

### **BPHC ESSENTIAL PLAN SPOTLIGHT:**

Boston Community Health Assessment (CHA)

In 2012, BPHC and Boston Alliance for Community Health (BACH) partnered with many organizations to develop the Boston Community Health Assessment (CHA). The goal of the Boston CHA is to inform the development of strategies to address identified community health needs by providing a demographics overview of social determinants of health, and strength and weakness assessments.



With input from the community, elected officials, existing data sources, public health leaders, and other stakeholders, we used the Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnerships (MAPP) process to develop the four assessments that comprise the Boston CHA:

- (1) Community Health Status Assessment—summarizes the health status, quality of life, and risk/protective factors which contribute to health
- (2) Community Themes & Strengths Assessment—identifies themes that interest, concern, and engage the community
- (3) Forces of Change Assessment—identifies trends, factors, and events that affect health systems
- (4) Local Public Health Assessment—evaluates the activities, capacities, and competencies of Boston's public health system according to the ten essential public health services


