

This year has been a pivotal one for our work, as we rolled out a comprehensive model centered on supporting the three essential levels of youth engagement: (1) spaces and programs for young people, (2) the adults and professionals who work in those spaces, and (3) young people themselves. Our vision is to create a city where every young person has the resources, relationships, and opportunities they need to thrive. This strategic model is our roadmap to achieving that vision, ensuring our initiatives empower not just youth but the ecosystems that nurture them. Below, we outline the key pillars of support.

The Mayor's Youth Summit is a citywide celebration that aims to engage and inspire Boston's young people. The 2024 Mayor's Youth Summit was held by the City for the first time in 20 years and marked 30 years since its inception. It brought over 200 youth and 100 adult attendees from across neighborhoods. The revitalization of this iconic event underlines the City of Boston's commitment to uplifting Boston's young people and celebrating their contributions to our city's culture. The Mayor's Youth Summit featured free food, giveaways, awards, performances, activities, and resources for youth. Activities included an interactive art wall, festival games, a self-care station, a 360 photo booth, and more. Providers offered a variety of resources. including mental health resources, job opportunities, LGBTQ+ support, food access, and more.

In 2024, OYEA launched a redesign of YouthLine, an initiative connecting community members to youthcentered resources. The YouthLine Resource Hub is a virtual platform showcasing resources for youth and young adults across Boston. This tool aims to organize the variety of supportive resources, programs, and opportunities available to youth and families in Boston through City agencies and community based partner organizations. YouthLine aims to connect Boston's young residents to the services and resources available to them to help them thrive. Through this initiative, residents are able to independently navigate vetted resources through the online directory or contact the OYEA office for more individualized support. Additionally, the OYEA office maintains the OYEA Community Events Calendar, a live and up-to-date calendar of free events citywide open to Boston teens.

Youth Lead the Change is a groundbreaking participatory budgeting program in the City of Boston, designed to empower young residents ages 14 to 25 to directly determine the allocation of \$1 million in City funds from the City of Boston's capital budget. YLC has been running since 2014 and has allocated over \$10 million in City of Boston capital funding to projects imagined and voted for by Boston youth. As the first youth-focused participatory budgeting initiative in the United States, this program invites young people to identify community needs, propose innovative solutions, and vote on projects that will positively impact their neighborhoods. Through Youth Lead the Change, Boston is setting a new standard for youth engagement and civic participation, ensuring that the voices of young people are heard and valued in shaping the future of the city.

In Summer 2024, the Office of Youth Engagement and Advancement (OYEA) partnered with Boston Centers for Youth and Families (BCYF), YMCA, and Boys and Girls Clubs of Boston (BGCB) to host free teen nights from 6 - 9PM every Friday, all summer long. Boston After Dark ran from June 21st through August 30th to activate safe and fun nighttime spaces for teens in the summer evenings. Events featured basketball tournaments, barbecues, ice cream socials, movie nights, paint classes, roller skating, pool parties, a flag party, and more. All events showcased the talents of youth DJs from our partners at Youth Options Unlimited (YOU) Boston.
