- 1742 map created by GIS lab. Dark shades of purple represent the enslaved communities which were closer to the water
- 1840 see the wards, Beacon Hill is a concentrated area
- 1890 population is growing and there is a shift to Back Bay and Roxbury
- 1930 shift to the south end
- The Barbadoes Family
 - General Colored Associations
 - Dr. Greenidge begins to discuss about the Barbadoes family from Zoom
 - The family was originally enslaved in Lexington and then moved to Boston
 - Black life looked a certain way because of the abolition of slavery
 - Understanding the long-term economic impacts due to James Barbadoes because he was enslaved in the South though he was a freeman
- Historical Burial Grounds tied to Black History (pie chart)
 - They will be mapping black names
 - There were a number of children who were buried

- Primary Focus: education, police and fire department, Housing and Urban Renewal
- Focus on policies
- The Legal Battle to Desegregate School
 - Roberts v Boston
 - The role of the city in school segregation
- Boston Police and Fire Department- Employee Discrimination
 - 1972, a federal court ruled and affirmed there was discrimination
 - 1990s this ruling was applied
- Long-Term Impact of Housing Discrimination
 - White Boston Households median wealth of 247,500 vs 0 for Black Bostonian Households
- Health Disparities
 - Blacks have been discriminated against based on their treatment as clients
- Procurement Policies and Practices
