II. HEARING MINUTES


Review and ratification of public hearing minutes from September 23, 2025 meeting.

JORDAN MARSH, DOWNTOWN

Survey rating upgrade & Discussion and Vote

PROJECT REPRESENTATIVES: No project representatives presented.

DOCUMENTS PRESENTED: Jennifer Gaugler, BLC Architectural Historian, presented information that was submitted by a constituent along with additional research that she conducted. Documents presented included existing condition photographs, historic photographs, and a comparative analysis of other shopping centers of the same era and other buildings by the same architect. Commissioners were provided with the materials including the research and staff opinion prior to the beginning of the meeting.

DISCUSSION TOPICS: Discussion topics included:

- Age and style of the building (Federal Revival details combined with Modernist/Moderne massing)
- Analysis from Richard Longstreth's book The American Department Store Transformed, 1920-1960
- Correspondence received from architectural historians and preservation consultants providing positive opinions on the building's significance
- Comparison to other shopping centers of the same period which tended to lack historicist details and be sited in the middle of a parking lot
- Comparison to other works by the same firm of the era which tended to be more straightforwardly historicist
- In comparison, Boston's Jordan Marsh store is a distinct experiment of the combination of historical motifs on a streamlined modern form in a tight urban environment

- Which portions of the building are being considered for the survey rating?
- Dates of construction
- Architects for the building are still in operation; how their work is reflected in New England
