



SCHEME A - CENTRAL SPORTS COURTS







SCHEME A - CENTRAL SPORTS COURTS



SCALE: 1" = 30'-0"

- COURTS REMAIN IN CENTER OF PARK (SPREAD OUT TO REMOVE SOME FENCES)
- PERIMETER PARK PATH (APPROXIMATELY 1/8 MILE)
- PLAY SPACES REMAIN AT CURRENT LOCATIONS
- PROVIDE ACCESSIBLE RAMP BETWEEN TREES AND PLAY SPACE (REMOVE LINDEN TREES)

SCHEME B - CENTRAL LAWN









SCHEME B - CENTRAL LAWN



SCALE: 1" = 30'-0"

- COURTS MOVE TO SOUTH EDGE OF PARK
- LARGE CENTRAL LAWN (WITH TRIKE TRACK, 450 LF) AND SMALLER SECONDARY LAWN
- EXPAND SCHOOL AGE PLAY AREA + RELOCATE SPLASH PAD
- PROVIDE ACCESSIBLE RAMP ADJACENT SCHOOL BUILDING (REMOVE LINDEN TREES)

SCHEME C - RELOCATE PLAY AREAS







SCHEME C - RELOCATE PLAY AREAS



- COURTS MOVE TO SOUTH EDGE OF PARK
- TWO SMALLER LAWN AREAS
- RELOCATE PLAY AREAS TO WEST EDGE OF PARK (INCREASE PLAY AREA)
- PROVIDE ACCESSIBLE RAMP ADJACENT SCHOOL (KEEP LINDEN TREES AND WALL AT DACIA STREET)






