DONATING CLOTHING AND TEXTILES IN BOSTON

In November 2022, the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection banned textiles from disposal. Textiles include clothing, footwear, bedding, curtains, fabric, and similar items that are clean and dry. In compliance with this policy, the City of Boston does not accept clothing and textiles in curbside trash.

Nearly 100% of donated clothing and textiles are recyclable. Help close the loop and donate your clothing and textiles!
