- Register your Boston Public, charter, parochial, or private school with Scripps National Spelling Bee online by October 16, 2017 with www.spellingbee.com/enrollment. This will also serve as your registration for BCYF.
- Pay the enrollment fee of \$151 to Scripps National Spelling Bee.
- Hold a school spelling bee on or before Wednesday, February 28, 2018.
- Submit winner's name and bio form to BCYF by 5:00pm on Wednesday, February 28, 2018.
- Cheer on your school's representative speller at the 11th Annual BCYF Spelling Bee on Saturday, March 17, 2018!





BCYF Spelling Bee FAQS


- What grades are able to participate in the Spelling Bee? 4th-8th graders
- How is the \$151 participation fee used? This fee goes directly to the Scripps National Spelling Bee to sustain the Bee. Fees are used for staff support, printing and mailing costs, and to implement the Scripps National Spelling Bee in Washington, D.C. BCYF does not collect these fees and relies on our sponsorships for the BCYF Spelling Bee.
- Is there a separate registration for Scripps National Spelling Bee and BCYF? No, enrolling your school at www.spellingbee.com/enrollment will register your school

- Can I send more than one student to the BCYF Spelling Bee in March 2018? Each school is only able to send (1) student.
- How will I know what words to use at my school's spelling bee? Scripps National Spelling Bee will mail your school's spelling bee representative a list of words prior to vour school's bee.
