







How often do you visit Fidelis Way Park?




How do you typically get to Fidelis Way Park?





When do you visit Fidelis Way Park?





What activities do you usually do here?


















What would you most like to see improved with the park redesign?

WHAT HAVE WE LEARNED?

- 1. Fidelis Way Park is **part of people's routines**. Neighborhood residents visit often and use it to move through the neighborhood, play at the playground, and exercise.
- 2. People value the **playground & sport courts** but recognize **room for improvement** in both.
- 3. People **strongly prioritize** improvements to **site furnishing & safety**.
- 4. There is interest in adding a **cooling feature** like a **splash pad** or **shade structure**.













