

What is Safe Routes to School? (SRTS)

"An initiative that works to make it safe, convenient, and fun for children to walk and bicycle to and from schools" (<u>Safe Routes</u> <u>Partnership</u>)

<u>MA SRTS</u> has worked with schools throughout the state for 20+ years on Education, Encouragement, Engagement, Evaluation, Equity and Engineering.

<u>Boston SRTS</u> led by Boston Public Health Commission began 2015 added it's first full-time staff person in Transportation in 2023. Goals include:

- Making active transportation a lifelong habit
- Improving on-time arrival and readiness to learn
- Strengthening the relationship between the schools and the community
- Cultivating community partners who share the vision of creating safe, low-stress, traffic calmed streets around schools
- Reducing pediatric crashes (i.e. pedestrian and bike crashes in 4-17 y.o. residents)


Safety Surge Program (speed humps, safer intersections, safer signals)

School Zone Sign & Crosswalk Refresh (2023)


Standardize School Zones (topic of discussion today)



Safety Surge Program: Speed Hump Zones




Schools in Speed Hump Zones



School Zones - 2012 MassDOT Guidance

- 300' max from school building
- Focus on Elementary Schools
- Only allowed where the school or grounds abuts the street



School Zones - 2022 MassDOT Guidance

- At least 200' in advance of school grounds, a school crossing, or other school related activities, up to ¼ mile
- Should be kept as short as possible while including the section of roadway in the vicinity of the school property that school children will be entering or crossing
- Includes Elementary and Secondary Schools (K-12)

School Zones - 11th (2023) edition of Federal MUTCD

- At least 200 feet in advance of the school grounds or a school crossing;
- The maximum beginning point of a reduced school speed limit zone should not be greater than 500 feet in advance of the school grounds or a school crossing

Proposal for City-wide School Zone Program

- Update city details for school zones
- Expand where we use them
- Implement throughout the city
- Define special use cases:
 - School Zones for Individual Schools
 - School Zones on Arterial Roads
 - School Zones for Clusters of Schools
 - School Zones for a Campus of Schools
 - Schools Zones within a 20 mph Safety
 Surge/Neighborhood Slow Streets Zone
