Services

Oversees homelessness programs, such as emergency shelter, health and behavioral health services, job readiness and training, substance use treatment, recovery support, and rapid rehousing services.

FY20 Accomplishment

Permanently placed 351 individuals outside of shelter, a 20% increase from this time last year.

Community Initiatives

Supports environmental concerns, chronic disease prevention and management, access to health care, and the enforcement of citywide health regulations.

FY20 Accomplishment

Rapidly implemented new Board of Health and state regulations on vaping and flavored tobacco, protecting our youth and particularly youth of color.

Infectious Disease

Includes disease surveillance, investigation of cases and outbreaks, funding a continuum of HIV/AIDS-related education and care through the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Treatment Modernization Act, community and provider education related to communicable diseases, and the operation of a tuberculosis (TB) clinic.

FY20 Accomplishment

Investigated 11,824 non-COVID infectious disease reports, and managed 1,410 contacts associated with non-COVID-19 conditions.





Objective 5: Stop the Spread of Covid19

Contact Tracing

In response to COVID 19, the Commission worked to increase the contact tracing team from its original team of 15 full time public health nurses to between 40 and 50 today.

- Trace and monitor contacts of infected people
- Support the quarantine of contacts
- Provide linguistically and culturally competent resources to contacts







Objective 6: Coordinate Resources with healthcare partners & others - Help BPHC programs get the resources they need to support guests, clients, & staff

Redeployment & New Roles

Disease Containment Strike Team

- 8 inspectors deployed to support 68 facilities
- Targets congregate settings with the potential for rapid spread of infection
- Public health inspectors perform "virtual inspections"
- Provide guidance on proper cleaning supplies and protocols for monitoring the wellness of staff

Protecting Vulnerable Populations

Keeping Our Health Centers and Long-term Care Facilities Resourced and Safe:

- Fulfill critical resource needs
- Provide staffing support
- Issue guidance and advisories
- Clear and frequent communication
- Deploy the Disease Containment Strike Team to protect vulnerable populations in congregate care settings

- Safety protocols for staff
- Universal COVID-19 testing for all unhoused individuals in Boston

FY21 New Initiative: Study on the implementation of a 40-bed co-ed housing facility targeting the on-street population struggling with homelessness and substance use disorder.

BPHC's Covid19 Response Plan Objectives

Objective 8: Meet Human Services Needs

- We recognize the burden that COVID-19 is placing on individuals, ranging from job loss to emergency childcare needs to mental health challenges related to isolation and fear.
- We help coordinate & monitor needs that fall outside the scope of health care needs.
- We are providing Virtual Services for Pregnant Women: Healthy Baby Healthy Child and Welcome Family is accepting referrals for pregnant women and families with infants and toddlers. Services are being offered via phone, text, FaceTime, and/or Skype – depending on the client's technology access – and are available in 6 languages.

Objectives 9: Recovery Planning

- Recovery v. Reopening:
- Reopening: Loosening restrictions.
- Recovery: Strengthening and rebuilding the health of Boston.
- **COVID-19 City of Boston Disaster Recovery Framework:** BPHC is working to help develop a framework that is effective, efficient, equitable and framed by social determinants of health and racial and social inequities.
- **Health Equity Task Force:** Recommendations for greater equity in data collection, testing sites, and healthcare services for Black, Latinx, Asian, and immigrant residents during the pandemic.
