In accordance with the Building Emissions Reduction and Disclosure Ordinance Regulations adopted pursuant to the Building Emissions Reduction and Disclosure Ordinance, Boston City Code, Ordinances, Section 7-2.2, the Building Emissions Reduction and Disclosure Review Board will hold a **virtual public meeting at 4:30 pm on April 14**, **2025** to review the following topics regarding the reduction of greenhouse gasses from building energy production and consumption so as to promote the public health and welfare of Boston residents.

Any matter posted as part of a public meeting may be deliberated on at a subsequent meeting.

## **Public Hearing**

1. Building Portfolio Hearing

Application for Building Portfolio and Individual Compliance Schedule from Boston University for one hundred and five (105) buildings in the neighborhoods of Allston, Fenway, and South End. Application was submitted via Pathway 3 and includes assembly, college/university, healthcare, service, lodging, multifamily housing, office, and technology/science building uses. Approval would allow for a portfolio-wide customized emissions reduction timeline based on baseline years for emissions limits compliance. \*Continued from the March 24 Review Board hearing.

**Application for Building Portfolio** from Avalon Bay Communities for six (6) buildings in the neighborhoods of Back Bay, Brighton, and West End. Application was submitted via Pathway 3 and includes multifamily housing and storage building uses. Approval of this portfolio would enable a portfolio-level Blended Emissions Standard for emissions limits compliance.

**Application for Building Portfolio** from PowerOptions on behalf of Pine Street Inn for four (4) buildings in the neighborhoods of Jamaica Plain and South End. Application was submitted via Pathway 3 and includes lodging, healthcare,





multifamily housing, and office building uses. Approval of this portfolio would enable a portfolio-level Blended Emissions Standard for emissions limits compliance.
