Diane Dwyer is a Boston-based installation artist and experience designer dedicated to creating interpretive, inclusive, and imaginative environments. Her work reflects her passion for reinterpreting history through contemporary lenses, fostering equitable public spaces, and championing representation and inclusivity. Diane's artistic vision is fueled by a deep belief in the power of imagination to connect people and transform environments.

In 2025, Diane founded the Silence Dogood Project, a public art project that uses site-specific large scale projection mapping to activate historic sites with messages of hope and resistance.

The project's goal is to inspire renewed civic engagement and serve as a reminder that we have as much potential to create positive change today as the generations of Americans who came before us.

Diane holds a BFA in Production Design from the Savannah College of Art and Design, with a minor in Themed Entertainment Design, and a Master's in Narrative Environments from University of the Arts London: Central Saint Martins.
