
- Make neighborhood sidewalks and street surfaces smooth

- Address community concerns about speeding
- Plant trees and add green infrastructure in the neighborhood
- Improve pedestrian safety, comfort, and visibility at crosswalks
- Upgrade outdated street lighting fixtures to efficient, long-lasting LEDs







This project will make also upgrade the street lights on Mascot Street to modern LEDs






JONES AVE AND BALLOU AVE
