TENTATIVE TIMELINE

STUDY

2019

The scope of the North End Community Center Study included the following items:

- **EXISTING CONDITIONS ASSESSMENT** of the Nazzaro Center,
- **DEMOGRAPHIC ANALYSIS** of the Nazzaro Center users and the North End community,
- **PROGRAM** for a new or renovated BCYF community center for the North End,
- **SITE SEARCH** for potential sites in the North End that could support the new or renovated community center program,
- **CONCEPT LAYOUT** and **COST ESTIMATE** for a new community center for the preferred site option.
- **COMMUNITY PROCESS** that included an *online and hardcopy survey* as well as 3 community meetings to solicit feedback from the community and to provide updates on the study findings.







TENTATIVE TIMELINE

STUDY

2019

The study included the following findings:

- The shape and size of the existing Nazzaro Community Center site cannot fully support the new community center program either as a renovation or a new facility.
- The study explored a total 6 site options in depth (including the existing Nazzaro site) and determined that each site had a variety of pros and cons, which are listed in the final report. Following an analysis of the pros and cons of each site, as well as feedback on the site search process from the community, the study final report listed the Mirabella Pool site as the preferred site option for the BCYF North End Community Center.





TENTATIVE TIMELINE

OPM SELECTION

January 2024

PFD completed the public procurement phase to obtain an Owner's Project Manager. A Request for Qualifications (RFQ) was developed, reviewed and approved by the City, Statement of Qualifications were received, OPM firms were shortlisted and interviewed culminating in the selection of PMA Consultants, LLC.





Permitting Process

(Potential permits but not limited to the following.)

Epsilon Associates have been contracted through PMA Consultants due to the extensive permitting requirements as a result of the location of the NECC Project.

Epsilon will be assisting the project team to develop, review and submit required pre-construction permits above and beyond typical construction permitting. Epsilon's expertise in permitting will benefit both costs and schedule during the project.

During construction, Epsilon will also be on-hand to secure permit modifications and approvals for field changes if needed.

- Massachusetts Environmental Policy Act Review MEPA is administered by the Massachusetts Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs (EEA). It is the Commonwealth's primary means by which the environmental impacts of large developments are studied and reviewed.
- Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act -The Massachusetts
 Wetlands Protection Act (MGL c.131 § 40) (WPA) and implementing regulations (310
 CMR 10.00 [Wetlands Regulations]) is a state statute administered locally by
 Conservation Commissions. The WPA requires the preparation of a Notice of Intent
 (NOI) for work within a wetland resource area and/or work within the 100-foot buffer
 zone of certain wetland resource areas.
- <u>Chapter 91 Chapter 91 provides for the protection of the public's right of waterway navigation and access to the Massachusetts shoreline. Chapter 91 is implemented through 310 CMR 9.00 et seq. (Waterways Regulations) promulgated and administered by the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection Waterways Regulation Program (MassDEP).
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- Massachusetts Historical Commission Review Projects that
 require state or federal licenses, permits or approvals; or those that utilize state
 or federal financing, are subject to review by the MHC in accordance with State
 Register Review regulations (Chapter 254) and/or Section 106 of the National
 Historic Preservation Act.

ARCHITECT (DESIGNER) SELECTION

April- May 2024

PFD is in the process of procuring an architect and engineering team. A Request for Qualifications (RFQ) was developed, reviewed and approved by the City and after following the public procurement process of advertising and seeking Statement of Qualifications for the project, (10) proposals were received.

PFD and the NECC Team is currently reviewing the RFQ responses for compliance with requirements of the RFQ and will rank and short list the firms found most responsible and responsive to the RFQ. Interviews of the highest ranked firms will be scheduled after review process is completed.
