








FRANKLIN PARK BEAR DENS EXISTING CONDITIONS



FRANKLIN PARK BEAR DENS SITE OVERVIEW











Reimagine the Bear Dens Design for Flexible Use

As part of the original set of zoological displays from 1912, the Bear Dens served as the anchoring attraction in Long Crouch Woods. Due to increasing expenses, the display was closed in the mid-1950s when the zoo was migrated to its existing location, and the dens were left to deteriorate in the woods. Stabilizing this important park feature presents a prime opportunity for imaginative new uses that respect the historic fabric, while integrating elements of fun and play, with flexibility for gathering and smaller programs to serve the Roxbury side of the park.

BEAR DENS STRATEGIES

Restore the Dens & Integrate New Use

- · Stabilize and restore the character defining features of the Bear Dens, including the metal work and overhang, masonry walls, steps, and benches, the relief sculpture, and the attached buildings.
- · Integrate new program within the framework of the dens with flexible use in mind.
- · Inspired by the historic bear pools, introduce shallow splash pads, designed to allow the space to function both for water play and for flexible events when turned off.
- · Provide temporary furnishings throughout.
- · Extend the woodland canopy cover with new trees.
- Install festive catenary lighting for evening events.




Flexible programming with canopy & lighting. Splash pad & water play in rock outcrops for children at a range of ages.



Park goers use stabilized ruins as flexible space for a variety of programming today, like yoga in the Schoolmaster Hill Shelter. Restoring the Rear Dens would provide a similar space on the east side of the park, which does not exist today.









CAGE 1 SPECIFIC ISSUES AND RECOMMENDATIONS



• Limited access in and out of cage-Recommendation: Remove 1 panel to the left and 2 panels to the right of the missing panel.



CAGE 1 SPECIFIC ISSUES AND RECOMMENDATIONS



Curb deterioration exposed rebar, trip hazard Recommendation: Cut deteriorated curb section and exposed rebar out



Bent cage pickets create a hazard

Recommendation: Repair or replace bent pickets

- Cracking in concrete pavement Recommendation:
 Patch concrete as needed
- Some cracking has organic material build up -Recommendation: Clean out debris and patch concrete as • needed
- **Graffiti** Recommendation: Remove paint covering graffiti and apply anti-graffiti coating



Trip hazard, cracking in concrete pavement Recommendation: Clean out debris and patch concrete as needed



Recommendation: Option 1: Remove sediment and debris and fill pool with gravel Option 2: Install pressure treated deck


- Remnant fence post bases along perimeter, trip hazard - Recommendation: Remove curb and area with concrete to match existing grades
- Abandoned utility vault, outside of cage, fall
 hazard Recommendation: Fill vault with gravel

CAGE 2 OVERALL ISSUES



- Tree cage instability
- Multiple sink holes/failing pavement
- Curb dividing cages, trip hazard
- Failing fence canopy

- Pool, fall hazard
- Remnant fence post bases along perimeter, trip hazard

CAGE 2 SPECIFIC ISSUES AND RECOMMENDATIONS





Tree cage instability Recommendation: Secure structure and close open access panel



Curb dividing cages, trip hazard

Recommendation: Remove curb and area with concrete to match existing grades

- Multiple sink holes/failing pavement -Recommendation: Patch concrete as needed
- Failing fence canopy Recommendation: Remove compromised sections of canopy

Existing utility access, deterioration, trip hazard



Recommendation: Remove structure and patch with concrete

Pool - fall hazard

Concrete pavement void, trip hazard



Recommendation: Patch concrete as needed



Recommendation: Option 1: Remove sediment and debris and fill pool with gravel Option 2: Install pressure treated deck



CAGE 3 OVERALL ISSUES



- Failing fence canopy
- Fence instability
- Deteriorating wall cap
- Leaning retaining wall
- Pool, fall hazard

- Remnant fence post bases along perimeter, trip hazard
- Curb dividing cage, trip hazard
- Graffiti




CAGE 3 SPECIFIC ISSUES AND RECOMMENDATIONS





Exposed catch basin/ drain, fall hazard (rear)

Recommendation: Clean out and fill catch basin with gravel



Fence panel instability

Failing fence canopy - Recommendation: Remove compromised sections of canopy

Deteriorating wall cap - Recommendation: Patch areas of deterioration with concrete to alleviate water intrusion

Pool - fall hazard



Recommendation: Option 1: Remove sediment and debris and fill pool with aravel **Option 2: Install pressure treated deck**



Trip hazard, cracking in concrete pavement Recommendation: Patch concrete as needed

Remnant fence post bases along perimeter, trip hazard - Recommendation: Grind fence post base to be flush with curbing


Graffiti - Recommendation: Remove paint covering graffiti and apply anti-graffiti coating

Curb dividing cage, trip hazard - Recommendation: Remove curb and area with concrete to match existing grades Leaning retaining wall - Recommendation: Monitor lean to determine if condition worsens

CAGE 4 OVERALL ISSUES



- Extensive safety issues
- Only cage with a semi-intact canopy
- Steep grade change
- High number of fall and tripping
 hazards within this cage



CAGE 4 SPECIFIC ISSUES




- Failing fence canopy
- Retaining wall settling
- Fire damage
- Concrete pavement failing in multiple areas



CAGE 4 RECOMMENDATIONS



- Recommendation: Install missing cage fence panel and access panel to prohibit any access to the cage
- Recommendation: Repair deteriorating canopy structure



OVERALL PLAZA AND STAIR ISSUES




- Granite bench pieces have fallen, creating fall hazards - Recommendation: Replace fallen stones
- Multiple empty tree pits, trip hazards -Recommendation: Fill tree pits with asphalt
- Poor condition trees. (Some trees are being removed this month.) Recommendation: Remove hazardous plant material and vegetation that impacts existing walls

- Concrete stairs have voids, sub base eroded -Recommendation: Patch with concrete
- Fence post bases along perimeter, trip hazard -Recommendation: Grind fence post base to be flush with curbing
- Fence growing into tree Monitor for tree future tree decline
- **Graffiti** Recommendation: Remove paint covering graffiti and apply anti-graffiti coating

VEGETATION ISSUES AND RECOMMENDATIONS



- Trees with deferred maintenance
- Areas of invasive plant material
- Vines growing on fence panels and exterior walls (Seaver Street side)
- Tree roots potentially interfering with wall footing




PRE-CONSTRUCTION VEGETATION AND REMOVALS

ADDITIONAL ISSUES AND RECOMMENDATIONS



• Ledge is slippery, creating a potential fall hazard Recommendation: Restrict access
