Urban Food Project	The Urban Food Project has been established by Emmanuel College to provide nutrition education and information, as well as urban gardening strategies to families in Boston, specifically in Roxbury. The project targets three main areas: gardening, education and outreach. Working closely with community residents and partner organizations, Emmanuel students maintain an urban garden at Emmanuel's Notre Dame Campus and offer workshops, cooking classes and other programming tips on nutrition and healthy lifestyles for families. The urban garden is designed to demonstrate techniques and provide the skills for community residents to develop their own urban gardens. An existing greenhouse at Emmanuel's main campus allows for year-round gardening and gardening education as well as help to support the Notre Dame Campus garden. As part of its education and outreach efforts, students have established relationships with homeless mothers and children at the Nazareth Residence and fourth-grade students at the OLPH Mission Grammar School. Programming is designed to enable families to eat nutritiously in the urban food desert that is the Roxbury section of Boston.
