Workforce employment	BC High employed 50 Boston residents as members of the faculty and staff, providing salaries in excess of \$4,270,000 and benefits of \$1,000,000. Additionally, BC High also employed 33 Boston residents in substitute, coaching, and co-curricular moderator capacities during FY 22. These jobs provided in excess of \$132,000 of wages. Service Days and Community Action Programs	Between July 2021 and June 2022, the BC High students volunteered over 14,000 hours in the City of Boston through our required student volunteer programs, including our 7th and 8th Grade Service Days, our Junior Community Action program, and the St. Louis Homeless Outreach Program, which provides supplies, snack, and water to the homeless in Boston. If each student were to receive \$14.25 per hour for his work at these agencies, as this is standard minimum wage, this would translate into \$199,500 worth of service to the community of Boston during six months of in-person service. Over the many years that these programs have been in place, BC High students have donated millions of dollars' worth of labor to some of the neediest organizations in Boston. More importantly, BC High students have touched the lives of thousands of Boston residents who live on the margins of our society and have inspired them by their generosity and service. Savings to Boston City Public Schools	Boston College High School has a total of 290 students enrolled who reside in Boston. This results in a direct savings to the City of Boston, as these students are not enrolled in the Boston Public School system. According to the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education Report, the City of Boston's 2017-2021 Total Expenditure per Pupil was calculated at \$26,589 per student.
