Application for Building Portfolio from Preservation of Affordable Housing for ten (10) buildings in the neighborhoods of Roxbury, Fenway, West End, Mattapan, and South End. Application was submitted via Pathway 1 and includes multifamily housing, office, retail, education, and food sales & services. Approval of this portfolio would enable a portfolio-level Blended Emissions Standard for emissions limits compliance.

Application for Hardship Compliance Plan from the Cooperatives of CharlesNewtown Housing Inc. for one (1) building in the neighborhood(s) of Charlestown. Application is a Streamlined Short-Term Hardship from 2025-2027. Building use(s) include multifamily housing. Approval of this Hardship Compliance Plan would enable the use of alternative emission standards from 2025-2027.

Application for Hardship Compliance Plan from Eagle Rock Advisors LLC for one (1) building in the neighborhood(s) of Brighton. Application is a Streamlined Short-Term Hardship from 2025-2027. Building use(s) include multifamily housing. Approval of



this Hardship Compliance Plan would enable the use of alternative emission standards from 2025-2027.
