
#### UNDERLYING CHALLENGE




Compacted soils and limited soil volume prevent trees from thriving



Not designed for heavy vehicular use or modern ADA standards and needs additional structural support



Mechanical equipment needs to be replaced and brought to modern standards




Need to update utilities, infrastructure and vehicular service for farmer's market, maintenance and events

# An Original Vision for an "Art Square" at the Nexus of Cultural Institutions


An expanding Victorian Boston imagined a cultural hub to anchor Back Bay.


Four institutions framed and defined the Square.



The fountain's iconic obelisks and twelve spouts shine in the mid-day sun, while the trees and seating in the adjacent grove provide comfortable shade.




The Fountain and Trinity, Seen from Boylston St

The iconic view of the fountain, Trinity Church, and the 200 Clarendon Street building is maintained. The new water cascades add sparkle and interest to the fountain foreground.





### Improvements for Event Setup



### **Stage Set-up**

The new Copley Square is designed to host stages up to 40' x 60', spaced far enough from Trinity Church to prevent damage to the building. Audiences can spread out on the plaza, raised grove, and lawn, and event spill out into Dartmouth St when the road is closed for events such as concerts, rallies, First Night, etc.



### The Farmers' Market

The new plaza at Copley Square is designed to host the farmer's market with several improved features: ample power hook-ups for vendors, a plaza that can be driven on, and a consolidated central space for tents.




### The Raised Grove Protects Tree Roots



### Perennial & Shrub Benefits

- Protect existing trees and support new tree planting
- Create gardens for seasonal enjoyment
- Food & habitat for birds
- Capture & infiltrate rainwater
- Combat urban heat island making the Square more comfortable in summer
- Year-round interest with flowers, evergreens, berries, leaves, and bark
- Frame the Square and buffer the Street
