Field Use

General Consensus

- o Versatility is great for example, lines could be drawn for multiple sports.
- o Amenities are strongly desired (e.g., water fountains and benches).
- o An area should be designated where storage structures can be implemented and used by the different teams.

Multi-Use Field

- o Could be located in the central left region of the park, such that baseball/softball occupies the right region of the park.
- o Could be made from turf.
- Baseball/Softball Fields
 - o The regulation baseball diamond doesn't get as much use.
 - Is one of very few regulation baseball diamonds in the region.
 - o The softball fields get good use.
 - o There is a need for intermediate field capabilities the jump from little league to regulation baseball diamond is significant.
 - o A formal dugout is not needed, but some kind of shaded player area by the fields is desired.

Surface

- o All of the fields experience flooding in some way.
- A combination of grass and safe turf could be a good way to balance the pros and cons
 of each, while also meeting the needs of the different sports.
- o The whole multi-use field should be leveled, since there are current changes in grade that are a bit hazardous.
- Turf could be beneficial in some areas, especially for teams who would like to practice in the rain.
 - Turf, in previous iterations, has been associated with health concerns; the
 impact and fear of those associations/risks is still felt people would want to
 have safe turf (if used) that is tested for PFAS and other hazardous chemicals.
 - Turf can get very hot which is risky given than the area already experiences heat island effect
- o Would be great for general use, especially by seniors.
- o Could have demarcated distances (e.g., every 1/10th of a mile).
- o Could have exercise equipment.
- Concerns with sewer in the middle of the field



Amenities

- o People would appreciate improved benches, shade etc.
- o Clear need for improved lighting.
- o Clear need for more water fountains.
- o Clear need for space for sports equipment storage
- Scoreboards would be a nice addition

Court Use

General Consensus

- o Versatility is needed for example, lines could be drawn for multiple sports, and adjustable nets could also be implemented (e.g., tennis, volleyball, dodgeball).
- Basketball Court
 - o It would be great to have 2 courts for tournaments, youth leagues, etc.
 - o Perhaps place the basketball courts closer to the Mason School so that students can use them during recess.
 - o Needs some kind of fence to prevent balls from going into the street
 - o Games/activities could be drawn on court for times when basketball is not being played, or for when half-court games are being played.
 - E.g., Four Square and Hopscotch.
- Tennis Court
 - o Not much tennis being played currently. Space could be used for multiple sports on the same court.
 - o It would be great to have 2 courts for tournaments, youth leagues, etc.
 - Could the orientation of the tennis courts be flipped to fit more of them?
 - o Tenacity requires at least 2 courts.
- Other Court Sports Mentioned
 - o Soccer
 - o Dodgeball
 - o Volleyball
 - o Field Hockey
 - o Pickleball is not desired
 - o Skate Park elements
 - Street hockey

Playground

• General Consensus

- o One playground is sufficient (rather than two), and, in fact, would be helpful for the Mason School and guardians who take children of varying ages to the park and don't want to split them up.
- o The "Tot Lot" by Massachusetts Avenue could be converted to a Dog Park.



- o A Water Play/Splash area would be very welcome but should probably be separated from the playground with some kind of barrier, so that children use it with their guardians' and/or teachers' permission.
- o Design elements (e.g., color) can be decided in conjunction with Mason School students, surveys for students and youth, etc.
- o Amenities should consider those with accessibility needs (physical, sensory, developmental, emotional, etc).

Mason School

- o The playground is used for recess from 10:30am to 1pm.
 - The School would appreciate having formal signage so that the space is reserved for Mason School recess hours.
 - It can be challenging for Mason School staff to have to ask people to stay off the playground, especially when people provide pushback.
- o Approximately 30-40 students use the playground at any given time.
- O Staff comes out 30 m in. early to check park before students come out
- o Amenities should balance older and younger students' needs e.g., 4th and 5th graders like the racetrack but there are concerns about them colliding with smaller children in the play area.
- Tartt's Daycare used to use the playground.
- No need for grass area within playground fence
- The "Tot Lot" (by Massachusetts Avenue) could be converted to a Dog Park, since it currently isn't being well used (likely because of its current location far away from the school).
- Accessibility
 - o Include equipment and amenities for students with disabilities, sensory differences; make it accessible for children with autism spectrum disorders.
- Play Structures and Design
 - o A bigger play structure would perhaps be better if it can accommodate more children.
 - o Mason School students and other young children should be included to help decide which kinds of structures and colors should be used.
 - o Space is wanted for things like chalk painting, frames, and Math Play.
- Playground could be expanded since there appears to be empty space nearby.

Dog Park

• General Consensus

- o Should be located in the site of the current "Tot Lot".
- o Would be great to have back-up bags for pet waste.

Water Play/Exercise Equipment

• General Consensus

- o Water play of some kind would be great.
 - Mist and cooling features are preferred to intense water fountain features.
- o The water play section should be separated from the playground, so that children are using it with their guardians' or teachers' permission.



- o There are concerns about people using the water play area for personal hygiene rather than cooling off/playing with their children/etc., so there will need to be some planning around encouraging appropriate uses.
 - A suggestion is to have a timer so that it can used during certain hours and certain times of the year.

Site Furnishings and Amenities

General Consensus

- o Amenities are needed such as benches, water fountains, and tables (which could double as play tables for games like chess, mahjong, and dominos, and also used by families for summer lunch pick up).
- o More shade is needed.
- o A dedicated space/enclosure for portable restrooms would be great.
- o A dedicated space/enclosure for sports equipment storage would be great.
- Other Mentioned Amenities
 - o Bathrooms (space for portable restrooms and ability to lock)
 - o Picnic benches
 - o Regular benches
 - Not wood!
 - o Tables
 - That can double as play tables!
 - o Water fountains- more and spread out throughout different activity areas
 - o Fence
 - However, BPRD cannot support a locked fence.
 - Especially near the Basketball Court, since balls go into the street.
 - o Police Call Boxes
 - o Electronic bulletin board for notices, multi-media, etc.
 - o Scoreboard- kids currently bring their own but an official one would be a nice upgrade
 - o Better street crossings
 - Especially around the Mason School
 - Also at Langden and Norfolk
 - o Better traffic lighting
 - Especially around the Mason School
 - More waste/refuse maintenance
 - o More tree maintenance (pruning, etc.)
 - o More security personnel
 - o Space for elevated stage for possible future festivals
 - o Dedicated space for food trucks/vendors (possibly).
 - o Not wanted
 - Needle collection boxes are not wanted, since they may incentivize inappropriate activities in the park.
 - Barbeque stations are not wanted, since they may lead to large groups, lots of noise and commotion and refuse, etc.

Other/Miscellaneous

• A plan for maintenance and safety is of top priority and concern.



- Weekend parties are a big concerns, especially due to trash,
- Preservation of grass, trees, green space, etc. is preferred (including shade).
- Reservations around having weekend parties and BBQ stations especially if groups were to abuse the amenities and the park.
- It would be great to have the amenities needed to host festivals (e.g., space for stage).
- There is no emergency vehicle access off Proctor, only off Shirley
- The community would like to see coffee hours here and the city to program events and activities at Clifford
- Could parking be brought back
- Could concession trucks be brought to Clifford

Example Parks

- Garvey Park
 - Walking Track
 - Street Hockey
 - Amenities for young children and older children
 - o Multiple sports and activities can happen at the same time
- Moakley Park
 - Walking Track
- Hunt Almont Playground
 - O Dedicated enclosure for portable restrooms.
- English School
 - Use of turf

- Connect with Roxbury Prep (possible point of contact via The Base).
- Plan Design Charette/Outreach Sessions with Mason School.
- Design Survey for Students (Young and Middle/High school age).
- Future Event Flyers can go home with Mason School students in the future (advertising Community Event details/dates/etc.).
- Future Event Flyers can go in Victoria Restaurant, Casa Bonita, and Liquor Land.
- Future Event Posters can be posted around the Park.
- Connect to necessary City departments about making reservations to use the park.
- Connect to necessary City departments about vending possibilities.
