



Fields



- Create multi-use field (soccer, football)
- Softball fields are well used
 - Need intermediate or larger size baseball field

Courts



 Prefer two basketball courts & two tennis courts



Add painted games (e.g. four square, hopscotch) for additional activities

Playground



- Want expanded, accessible playground
- Splash pad separated from playground

Field Surface


 Combination of natural and artificial turf is OK if it accommodates multiple sports


 Community enjoys natural grass; however, combination of natural/artificial could work


- Crosswalks/yellow lights

CITY PARKS COMPARISONS



- Malcolm X Park, Roxbury Adjacent to community center, includes mature woodland setting
- Natural multi-use field (soccer, softball) & adult fitness area.
- Multiple contiguous basketball and tennis courts.
- · Large play area over varied terrain with splash pad.

CITY PARKS COMPARISONS



- Garvey Park, Dorchester
- Synthetic multi-use field (baseball, lacrosse) with integrated seating along slopes
- Basketball & street hockey courts & walking loop
- Large play area, splash pad, dog park, rain gardens

CITY PARKS COMPARISONS



- Billings Field, West Roxbury
- Natural multi-use field, softball & baseball fields
- Multiple contiguous basketball & tennis courts at foot of wooded slope
- Play area & walking loop




CONCEPT #1 - COURT OPTIONS

CONCEPT #2



PROS

- Allows for two softballs/little leagues or softball/soccer use simultaneously
- Fields would have to be synthetic turf due to field overlap
- Increase in number of courts
- Increased play area with separate water play
- Walking loop with exercise equipment stations
- New dog park

CONS

- Less flexibility with field surfacing
- Fields overlap





PROS




CONS

- More unprogrammed space




















