

Design and construction of a park that:

- Activates the park to promote positive interactions
- Better connects the park with Atherton Plaza
- Improves tree canopy and landscape
- Improves accessibility
- Honors the legacy of Robert G. Lawson



COMMUNITY MEETING #1 AND PARK SURVEY WHAT WE HEARD

KEY POINTS:

- Create separation from traffic
- Keep trees and increase green space, if possible
- Provide places for sitting and gathering as well as event space for markets, performances and celebrations
- Work to improve feelings of comfort and safety
- Connect Robert G. Lawson Park to Atherton Plaza
- Provide appropriate lighting
- Reuse granite blocks, if possible
















ROBERT G. LAWSON (1942-2016)

Born September 9, 1942 in Kinston, NC 10th(!) child to a family of sharecroppers

Moved to Boston in the 1960s, joining his brothers, and working at Boston City Hospital

Completed Barber School, and worked alongside his brothers

Purchased a burned-out building in Egleston Square to open his own barber shop - at Columbus and Weld avenues

Expanded his business to a beauty salon, beauty supply store and sharpening business

A Deacon at New Fellowship Baptist Church near Franklin Park, and then Concord Baptist Church

Passed in Boston on June 21, 2016


Robert G. Lawson Park dedicated on June 22, 2019











Elements highlighting the location of the barber shop, the place of his birth, or other important places in his life







Words used by friends and neighbors to describe Robert Lawson on paving, signs or furnishings












Elements suggestive of Robert Lawson or his profession in signs, pavement, or site furnishings in the park

Elements laying out his story or the timeline of important events in his life














SEATING EXAMPLES



LIGHTING

KEY POINTS:

- Locations will depend on layout of final design, tree cover, etc.
- Goal is to create lighting that is even and an appropriate level of brightness, to maximize safety
- Lighting will be standard Boston light post, with future maintenance handled by Boston Parks and Recreation Department
