



## METER MODERNIZATION GOALS

- ► Improve the customer service experience and enhance BTD operations.
- Embrace technology and data analytics, encourage mobile payments, and reduce on-street meter hardware.
- Support the continued implementation of flexible curb management strategies to create smarter, more efficient streets and plan for future street design changes.



# ADAPTING TO "LESS" CHANGE

- Customer preferences have continued to evolve over the last half decade.
- In Fiscal Year (FY) 23, over 92% of City of Boston parking meter revenue came from credit card transactions, either at the point of sale or via the ParkBoston app.
- ► In FY 23 the <u>ParkBoston</u> app accounted for 47% of all parking meter revenue.
- Coin usage at the City's existing multi-space meters now represents less than 5% of revenue.





# METER MODERNIZATION OVERVIEW

### **Project origin**


- Modernize and replace the City's existing inventory of 5,600+ single/dual space meters and 160 multi-space pay stations
- All meters will continue to accept the ParkBoston app as well as quarters (no bills) and Visa, Mastercard, and Discover debit and credit cards.
- The new Tremont Street meters will offer tap and pay, virtual receipts, and be available in English, Spanish, and Simple Chinese.
- All new meters will be pay-by-plate, so customers will no longer need to return to their vehicle to display payment.





### TREMONT STREET

- BTD will install 31 pay-by-plate multi-space parking meters for approximately 234 metered spaces
  - **202** 2-hour metered spaces and
  - **32** 15-minute metered spaces.
- Meter rates
  - \$2.00 per hour for 2-hour metered spaces, available to purchase in 15-minute increments
  - 15-min meters will be \$.50 per 15 min session
- Will also include
  - creation of commercial loading zones,
  - 15-min pickup/drop-off areas,
  - new Resident Permit Parking Only



### **TIMELINE**

#### **JANUARY 2025**

- Virtual Meeting
- ONS Office Hours

#### **FEBRUARY 2025**

- Meters and signage installed
- Temporary parking restrictions to accommodate the installation
- Project schedule is two weeks for full installation (weather dependent)

#### **MARCH 2025**

- Enforcement of new regulations
- BTD will monitor and adjust to ensure regulations are working as intended



### **Story Map Highlights from Current Proposal**

- Loading from 7 a.m. 10 a.m. uniform
- Pilot new 15-minute meters for PU/DO
- Side street corners that were 2-hour parking will become 2-hour metered parking
  - Feedback on making these spaces (57) RPP from 8 p.m. to 10 a.m.
- All metered spaces on Tremont will be unregulated from 8 p.m. to 7 a.m.
- Current valet/HP-DV Parking/and Resident Permit Parking not impacted
