THIS IS THE LAST OF OUR **REGULARLY SCHEDULED HEARINGS IN** THE CITY COUNCIL'S BUDGETS **REVIEW PROCESS, WHICH WILL INCOME PASS 27 HEARINGS OF THE** LAST WEEKS. THE CITY STILL NEEDS TO DECIDE TON A BUDGETS DESPITE COVID 19. AND IT'S THE COUNCIL'S ROLE TO SCRUTINIZE THE BUDGET AND THINK ABOUT HOW WE BEST MEET THE NEEDS OF THE YEAR AHEAD. SO WE HAVE BEEN DOING THAT AND WE HAVE BEEN HEARING FROM LOTS OF DEPARTMENTS. WE'VE HAD A LARGE NUMBER OF HEARINGS WITH B.P.S., AND NOW TONIGHT'S HEARING IS A DEDICATED PUBLIC TESTIMONY HEARING SO

WE'RE REALLY FOCUSED ON HEARING FROM THE PUBLIC. YOU CAN JOIN THIS HEARING. IF YOU'RE WATCHING YOU PROBABLY KNOW YOU CAN JOIN THE HEARING FROM A ZOOM RINK AVAILABLE ON A PUBLIC NOTICE, AND I WILL BE ASKING AND RECOGNIZING THEM PEOPLE IN TURN AND ASK THEM TO STATE THEIR NAME AND AFFILIATION AND LIMIT THEIR COMMENTS TO ABOUT TWO MINUTES. AND I KNOW SHE'S HERE FOR A CERTAIN WINDOW, SO I WANT TO START WITH THOSE. LEAH, WHY DON'T YOU START US OFF AND GO AHEAD. >> OH, HI, HOW ARE YOU? GOOD EVENING, EVERYONE. I AM APPEARING FROM THE BOSTON QUINZY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL. CURRENTLY, I HAVE TWO CHILDREN IN THE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL.

I HOPE THE CITY GOWGRNMENT WOULD SERIOUSLY THINK ABOUT PROVIDING MORE FUNDINGS TO THE PUBLIC SCHOOL IN THE NEXT COMING YEAR. DUE TO THE COVID 19 BEGINNING MARCH 16, ALL THE CHILDREN HAVE STOPPED ATTENDING SCHOOL, AND THEY HAVE BEEN LEARNING REMOTELY.

AND, THEREFORE, THEY HAVE --CEASE HAVING THE ABILITY TO LEARN.

WE REALLY HOPE THAT THERE WILL BE MORE RESOURCES FOCUSED ON HIRING MORE STAFF, FOR EXAMPLE ASSISTANTS IN THE CLASSROOM TO HELP THE STUDENTS GET UP TO SPEED ON THE CLASS TIME THAT THEY HAVE LOST.

MY OWN SON HAS SPECIAL NEEDS. HIS FIRST LANGUAGE IS CANTONESE AND OUR PRIMARY LANGUAGE SPOKEN AT HOME IS ALSO CANTONESE. HOWEVER, THE LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION IN THE CLASSROOM IS ENGLISH.

WE HAVE BEEN UNABLE TO ASSIST HIM WITH HIS HOMEWORK OR CURRICULUM AT ALL.

SO THERE HAS BEEN A LOT OF TIME THAT HAS GONE BY, AND HE HAS LOST THIS TIME AND HIS ABILITY TO LEARN, AND WE'RE REALLY HOPING AND STRONGLY ENCOURAGED THAT, IN THE NEXT COMING YEAR IN SEPTEMBER, THERE COULD BE RESOURCES PUT IN TO HIRING A CANTONESE TEACHER'S ASSISTANT TO ASSIST HIM WITH THE LEARNING THAT HE'S LOST AND TO HELP THEM CATCH UP.

THERE HAS BEEN AN ONGOING CONCERN WITH, ALSO,

INTERPRETATION THAT HAS BEEN PROVIDED AT THE SCHOOL. MANY ARE NOT PROFESSIONAL. AND WE AS PARENTS HAVE NOT FELT LIKE WEñr HAD SUFFICIENT -- WE HAVE SUFFICIENT EXPERIENCE IN ACCESSING INTERPRETATION.Ñ)¦ó IÑI WE REEL HOPE THAT THE CITY COUNCIL COULD MONITOR AND TO PUSH FOR MORE FUNDING AND **RESOURCES AND INVESTING IN** PROFESSIONAL INTERPRETERS. AND MY LAST COMMENT IS, AS MANY OF YOU KNOW, THE QUINCY SCHOOL IS AN HISTORICAL SCHOOL. HOWEVER. THE FACILITIES INSIDE NOT ONLY ARE THEY DATED BUT THEY'RE OLD AND FALLING APART. AND ONE OF THE BIGGEST CONCERNS WE HAVE AS PARENTS ARE SORT OF, ESPECIALLY IN THIS CLIENT, ARE THE CLEANLINESS OF THE SCHOOL. ESPECIALLY ITS BATHROOM AND ABILITY TO OFFER OUR CHILDREN RUNNING WATER FOR THEM TO SANITIZEÑI THEMSELVES. AND MANY TIMES THE TOILETS CANNOT BE FLUSHED AND THERE ARE MANY ISSUES WITH RUNNING WATER.ñr AND I'M SPEAKING ABOUT THIS MATTER IN LIGHT OF COVID 19, JUST HAVING A SANITIZED AND SANITARY ENVIRONMENT WILL MAKE ME AS A PARENT FEEL MUCH SAFER TO SEND MY CHILD TO SCHOOL. WE REEL HOPE THAT -- WE REALLY HOPE YOU WILL SERIOUSLY THINK ABOUT PROVIDING MORE RESOURCES TO SCHOOLS SUCH AS OURS. ESPECIALLY IN LIGHT OF COVID 19. AS YOU KNOW. STUDENTS TO HAVE THE QUINCY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL.ñr THIS PANDEMIC HAVE ROBBED STUDENTS OF PRECIOUS IN-CLASSxD LEARNING TIME. REMOTE LEARNING COULD NEVER TAKE THE PLACE OF IN-CLASS INSTRUCTION. NOT ONLY HAVE THEY NOT BEEN ABLE TOÑI LEARN NEW CURRICULUMS, WE HAVE SEEN THAT THEY HAVE REGRESSED AND BACKSLIDE.ñrÑi THEREFORE, WE'RE REALLY HOPING THAT THERE COULD BE MORE FINANCIAL RESOURCES AND INVESTING IN OUR TEACHERS SO THAT THEY COULD INVEST THEIR TIME IN BEFORE SCHOOL AND AFTER-SCHOOL TUTORIAL TO GET OUR CHILDREN BACK UP TO SPEED. AS WELL AS SUPPLEMENTAL LEARNING IN THE SUMMER PERIOD. CURRENTLY. THERE IS LIMITED SPACE AND SEATS AVAILABLE TO STUDENTS FOR SUMMER LEARNING **OPPORTUNITIES. NUMEROUS TIMES, WE HAVE SAT THROUGH INTERPRETATION THAT ARE INACCURATE INTERPRETATIONS THAT ARE NOT FULLY RENDERED. CASE IN POINT -- I HAT AN I.E.P. MEETING JUST A WEEK AGO FOR MY CHILD AND, IN THE MIDDLE OF THE MEETING, THE INTERPRETER THAT WAS HIRED FOR THAT PARTICULAR MEETING WAS ACTUALLY ASKED TO LEAVE BECAUSE THE INTERPRETER WASN'T PERFORMING EFFECTIVELY. AND THE SPEECH PATHOLOGIST HAD TO TAKE OVER AND SERVE AS THE INTERPRETER FOR THE REST OF THE MEETING.

AND THIS IS A RATHER COMMON EXPERIENCE FROM FELLOW PARENTS. AND THIS IS ALL I HAVE TO SAY FOR NOW.

THANK YOU SO MUCH FOR YOUR TIME, AND LISTENING TO US, AND WE REALLY JUST HOPE WE CAN LEVERAGE MORE RESOURCES IN HELPING OUR STUDENTS.

THANK YOU SO MUCH, MAY HU. NEXT UP THE MAGGIE CHEN. >> HELLO, EVERYONE. I'M A RESIDENT OF CHINATOWN AND I'M ALSO A PARENT OF A CHILD WHO'S CURRENTLY ATTENDANTING B.P.S.

I HAVE AN OLDER CHILD WHO'S CURRENTLY AN EIGHTH GRADER AT THE BOSTON LATIN ACADEMY, AND I HAVE A YOUNGER SON WHO'S PLANNING TO ATTEND HIS FIRST YEAR IN PUBLIC SCHOOL AT THE JOSIAH QUINCY SCHOOL FOR K-1. I COMPLETELY AGREE WITH THE TWO PARENTS WHO HAVE TESTIFIED BEFORE ME. HOWEVER, I'M ACTUALLY MORE CONCERNED ABOUT IN LIGHT OF COVID 19 THE SAFETY OF ALL OF OUR STUDENTS. I HAVEN'T HAD THE PRIVILEGE TO BE ABLE TO ACCESS A LOT OF THE **B.P.S. PUBLIC HEARING WHICH I** HAVE HEARD STARTED TAKING PLACE IN MARCH, AND I WAS TOLD THAT MANY OF THE BUDGETS HAVE ALREADY BEEN SET. SO, EVER SINCE B.P.S. CLOSED ON MARCH 18, THE NUMBERS OF **INFECTION -- THE CASES OF** INFECTION HAS GONE UP. IN THE U.S. ITSELF IT'S OVER 1 MILLION, AND IN THE STATE O MASSACHUSETTS, WE'RE APPROACHING 100.000. AND IT'S JUST CONTINUALLY CLIMBING, THE NUMBERS. AND SOME EXPERTS HAVE ALSO SAID THAT. THIS COMING FALL. WE'RE GOING TO SEE AN UPTICK. SO I WAS WONDERING THE BUDGET THAT HAS BEEN SET FOR B.P.S. LATIN ACADEMY. REALISTICALLY, WE KNOW THAT A VACCINE FOR COVID 19 WILL PROBABLY NOT BE POSSIBLE OR IN TIME BY SEPTEMBER. BUT COME SEPTEMBER, MY OLDER SON WOULD AGAIN HAVE TO TAKE TWO TYPES OF PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION TO GET TO SCHOOL, AND I FEEL THAT WOULD PUT HIM AT HUGE RISK OF BEING INFECTED. AND CURRENTLY, THE CLASSROOM SIZE, IT'S GOING OVER 20 STUDENTS PERÑi CLASSROOM. SO UNDER THESE CIRCUMSTANCES. I WONDER HOW IT WOULD BE POSSIBLE TO CARRY OUT SOCIAL DISTANCING. SO OTHER THAN, YOU KNOW, WE REALLY NEED TO CLOSELY EXAMINE THE PHYSICAL ENVIRONMENT OF OUR SCHOOLS, JUST AS THE PARENT BEFORE ME WHO HAVE TESTIFIED. WHICH WE'RE ALL FAMILIAR WITH. WITH THE JOSIAH QUINCY SCHOOL, THAT MANY OF THE FAUCETS DON'T HAVE RUNNING WATER. AND THERE ARE NO SOAP WHERE STUDENTS HAVE ACCESS TO TO WASH THEIR HANDS. IS THERE A WAY THAT WE CAN POSSIBLY CARRY OUT A SMALLER SIZE CLASSROOM LEARNING ENVIRONMENT SO THAT SOCIAL DISTANCING COULD REALISTICALLY **BE CARRIED OUT?** >> AS A RESPONSIBLE PARENT, I FEEL THAT I WOULD ONLY FEEL SAFE SENDING MY CHILD TO AN ENVIRONMENT THAT I KNOW THAT WOULD HAVE A RELATIVELY LESS INFECTION RATE WHEN ALL THE SAFETY MEASURES ARE BEING TAKEN. AND I REALLY HOPE THERE WILL BE MORE THAN ENOUGH RESOURCES WHERE THERE WILL BE EXPERTS AND CLEANING PROFESSIONALS THAT WILL BE HIRED TO MAKE SURE THAT THE SITE IS COMPLETE DISINFECTED AND SAFE FOR OUR CHILDREN TO RETURN TO SCHOOL.

I THINK IT'S IMPORTANT TO MAKE SPACE TO HEAR TESTIMONY IN OTHER LANGUAGES AND TRANSLATION TAKES EXTRA TIME. SO I REALLY APPRECIATE EVERYONE WHO JUST TESTIFIED AND WILL CONTINUE ON. NEXT UP IS RUBY REYES. RUBY, YOU HAVE THE FLOOR. >> THANK YOU. CAN YOU HEAR ME? >> YES. I JUST WANTED TO SAY THANK YOU TO THE MOMS WHO JUST GAVE TESTIMONY. I'M THE ONE THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE CALLS WHEN A PARENT ASKED FOR TRANSLATION A COUPLE OF DAYS BEFORE HAND AND HAD NOT RECEIVED IT. SO TRANSLATION IS A SERIOUS NEED FOR THE DISTRICT. I'M THE DISTRICT OF THE BOSTON EDUCATION JUSTICE ALLIANCE. MY NAME IS RUBY REYES. AND I WANTED TO REQUEST ADDITIONAL FUNDS FOR THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOL BUDGET WHERE MEETING COVID EFFORTS IN TERMS OF NEEDS SPECIFICALLY FOR MENTAL HEALTH SUPPORTS FOR PARENTS AS WELL AS STUDENTS, AND ADDITIONAL P.P.E.

EQUIPMENT FOR EVERYONE. AS MANY OF YOU KNOW, THERE'S BEEN CHRONIC UNDERFUNDING BY THE STATE FOR THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOL OVER THE PAST 20 YEARS. THIS YEAR, THE MAYOR GENEROUSLY GAVE A SUBSTANTIAL AMOUNT TO SUPPORT THE B.P.S. BUDGET. WE STILL HAD BUDGET CUTS THIS YEAR, SOME OF WHICH WERE TO SCHOOLS IN THE LOWEST PERFORMING TRANSFORMATION SCHOOLS BECAUSE TO HAVE THE WEIGHTED STUDENT FUNDING FORMULA. WHILE THEY ARE IN THE TRANSFORMATION PROGRAM OR TRANSFORMATION SYSTEM THAT DR. CASSELLIUS HAS DEVELOPED THIS YEAR. THEY RECEIVED BUDGET CUTS AND THEN RECEIVED ADDITIONAL STAFF PEOPLE. SO, FOR BAJA, WE KNOW FOR OVERALL THIS BUDGET WON'T MEETTHE NEEDS OF ALL SCHOOLS AND BUDGET CUTS TO A SMALLER GROUP OF SCHOOLS. SO I DO WANT TO ENCOURAGE THE CITY COUNCIL TO THINK ABOUT THE **RESILIENCY FUND AND WHERE IT CAN** BE PUT FOR THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOL CHILDREN DURING THIS TIME. I ALSO JUST WANTED TO SAY THAT, WITH THE STATE'S M.O.U. AGREEMENT WITH DESE, THAT ALSO

EVE A TEN-YEAR-OLD SON, A SEVEN-YEAR-OLD DAUGHTER AND A FOUR-YEAR-OLD DAUGHTER. ALL MY KIDS ATTEND THE LINDEN SCHOOL.

WE LIVE ON MAXWELL STREET WHICH IF PEOPLE ARE FAMILIAR WITH REST ROXBURY IT'S TWO STREETS UP FROM BILLINGS FIELD SO WE WALK OR DRIVELY BILLINGS FIELD EVERY DAY PROBABLY SIX TO EIGHT TIMES PER DAY, AND I CAN TELL YOU, WITHOUT A DOUBT, IT IS A PARK THAT IS SO ALIVE.

**IT'S ABSOLUTELY -- THE** PLAYGROUND IS ALWAYS PACKED WITH KIDS, THERE'S PEOPLE WALKING, **BIKING, PLAYING TENNIS, THERE'S** PEOPLE PLAYING BASKETBALL, AND IT'S BEING USED ALL THE TIME. I AM ADVOCATING FOR THE EXPANSION TO HAVE THE YOUTHS JOBS BUDGET TO \$15 MILLION AND THE ACCEPTANCE OF MORE EMPLOYEES WITH 5,000 SUMMER JOBS AND 1,000 SCHOOL YEAR JOBS. I HOPE AT THIS POINT THE IMPORTANCE OF FINANCIAL STABILITY WITHIN YOUTH HOUSEHOLDS IS CLEAR. NEXT TALIAH. >> HI. I'M READING THE TESTIMONY FROM ROXBURY. WE'RE ASKING CITY TO INCREASE FUNDING FOR YOUTH JOBS TO **15 MILLION AND MAKE SURE THE** JOBS ARE FULLING RUNNING. THEY SHOULD FURNISH JOBS FROM SEPTEMBER TO JUNE AND HIRE 14 TO 22-YEAR-OLDS AND GIVE GRANTS TO ORGANIZATIONS. POLICE OVERTIME SHOULD BE **DECREASED TO 20 MILLION OR LESS** AND THE POLICE BUDGET SHOULD BE DECREASED TO 374 MILLION OR LESS. INVEST THAT MONEY IN BLACK AND **BROWN COMMUNITIES INCLUDING** HOUSING, HEALTHCARE, TREATMENT, EDUCATION, JOBS AND ECONOMIC

SHEILA, YOU HAVE THE FLOOR. >> THANK YOU. THANK YOU GUYS ALL FOR BEING HERE TONIGHT. I JUST WANT TO START BY SAYING I'M HERE TO TESTIFY ABOUT THE **RENOVATIONS TO BILLINGS FIELD.** I HAVE BEEN A PARKWAY RESIDENT FOR OVER 489 YEARS. THIS WAS A TIME WHEN WE WERE GOING THROUGH A LOT, WITH A LOT OF THINGS IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD. BUT DURING THE TIME FOR SUMMER JOBS I DECIDED TO APPLY FOR A SUMMER JOB.

I GREW UP IN A SINGLE FAMILY PARENT FOR MY MOM WORKED TWO JOBS AND IT WAS REALLY DIFFICULT TO MAKE ENDS MEET.

WHEN I STARTED WORKING A SUMMER JOB DEFINITELY SAVED PIE LIFE. IT KEPT ME BUSY, IT KEPT ME INSPIRED, I MET GREAT MENTORS AND ADVOCATES THAT WANTED TO BE THERE FOR ME AND I KNEW THERE WAS MORE TO LIFE THAN JUST MY NEIGHBORHOOD AND THE KIDS AROUND THE WAY.

I REALLY HAD THE OPPORTUNITY TO HELP OUT AT HOME.

I WAS ABLE TO BUY THINGS THAT I NEEDED TO BUY FOR MYSELF AT SCHOOL AND I WAS GRATEFUL AND EXTREMELY BLESSED. IT WAS THE THING THAT SAVED MY

LIFE.

THIS IS ONE OF THE REASONS I WENT INTO EDUCATION. MEETING GREAT MENTORSnd ADVOCATES THAT REALLY INSPIRED ME TO WANT TO BE ABLE TO HELP OTHER YOUNG PEOPLE. AND AT 49. AND BEING IN EDUCATION FOR 25 YEARS. I CONTINUE TO HAVE THE LOVE AND THE PASSION FOR HELPING OTHERS. AND HELPING TO BECOME LEAD ARES. IN CONCLUSION, THAT I ASK THAT MY STORY IS NOT COMMON, BUT I ASK THAT A LOT OF YOUNG PEOPLE DESERVE AND NEED AN OPPORTUNITY TO GROW AND TO BECOME LEADERS AND PRODUCTIVE CITIZENS. AND SO I ASK TO PLEASE INVEST IN

MAY FAMILY IS SIXTH GENERATION BOSTONIAN.

I COME TO YOU TODAY TO IMPLORE YOU NOT TO PASS A BUDGET FOR FISCAL 2021 THAT HAS 60 MILLION FOR OVERTIME.

WE KNOW AND HAVE ENOUGH RESEARCH AND INFORMATION THAT SAYS COMMUNITY POLICING OR POLICING CIVILIANS AND CRIMINALIZATION HAS NOT WARRANTED A SAFE

NEIGHBORHOOD.

WE NEED TO PUT MONEY TO A BETTER USE FOR OUR YOUTH AND OUR YOUNG ADULTS.

WE COULD BETTER USE THAT MONEY FOR EMPLOYMENT, SO YOUNG ADULTS CAN HELP THEIR FAMILIES WITH EMPLOYMENT, OPPORTUNITIES DURING OUR NOVEL CRISIS.

THIS IS A TIME WHEN WE MUST STOP POLARIZING OUR NEIGHBORHOOD. THIS INCLUDES EMPLOYING FORMALLY INCARCERATED PEOPLE WHO NEED HEALING AND ECONOMIC STABILITY AFTER PRISON OR JAIL.

THE FUNDS SHOULD GO GO INTO FUNDING FOR YOUTH JOBS AS WELL. THE COMMISSIONER WANTS SOME-- WE ARE SPENDING MONEY ON MORE GUNS AND BADGES, WHY INVEST IN POLICE IF YOU CAN'T INVEST IN YOUR COMMUNITY, THE BLACK AND BROWN COMMUNITY.

MYSELF AND SOME OF THE OTHER RESIDENTS IN THE AREA WHERE I LIVE, WE ARE REACHING OUT TODAY TO BRING TO EVERYBODY'S ATTENTION AN AREA HERE IN OUR NEIGHBORHOOD THAT WHEN IMPROVED COULD YIELD A TANGIBLE BENEFIT TO BOTH THE NEIGHBORHOOD AND THE CITY.

PLEASE KNOW THAT IT IS OVERTEN YEARS AND WE'VE BEEN ASKING FOR, TO ADDRESS THIS ISSUE FOR THE SPECIFIC BOSTON CENTER FOR YOUTH AND FAMILIES IN JAMAICA PLAINS. THE FACILITIES ON HEATH STREET CLOSE TO THE BROOKLINE AND BOARD ARING MISSION HILL WHICH ARE GROWING, IT IS A WHOLE GROWING NEIGHBORHOOD AT THIS POINT. RESIDENTS OF THIS AREA, WE'RE BEYOND GRATEFUL TO HAVE SUCH A CENTER IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD. AND THE PURPOSE OF THIS TESTIMONY IS TO BRING TO YOUR ATTENTION THIS DEEPLY RUNDOWN CONDITION OF WHAT COULD BE A MODERN AND WELCOMING FACILITY, THE NEIGHBORS WOULD ACTUALLY WANT TO USE.

A REVITALIZATION OF THE OVERALL FACILITY WITH SUSTAINED EXERCISE HABITS, FUNDAMENTALS FOR EVERYONE'S HEALTH AND ENCOURAGE AN INCLUSIVE COMMUNITY MUCH IN NEED WHILE YIELDING A MORE FINANCIAL RETURN FOR THE CITY. OFTEN PEOPLE HAVE COME BUT NEVER RETURN BECAUSE UNWILLING TO USE A FACILITY THAT IS NEGLECTED, GENERALLY UNKEPT AND MINIMALLY SUPERVISED.

ALTHOUGH MORE MORE RECENTLY THERE HAVE BEEN VERY MODEST CHANGES.

THE FACILITY DOES NOT PRESENT ITSELF AS AN OPTION AND IT COULD BE, NOR IT MATCHES THE STANDARD OF A GROWING CITY SUCH AS BOSTON.

ADDITIONALLY GIVEN THAT DURING THE DAY THE FACILITY IS USED BY THE HANNIGAN SCHOOL, SCHOOL KIDS, WE FEEL STRONGLY THAT IT IS TIME TO ACT TO ENSURE THAT THESE YOUTHS ARE WELL TAKEN CARE OF AND OTHER SCHOOLS IN BOSTON CENTER ARE ALREADY DOING, THEY SHOULD NOT SUFFER.

AT THE LAST BUDGET HEARING ON BCYF IT WAS CONCERNING FOR ME TO HEAR THE LIMITED VISION FOR BCYF IN GENERAL.

THE CENTERS FOCUS IS TO ENSURE THAT KIDS STAY IN SCHOOL AND READY THEM FOR THE WORKPLACE. I WOULD LIKE TO HEAR THAT-- BROUGHT UP THE FACT THAT THE CULTURE ASIDE, IT'S JUST AS IMPORTANT.

IT WAS ALSO SURPRISING TO ME TO HEAR HIS REFUSAL FOR HEALTH AND TO SECURE ADDITIONAL FUNDING WHEN ONE OTHER COUNSELOR PROPOSED IT.

THIS FACILITY HERE IN JAMAICA PLAIN COULD BE USED FOR A VARIETY OF ACTIVITIES TO SUPPORT THE VIBE RANCEE OF THIS GREAT NEIGHBORHOOD.

AND SHOULD BE SENSE ERRED TO CREATE COMMUNITIES FOR MOST SOCIAL AND PHYSICAL WELLNESS, REDUCE RISKY BEHAVIOR AND PROVIDE A SAFE STRUCTURED ENVIRONMENT.

SO THERE IS SO MANY YOUTH THAT CAN BE DONE.

WE HAVE BEEN TRYING FOR TEN YEARS TO BRING ATTENTION TO THIS SO WE HOPE THAT IN THE 2020 BUDGET THE HELP, PHYSICAL AND MENTAL AND SOCIAL HELP OF THE NEIGHBORHOOD WILL BE TAKEN IN CONVERSATION, AND THE USE OF THE FACILITY WILL BECOME A JEWEL FOR THE NEIGHBORHOOD, THANK YOU. >> GREAT, THANK YOU SO MUCH. AND NOW NEXT UP IS NASAGE SORRY, FORGIVE ME, PLEASE CORRECT MY PRONUNCIATION.

IF BOSTON TRULY BELIEVES THAT YOUTH ARE THE FUTURE AND THE PRESENT OF OUR COMMUNITIES, THAN 15 MILLION DOES NEED TO BE ALLOCATED TO YOUTH JOBS T IS TIMES OUR CITY START INVESTING IN OUR YOUNG PEOPLE AND WORRIED ABOUT THE WELFARE OF UNDERREPRESENTED YOUTH AND THEIR

FAMILIES.

WE HAVE A COUPLE OF PEOPLE WHO SIGNED UP TO TESTIFY WHO HAVEN'T MADE THEIR WAY INTO THE WAITING ROOM YET.

AND COUNCILORS, IF ANY OF YOU WANT ME TO TEXT YOU, WE WILL DO THAT.

AND OTHERWISE IF WE DON'T GET, WE WILL CONCLUDE THE HEARING, SO WE WILL WAIT FOR AWHILE.

SO AGAIN JUST REALLY WANT TO THANK EVERYBODY, FOR SHARING. FOR SHARING AND NUDGING US IN

THE RIGHT DIRECTION.

CANDACE, CAN WE PUT UP A-- TO

LET PEOPLE KNOW THAT WE ARE

BUT MARVIN, YOU HAVE NOW GOT THE FLOOR.

I BELIEVE THAT AT THIS MOMENT IN TIME WITH THE PANDEMIC AND THE DEVASTATEDING EFFECTS ON PEOPLE OF COLOR THAT WE REALLY NEED TO LOOK AT POSSIBLE WAYS OF FUNDING JOB CREATION AND OTHER INITIATIVES IN THESE COMMUNITIES.

AND SO THE-- IT WE ARE EXPECTING THE CITY TO DOUBLE AT LEAST AND YOU KNOW, IT WASN'T GREAT BEFORE SO I THANK YOU FOR GREATING, WE GO A LONG WAY TO DOING THAT. AND SO LOOKING AT THE CAPITAL PROJECTS THAT WOULD SUPPORT THOSE JOBS.

AND SO THE HOPE IS TO LOOK AT THE CAPITAL BUDGET AND I THINK WE DID COME UP WITH A COUPLE OF IDEAS THAT PEOPLE MAY HAVE SUBMITTED ALREADY WHERE WE CAN SAVE SOME MONEY FROM CERTAIN LINE ITEMS TO OTHER LINE ITEMS. WE THINK IT IS IMPORTANT.
