Ebony Gill is the creator of Boston Urban Archive, a platform that curates film, newspapers, documents, and photography from Boston, with a focus on BIPOC culture not typically highlighted in mainstream media. Using social media as a tool, she promotes education and history, and creates a sense of nostalgia and community with a large and interactive following. The content, stories, and curated archives have sparked conversations, generated memories, and fostered connections among thousands of people in Boston, and have been widely shared online. Ebony's work has been published in the Boston Globe, recognized by the Boston Celtics with the Heroes Among Us award, and she has collaborated with the Red Sox and other local organizations and leaders. She holds a bachelor's degree in English from the University of Massachusetts - Boston, which she utilizes for her love of journalism, literature, and storytelling.
