# Enabling Legislation: Ch. 772 of the Acts of 1975

"...an investigation and report on the historical and architectural significance of the structure, sites or objects to be designated shall be made."

The report will address:

- Architectural and historical significance
- Economic status
- Boundaries
- Recommended standards

"...the report shall be prepared by a study committee consisting of five members of the commission and six persons who have demonstrated interest in the district ... and who shall be appointed by the mayor and confirmed by the city council, with the assistance of the commission staff or consultants." (p. 1029)

"...within sixty days after the transmittal of a report of a study committee to the commission pertaining to a proposed designation of a landmark district, architectural conservation district or protection area, the commission shall hold a public hearing." (p. 1029)

## The work of the Study Committee will focus on:

- Confirming the district boundaries.
- Reviewing the portions of the study report completed by the preservation consultant.
- Developing the specific standards and criteria for the district with the assistance of BLC staff. These standards and criteria will form the guidelines used for all design review decisions once the district is established.
- Making certain recommendations concerning the terms under which the district should be designated.
- Participating in a constituency building process. This means regularly informing people about the goals and progress of the committee through public meetings and other means of outreach as developed by the committee as a whole along with BLC staff. The public process is designed to increase awareness. It also brings to light and addresses sources of opposition, misunderstanding and conflict.
