This project will...

- Enhance the **safety and comfort** of riders waiting at bus stops or boarding the bus.
- Make it **easier for riders to access bus stops** by rebuilding sidewalks, crosswalks and curb ramps.
- Help buses operate more reliably by giving them more dedicated space and fewer red lights.
- Relocate bus stops away from areas with poor visibility or limited space to make getting on and off the bus safer for passengers and drivers.
- Implement strategies to **prevent people from parking in bus** lanes and stops, allowing buses to pull up directly to the stop.
- Make it easier for bus operators to drive through crowded intersections and make tight turns.
