Moses Sibley is an international award-winning filmmaker, director, and entrepreneur from Boston, Massachusetts. He is the founder of MADE BY MOJO, a visual production company specializing in cinematic documentaries, narrative films, and brand storytelling that centers authentic, community-driven stories.

Sibley first gained international recognition when his debut film, Mattapan: The Documentary, won Best Documentary (18-and-Under) at the 2022 Scout Film Festival after competing against more than 3,000 submissions from 109 countries. The film earned widespread acclaim for its powerful portrayal of Boston's Mattapan neighborhood and established him as one of the city's rising young filmmakers.

In 2025, Sibley was recognized as one of Boston Magazine's Creator Class of 2025, highlighting him as one of Boston's leading emerging digital creators.

Passionate about developing the next generation of storytellers, Sibley created the first-ever video production program at the Boys & Girls Clubs of Boston's , building it into a thriving

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initiative that equips young people with professional filmmaking skills and creative opportunities.

As the founder and creative force behind MADE BY MOJO, Sibley has expanded from award-winning short films into large-scale documentaries, commercial campaigns, and branded storytelling. His work is recognized for its cinematic visuals, emotionally driven narratives, and authentic portrayal of culture and community. Through every project, his mission remains the same: to tell stories that inspire, challenge perspectives, and leave a lasting cultural impact.

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
