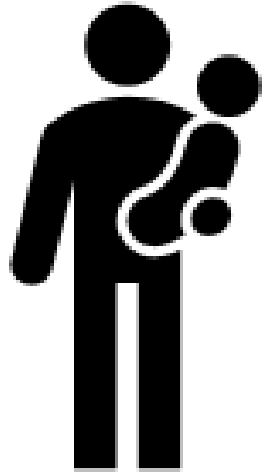


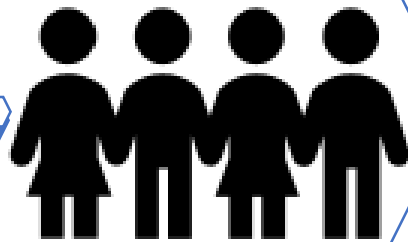

Through Boston REACH: Partners in Health and Housing (PHH), there were over **12,000** distributions of healthy affordable food to Boston residents

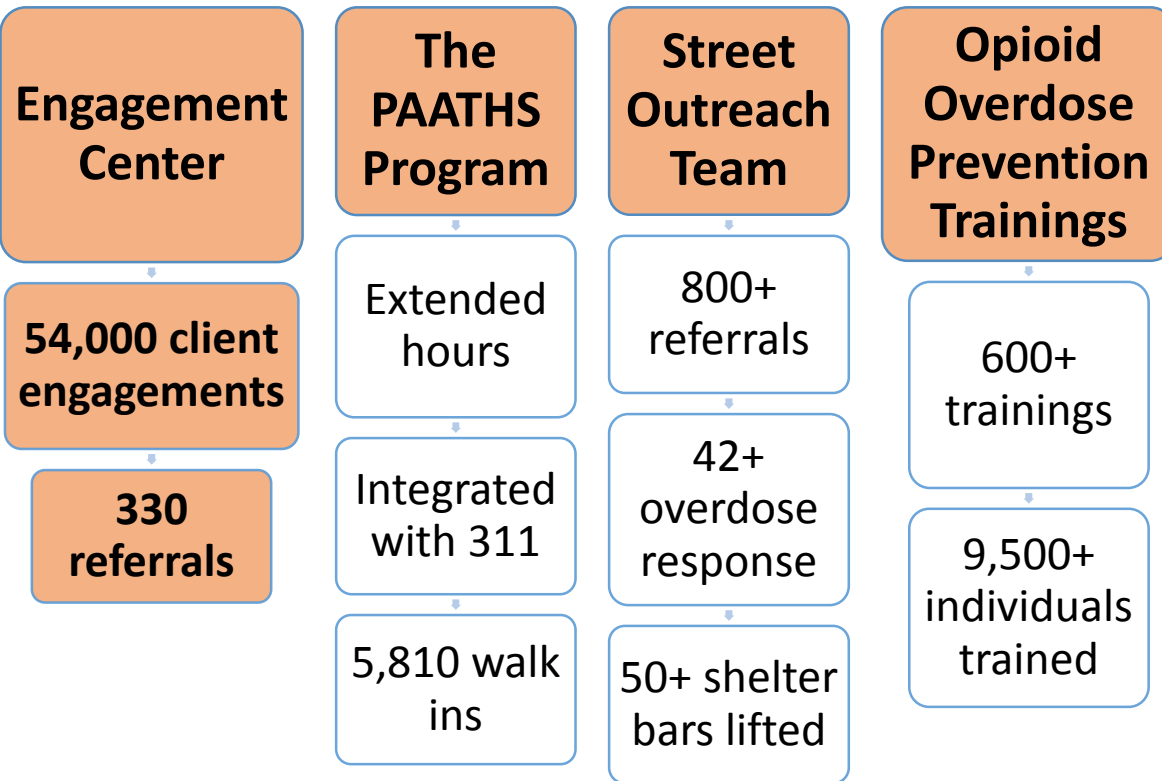
**1,000** people complete applications for health insurance through the Mayor's Health Line

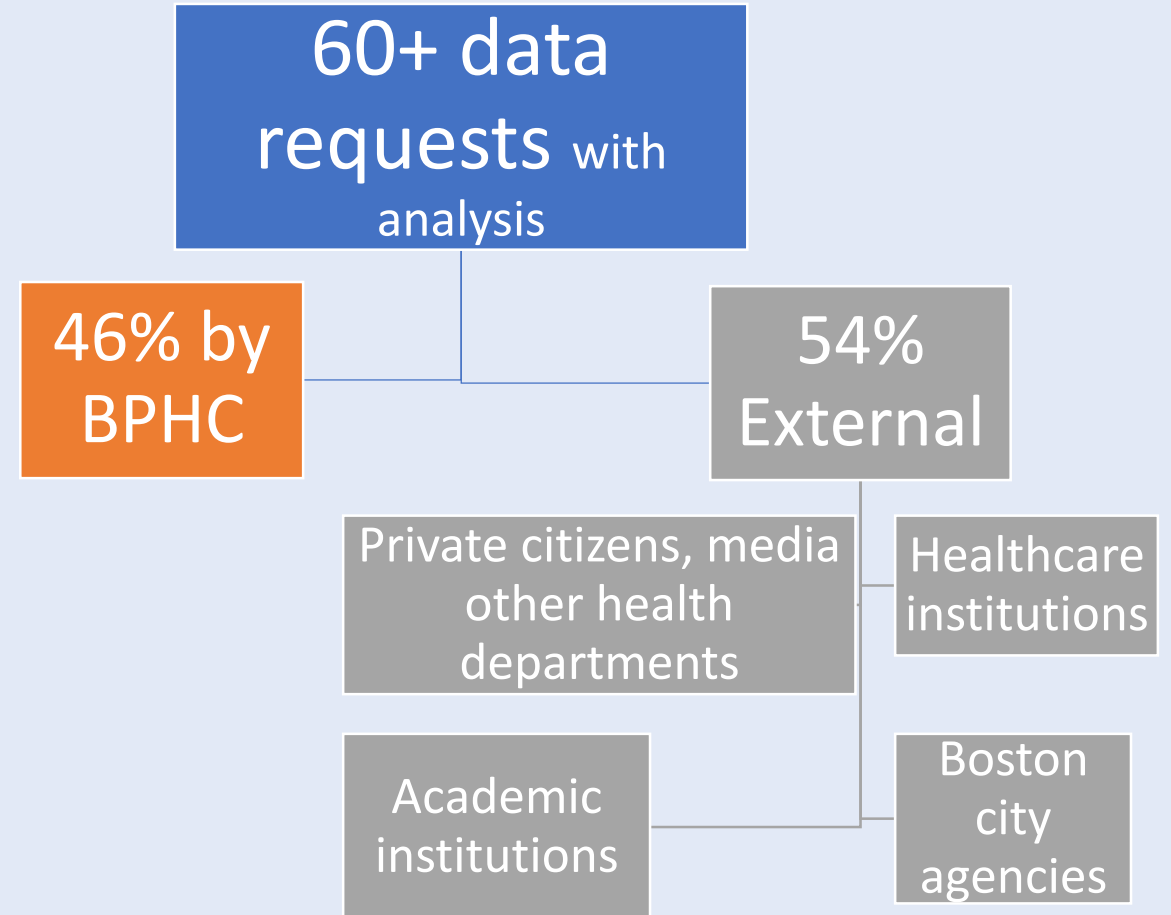

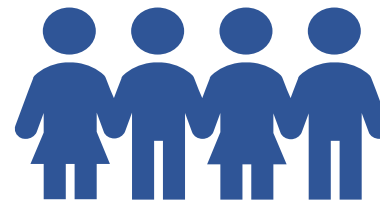

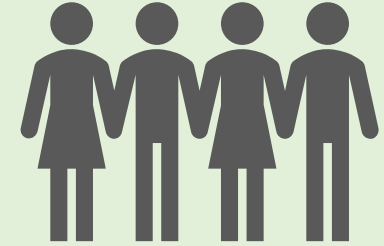
