TIME TO REGISTER YOUR RENTAL UNIT!

All residential rental properties in Boston
must register by June 30, 2022

THREE REASONS TO REGISTER:

- Avoid penalties and fees
- Ensures your unit is safe and code compliant
- Provides a point of contact in case of emergency

THERE ARE TWO EASY WAYS TO REGISTER:

- Register online bit.ly/RentalReg22
- Download and fill out the registration form and mail or deliver in person to the Inspectional Services, Housing Division.

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Rental Registration

If you own a rental property, you must register it with the City each year. Registration can be completed online, by mail or in person. For more information, please visit www.boston.gov/rental-registration

Pre-existing unit -
Convert extra independent unit into rental unit

Elizabeth is hoping to generate an income stream to offset regular housing costs, including mortgage payments.



Carve out unit -
divide first floor into two studio units

Justin wants to create a unit for his parents to live in so they can assist childcare, without sacrificing rental income.



Basement conversion-
convert basement into an accessible unit

Nancy is an older adult who hopes to age in place while supported by rental income



Attic conversion -
convert attic into additional unit

Robert has extra space in the attic of his triple decker and wants to provide an affordable rental unit

ADU 2.0 Homeowner Cohort II

The Housing Innovation Lab in collaboration with the Mayor's Office of Housing, Boston Planning & Development Agency, and the Inspectional Services Department are co-hosting a second cohort of homeowners for our ADU 2.0 pilot program. Homeowners in Dorchester, Jamaica Plain, Mattapan, and Roslindale interested in turning existing exterior structures like carriage houses and accessory buildings into livable space are eligible. The Housing Innovation Lab is looking to partner with individual homeowners to better understand the barriers, gaps, and opportunities of transforming existing exterior structures to an ADU and build the foundation for future citywide ADU efforts.

WHAT BUILDING PERMIT DO I NEED?

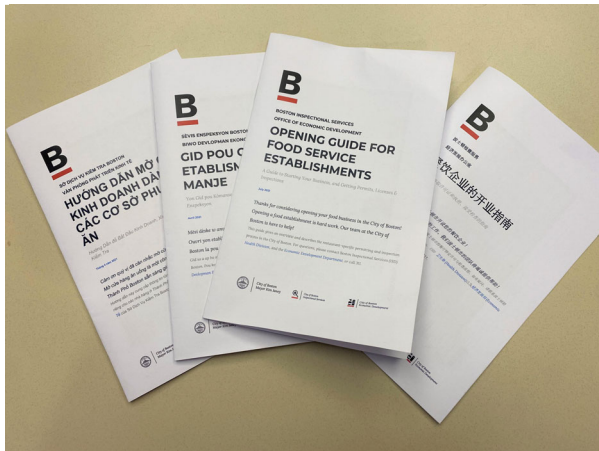
Navigating the permit process has never been easier. Find out what kind of permits you need for your next project in Boston, and how to get them.
