III. CHARLESTOWN 250 / BUNKER HILL 250 REVIEW

- a. Chair Amanda Zettel presented on the Bunker Hill 250 commemoration efforts where she shared successes, challenges, and outcomes from the events that



spanned April to June and included about 40 organizations. She also shared a video that promoted the effort and the events.

- a. Genesis Pimentel reviewed the 6 month report. This 6 month report included a draft of interim recommendations for 250th commemorations that the advisory committees had worked on in their meetings. Approval was held off due to feedback to edit the recommendations.

- a. Dusty Rhodes, Jonathan Lane, and Bob Allison gave a presentation on the Knox Trail that is gearing up for 2026. They explained the history of Evacuation Day including the British victory at Fort Ticonderoga and what led up to the Siege of Boston. They discussed the creation of the trail, the stops on the trail, and the activations for commemoration.
