### **Topic C: Committee Reports and Agency Updates**

#### Executive

- Planning Council came up with some new agreements that was presented at NRAC and SPEC and Executive Committee that will later be presented
- Will start having open conversations on structure for meetings next year

#### **NRAC**

- Had a call in moment for open discussion, went over priority setting activity, had a needs assessment update

#### **SPEC**

- Did member spotlight, had AAM updates

#### **MNC**

- Met past Monday about mentorship mixer that is taking place in April, talked about recruitment for remainder of the year and what kind of materials we may need for recruitment, asked if anyone knows any tabling event or opportunities and to let PCS staff know

#### MassHealth

- The continuous coverage we have head in place since COVID pandemic is about to end, we've been requiring to keep people on MassHealth even if their income changed, only terminated if people died or move out of state.
- MassHealth will send out redetermination on April, so they need current mailing address to send out redetermination packets. Will be in a blue envelope.

- I will respect and empower other participants' identities including consumer status, race, gender, sexuality, class, religion, ethnicity.
- If I am called in on unintentional harmful comments/behavior, I will listen and learn from the experience.

#### **Priority Setting**

- The Priority Setting exercise is one of the most important processes that the Planning Council is required to complete each year. This process of ranking the 28 service categories helps to determine which services are of greatest importance to all PLWH in the Boston EMA so that we can give directives to the recipient and provide a more comprehensive system of care.

#### Why Priority Setting is important:

- It informs the recipient of which categories to allocate and re-allocate funds.
- Eliminates health disparities and strengthens our continuum of care.

PCS introduces a new and optional Priority Setting Tool Excel Sheet that was adapted by New York's EMA, and explains how to use it by going through the scoring criteria.

## Scoring Criteria Categories:

**Existing Funding** 

- Are there any other funding streams that provide the same or an equivalent service to Ryan White Eligible PLWH?

Access to Care and/or Maintenance in Care

- Does the category promote access to OR maintenance in primary medical care?

#### Consumer Priority

- Has the category been specifically identified as a priority by PLWH through needs assessment, e2Boston and/or other available data?

### Specific Gaps/Emerging Needs

- To what extent does the service address a specific service gap or service needed (specific geographic area or demographic/special population?) Does this service address a newly identified or future need?

#### How do we set priorities?

- More data driven rather than anecdotal.
- Utilize this year's data presentations and service categories to understand the needs of PLWH within the Boston EMA and inform decisions.
- There is a resource folder on Basecamp with all necessary resources such as needs assessment data, service category cheat sheet, etc.




FY23 is the current fiscal year, it just began. The priorities that were set last Council year, just went into effect. **Priority Setting** 


We are priority setting for FY24 which begins March 1, 2024.

- 1. Review priority setting criteria and their definitions (we are going to do this now, together)
- 2. For each of the service categories, select the score for each criteria in the drop down box from 1 (least important criteria, no value) to 5 (very important criteria, high value)
- 3. Click the button at the bottom under all of the scores to sort them and see your final ranking! Input this ranking into SurveyMonkey or on your PDF sheet. You may change any ranking as you want to, this is only a tool to help score based on specific criteria.






