

CONCEPT 1: REFRESH

Simple refinements to what's already there



1. The park's tree-lined main entrance opens onto the Basketball Court.
2. The Basketball Court is re-surfaced and re-painted. Additional hoops are added for full- and half-court play.
3. Play and Basketball Court are connected through a linear seating area.
4. The Lawn remains in its current location, separate from the Play area.
5. Next to the Lawn, gardeners and community groups can connect at a large Gathering Space.
6. The Community Garden is maintained and left untouched.



CONCEPT 2: TRADE

Swap locations of the basketball court and lawn



1. The **Lawn** creates a lush, welcoming green entry at the main park entrance with opportunities to **Gather**.
2. **Play** and **Lawn** are located next to each other. **Lawn** becomes informal play from the **Playground** and **Gathering area**.
3. The **Basketball Court** is relocated to the north, with a dedicated seating area.
4. The **Basketball Courts** are re-surfaced and re-painted. A new mini kids' basketball court borders the **Play** area.
5. The **Community Garden** is maintained and left untouched.



CONCEPT 3: SHUFFLE

Relocate the community garden to unify the park



1. The **Lawn** creates a lush, welcoming green entry at the main park entrance.
2. Centralized seating borders the **Lawn** and the **Basketball Court**.
3. **Play** and **Lawn** are located next to each other. **Lawn** becomes informal play from the **Playground** and **Gathering area**.
4. The **Basketball Court** activates the **Play** and **Lawn**, connecting the three programs altogether.
5. The **Basketball Court** is re-surfaced and re-painted. Additional hoops are added for full- and half-court play.
6. The **Community Garden** moves to the sunny side of the park and improves park connectivity.






A Basketball Court is at the park entrance at the intersection of Penniman Rd and Hano St.



A Gathering Space is at the park entrance at the intersection of Penniman Rd and Hano St.




A Lawn is at the park entrance at the intersection of Penniman Rd and Hano St.






The Playground is next to the Basketball Court, with shaded seating in between.





Are you interested in having a mini basketball hoop for little kids in addition to the standard-height basketball hoops?



