#### **MINUTES**

- (1) Review tonight's goals (SEE SLIDE)
- (2) Meeting minutes from the last meeting:
  - a. Any corrections?
  - b. Vote to ratify (or postpone to the next meeting if study committee would like more time to review?)
    - Motion to approve from **Julie**
    - Second from **Crystal**
    - Vote unanimous approval except Intiya and Nancy abstained
- (3) Public feedback
  - a. **BLC Staff:** We received a request for more publicity for study committee meetings.
    - Some actions taken since the last meeting:
      - 1. An announcement went out in the Office of Neighborhood Service's Charlestown newsletter.
      - 2. Flyers were put up in the neighborhood.
      - 3. Sent an announcement to our listsery we now have 15 people.
  - b. Study committee feedback: Have you heard any new feedback?

- Nancy: left posters at library, coffee shops
- Crystal: let's put something in the Patriot
- Linda: Charlestown Neighborhood Facebook Group
- (4) Expansion of boundaries of proposed district
  - a. Discuss map
    - Nick (BLC staff) presents suggested alternative boundaries one based on a possible NR district expansion nomination for Breed's Hill, the other based on study of building history (particularly planned development of a certain era) and visual analysis by staff.
      - 1. We were not able to justify crossing over into the Town Hill area based on staff research.
    - Linda: I printed out Atlascope maps. Can we overlay the 1912 map or others?
      - 1. STAFF ACTION: Good idea! Let's do this at Study Committee Meeting #4.
    - **Initya**: Maybe we can map buildings by age to help study the boundary.
    - Elizabeth (BLC staff): Consider future possibilities when thinking about the boundary. Maybe if a building has been altered and lost architectural integrity but it's within the boundary, the district could help guide it to be restored appropriately.
      - 1. **STAFF ACTION:** Print maps for neighborhood walk so people can mark up as we go.
  - b. Planning a neighborhood walk?
    - Yes, the committee wants to do this
    - STAFF ACTION: Gabby will send a Doodle poll to solicit dates.
      - 1. **Intiya:** Can you plan at least two walks to accommodate vacations? Yes.
      - 2. **Nancy:** Best-attended walks for Plan Charlestown were on weekend mornings around 10 am. More than 48-hours notice needed. Also schedule a rain/heat date.
      - 3. **Intiya:** Share a schedule with timestamps for locations along the walk so people can join late.
- (5) Standards & Criteria
  - a. What can the District regulate? What have other districts regulated?
    - **Gabby** presents the slides on jurisdiction, typical exemptions, and areas of purview.
  - b. **COMMITTEE HOMEWORK:** Review Standards and Guidelines for Highland Park, Aberdeen, Beacon Hill
  - c. Question from **Julie Hall:** If we pushed our boundaries up toward the rail fence and the housing project, would that mean there could be no demolition? **BLC Staff:** Yes, district commissions can generally stop demolition.
  - d. **Intiya:** Charlestown is more like South End, Beacon Hill, Bay Village. Highland Park is so large and diverse, it has little in common with what we're doing here.
    - **Linda**: It represents a different approach toward urbanism.
    - **Elizabeth**: Highland Park wanted flexibility but is learning that the standards might sometimes be too flexible.
    - **Kirsten**: Aberdeen is in the middle. Question: If we expand the area, can we have different sections that have different levels of restrictions? **BLC Staff**: Yes you could recommend a Protection Area, for example. Or Fort Point wrote in that certain buildings *could* be demolished. The MS committee could deem certain buildings non-contributing.
      - 1. **Intiva:** From a developer perspective, that would be helpful.
      - 2. **Julie:** Maybe we put a protection area around the core district?
        - a. **BLC Staff:** You can consider it but remember that the jurisdiction of a protection area is very limited and cannot protect

- architectural details, design of new construction, the public realm (sidewalks, street furniture, EV chargers, etc.).
- 3. **Intiya**: Will we start brainstorming about the standards and criteria next meeting? **BLC Staff**: Yes.
  - a. **Linda:** Let's have the walk before we talk about the standards and criteria.
  - b. **Elizabeth:** The walk will be very helpful to think about what to regulate. For example, do you want to regulate private ways?
- 4. **Crystal:** Let's make sure we are incorporating public comment and public engagement, especially with this proposed expansion of the boundary.
- 5. **Julie:** Maybe let's do a committee-focused walk first before a really big public walk. Open to the public but public comments will be held to the end? (**BLC Staff:** Yes.)
- 6. **Intiya**: Conflicts with accessibility requirements how does that work? Can we preserve existing stairways for example?
  - a. Nick: In Beacon Hill we do everything that we can to accommodate people with accessibility issues, but also we make solutions removable to preserve historic integrity as much as possible.

## (6) PUBLIC FEEDBACK: Ask attendees if they have any feedback for the study committee

- a. Johanna Hynes:
  - Audio issues were really bad and it was hard to hear most attendees.
  - Happy to hear that Monument Street might be included. Why not go all the way to Medford Street?
  - Is Revolutionary War the theme of the district?
    - . **Elizabeth:** No, it is about planned development around the Monument.

#### b. Kelli Forbes:

- It is extremely important that people who might be affected are aware of what is going on. You should do a mailing to the property owners within the proposed boundary. Also use the Patriot Bridge.
- If enhancements to the public realm would be supported by taxpayer money, it would be unfair if they were very expensive.

#### c. Erin Woods:

- What if a group wants to cancel the petition or not be included?
  - BLC Staff:
    - a. Before designation, you can write and speak to the Study Committee, the Landmarks Commission, the Mayor, or City Council. Note that a private way can be excluded if they wish.
    - b. After designation, you can petition to rescind a designation.
