Avoid Infections, Clean First

- Before injecting, remember to wash your hands with water and soap.
 - If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Make sure to clean the injection site well with alcohol, soap and water, or other disinfectant prior to injection.
 - This step is important to prevent germs on your skin to enter your body.
- Always use clean needles and equipment.
 - If you don't have new works, clean what you have with bleach.







Some injecting drug users have been recently diagnosed with a serious blood infection caused by a germ called Group A Streptococcus (GAS).

GAS can be found in a person's nose and throat. It spreads through contact with droplets from an infected person's cough or sneeze or from contact with sores from a GAS skin infection. Serious, sometimes life-threatening infections may occur when GAS gets into the blood. Avoid getting an infection,

clean the injection site every time before hitting up!
