Boston's older adult population is growing rapidly and becoming more diverse


2010-2025 - 48% growth in 60+ population (42,000 more older residents)

Age Strong's Core Services and Initiatives:





- ★ Transportation: Age Strong Shuttle and Taxi Coupon program to provide more mobility.
- ★ Benefits Enrollment: Application assistance with Medicare/MassHealth, SNAP, fuel, property tax exemptions, and more.
- ★ Community Engagement: Hundreds of events/programs, senior centers and volunteer opportunities
- ★ Strengthening Aging Service Systems: Grantmaking, Behavioral Health Initiatives, Age and Dementia-Friendly Programs
- ★ Information Access: Print, in-person, social media, email, culturally and linguistically appropriate



- We support diverse organizations through funding opportunities
- ★ In FY25 we awarded:
 - \$1 M to 50+ community organizations through the Expanding Engagement and Behavioral Health grants (operating funds)
 - \$7.4 M to 26 organizations for Older Americans Act priorities (federal and state funds)
- ★ Adding operating fund grants allows for increased access for grassroots and organizations supporting culturally specific groups

- ★ Educated a new cohort of older adults on local policy and advocacy, building new community leaders
