



The Common


No physical gateway but using hanging lights, lighting projection, and colorful paving pattern to indicate a sense of arrival and define space









Green Delta

Combination of the welcome structure and shade structure extending the arrival moment into a linear space that can walk through





- Shade structure with climbers in summer and lighting in winter to provide shade in summer and protect from the wind in winter
- Flexible panels that can move or take out to create a larger performance space during neighborhood event
- Flexible site furniture
- Raised planter and stormwater catchment




