I ALSO WANT TO THANK MAYOR WALSH FOR THE WORK HE HAS DONE AROUND IMMIGRANT FAMILIES AND IN SHOWING THAT WE ARE A SAFE AND WELCOMING CITY TO THOSE WHO ARE UNDOCUMENTED AS WELL AS THOSE WHO ARE DOCUMENTED IN THE CITY OF BOSTON.

IMMIGRANTS MAKE UP ABOUT \$12 BILLION IN OUR STATE ECONOMY AND ARE A CRITICAL PART OF OUR CITY.

WE HAVE 57,000 STUDENTS, OVER THAT, ACTUALLY, IN THE BOSTON

PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

RECENTLY HAD A HEARING, ONE OF THE SCHOOL OFFICIALS WAS SITTING WHERE MY COLLEAGUE COUNCILLOR FLAHERTY IS SITTING, NOTING NEARLY 60% OF THE STUDENTS IN THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS HAVE A PARENT THAT ACTUALLY SPEAKS A LANGUAGE OTHER THAN ENGLISH. WE HAVE AN AMAZING AND ROBUST SCHOOL SYSTEM THAT IS MADE UP OF BEAUTIFUL AND VALUABLE FAMILIES. SO I PUT THIS FORWARD BECAUSE WE NEED TO BRING OUR CITY'S POLICIES IN LINE WITH ATTORNEY GENERAL MOORE HEALY'S RECENT GUIDANCE.

IT IS CRITICAL WE STEP FORWARD AS A COUNSEL AND LET FAMILIES KNOW I.C.E. AND OTHER FEDERAL AGENCIES ARE NOT ALLOWED INTO OUR SCHOOLS UNLESS THEY FOLLOW SPECIFIC PROCEDURES, THAT OUR YOUNG PEOPLE WILL BE SAFE IN THOSE SCHOOLS, AND THIS IS ESSENTIALLY CODIFYING, AGAIN, ATTORNEY GENERAL MOORE HEALY'S RECENT GUIDANCE AND ACTUALLY AN EXTENSION OF THE RESOLUTION WE HAVE ALREADY VOTED ON.

IT IS OUR JOB TO UNDERSTAND AND NOTE THAT I.C.E. HAS ACTUALLY TAKEN ACTION IN MANY OTHER STATES, HAS ACTUALLY TAKEN CUSTODY OF MANY PARENTS, AND WHAT HAPPENS IN THOSE COMMUNITIES IS THAT PEOPLE GO INTO DARKNESS.

THEY REMOVE THEIR CHILDREN FROM THE SCHOOLS, AND THERE IS GENERALLY A RUN IN THOSE NEIGHBORHOODS AND COMMUNITIES WHERE PEOPLE NO LONGER HAVE THE SUPPORT, CHILDREN ARE NO LONGER LEARNING AND FAMILIES ARE LIVING IN FEAR.

THAT IS NOT WHAT WE ARE AND WHO WE ARE IN THE CITY OF BOSTON. SO THAT IS WHY I PUT THIS FORWARD, MADAM PRESIDENT, AND I REMIND US, IN THE WORDS OF A BOSTONIAN WHO WE ALL KNOW AND LOVE, MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. -- DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.,

THAT THE ULTIMATE MEASURE OF A MAN OR WOMAN IS NOT WHERE HE OR SHE STANDS IN MOMENTS OF COMFORT AND CONVENIENCE BUT WHERE HE OR SHE STANDS AT TIMES OF CHALLENGE AND CONTROVERSY.

THAT'S WHERE WE STAND RIGHT NOW. WE STAND WITH A FEDERAL ADMINISTRATION WHO IS TURNING -- ESSENTIALLY TURNING ITS BACK AND NOT EXTENDED T.P.S. FOR OUR HAITIAN BROTHERS AND SISTERS ONLY FOR SIX MONTHS, NOT PHONAL THE FULL 18 MONTHS. WE STAND WITH A FEDERAL

ADMINISTRATION THAT IS INCREASING THE NUMBERS RELATIVE TO I.C.E. APPREHENSION, AND IT IS OUR JOB TO ENSURE THAT THE MOST VULNERABLE AMONG US, THE YOUNG PEOPLE IN THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS ARE SAFE, THAT THEIR FAMILIES FEEL SAFE, AND THAT WE LISTEN TO THE VOICES OF THE YOUNG PEOPLE WHO SAT BEFORE US AT THAT HEARING AND SAID THAT THEY DIDN'T FEEL SAFE, THAT THE TEACHERS WHO LET US KNOW THAT YOUNG PEOPLE WERE BRINGING TOYS INTO SCHOOL BECAUSE THEY DIDN'T THINK THEY WERE GOING TO GO HOME, THAT DOES NOT COMMUNICATE TO ME THAT PEOPLE FEEL SAFE. IT IS OUR JOB AS A CITY COUNCIL TO ENSURE THAT THEY REALLY ARE

I APPRECIATE THE OPPORTUNITY AND I LOOK FORWARD TO MOVING THIS QUICKLY.

SAFE AND THAT WE CAN ACTUALLY GIVE THEM A REAL ANSWER THAT THEY WILL BE SAFE IN THE SCHOOLS AND IN THE DOORS OF THE BOSTON

SO WE ARE MOVING AT THE SPEED OF WHAT'S GOING ON IN OUR COUNTRY RIGHT NOW, IN OUR NEIGHBORHOODS AND COMMUNITIES IN THE CITY OF BOSTON.

I WANT TO THANK COUNCILLOR JACKSON FOR BRINGING THIS FORWARD AND I WANT TO, AS HE MENTIONED, THE EXTENSION OF TPS FOR -- B.P.S. FOR OUR HAITIAN MEMBERS AND JUST SAY TIMES I FEEL THAT, WHETHER IT'S IN MATTERS OF LEGISLATION, ORDINANCES OR RESOLUTIONS WE TAKE UP HERE THAT OFTEN REACH FAR BEYOND BOSTON, WE SOMETIMES, I THINK AMONGST OURSELVES AND FROM SOME OF OUR CONSTITUENTS, FEEL THAT WE'RE NOT HAVING TO IMPACT THAT WE NEED TO HAVE AND I THINK LAST WEEK SHOWS AND THE DECISION FROM THE HOMELAND SECURITY AND THE TRUMP ADMINISTRATION TO EXTEND THAT STATUS THOUGH NOT BY ANY MEANS A PERFECT SOLUTION IS IMPORTANT AND I THINK UNDERSCORES HOW VITAL OUR ADVOCACY CAN BE ON SOME OF THESE ISSUES AND FALSE RIGHT DIRECTLY INTO COUNCILLOR JACKSON'S PROPOSED LEGISLATION HERE.

I THINK IT'S INCREDIBLY IMPORTANT YOUNG PEOPLE IN OUR SCHOOL SYSTEM FEEL SAFE COMING TO SCHOOL, THAT THEIR PARENTS CAN FEEL SAFE PICKING THEM UP. UNDER THE PRIOR PRESIDENTIAL ADMINISTRATION OF PRESIDENT OBAMA, THERE WAS A SENSITIVE LOCATIONS POLICY FOR IMMIGRATIONS, CUSTOMS AND ENFORCEMENT AND THAT ABSENCE INSTANCES OF REAL THREAT TO PUBLIC SAFETY, THEY'D NOT GO INTO SCHOOLS, HOSPITALS, HOUSES OF WORSHIP, ET CETERA. THE TRUMP ADMINISTRATION HAS THROWN THAT POLICY OUT. THEY REALLY ARE NOT RESPECTING ANY SORT OF MODES OF DECENCY OR REASONABLENESS IN THEIR PURSUIT TO ROOT OUT FOLKS THAT THEY THINK SHOULD NOT BE IN OUR COUNTRY AND COMMUNITIES, SO I LOOK FORWARD TO HEARING ON THIS. I ACTUALLY MET WITH A GREAT GROUP OF YOUNG ADVOCATES ON THIS LEGISLATION JUST YESTERDAY WHO

WERE TALKING ABOUT THE IMPACT THEY FEEL IN THEIR COMMUNITIES AMONGST THEIR CLASSMATES, FRIENDS, FAMILIES, PARENTS. I THINK WE NEED TO DO EVERYTHING

WE CAN. IT'S VERY IMPORTANT AS WITH MANY THINGS AROUND IMMIGRATION, A LOT OF THE CONSTITUTIONAL PROTECTIONS THAT WE ENJOY NEED TO -- WE NEED TO MAKE SURE THAT THEY EXTEND TO OTHERS, THAT WHEN IMMIGRATION AND CUSTOMS ENFORCEMENT OR ANY FEDERAL OR POLICE AGENCIES ATTEMPTS TO ENTER A BUILDING, THEY NEED PERMISSION FROM THE OWNER IN THIS CASE THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS DEPARTMENT OR THE CITY OF BOSTON JUST AS IF THEY KNOCKED ON YOUR DOOR ABSENT A SEARCH WARRANT AND THEY OFTEN DO THIS WITHOUT WARRANT. THEY OFTEN SHOW UP AND WILL INTIMIDATE, CONFUSE PEOPLE TO DO THIS, AND IT'S ABSOLUTELY SOMETHING WE CAN'T HAVE IN OUR

SCHOOLS. SO I LOOK FORWARD TO A HEARING. I WOULD LIKE TO HEAR WHAT THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS' CURRENT POLICY IS ON THIS MATTER AND HOW THEY SEE IMPLEMENTING IT. COUNCILLOR JACKSON'S LEGISLATION IS AN IMPORTANT ITEM ABOUT TRAINING, WHICH IS JUST AS IMPORTANT.

I KNOW MEMBERS OF THIS BODY, THE CITY, THEY REGULARLY HAVE KNOW YOUR RIGHTS CLINICS UPSTAIRS. OTHERS LIKE MIRA, THE ACLU AND OTHERS HAVE BEEN RUNNING ALMOST NON-STOP KNOW YOUR RIGHTS CLINICS AND IT'S IMPORTANT CITY EMPLOYEES AND PARTICULARLY IN OUR SCHOOLS WHO HAVE RESPONSIBILITY FOR YOUNG PEOPLE ARE AWARE OF THEIR RIGHTS, YOU KNOW, THE SIMPLE RIGHTS WE ALL HAVE UNDER THE U.S. CONSTITUTION UNDER FEDERAL AND STATE LAW SHOULD BE EXERCISED.

I LOOK FORWARD TO WORKING WITH A

POLICY THAT COMPLIES WITH OUR OBLIGATIONS TO THE PEOPLE IN THE CITY OF BOSTON AND EXTENT OF OUR RIGHTS UNDER FEDERAL AND STATE LAWS, THANK YOU.
