Suffolk County is not a functional government, the State received those funds on behalf of the County and then re-allocated them to the municipalities that are a part of Suffolk County on a per-capita basis. Our first payment for the county portion amounted to \$67,264,715.52 and we were notified that this was the first 50% of the allocation and that we should expect to receive the second 50% a year from the first payment date (8/17/2021). We did not receive any type of award letter for this additional allocation. US Treasury Office of Recovery Programs has acknowledged that the allocated amount will be updated to approximately \$558 million
