THIS CAME OUT OF THE HEARING WE HELD LAST YEAR THAT MANY OF YOU PARTICIPATED IN ABOUT WAYS WE COULD MAKE IT EASIER FOR RHESUS DIBILITIES OF THE CITY OF BOSTON CAN REGISTER TO VOTE AND MAKE SURE THEY PARTICIPATE ON MUSCLE ELECTIONS AND FEDERAL ELECTIONS AS WELL.

WE CAME UP WITH GOOD IDEAS FROM A LOT OF THE FOLK WE'LL BE HEARING FROM LATER FROM THE ADVOCACY ORGANIZATIONS.

FOR SIMPLE COMMON SENSE STEPS WE CAN TAKE AT MINIMAL COST TO JUST MAKER IT EASIER FOR PEOPLE WHO ARE REGISTERED TO PARTICIPATE WHETHER IT'S AT THE LIBRARY, IN SCHOOLS.

AND THIS IS WHERE THIS CAME ABOUT I WANT TO THANK THE CHAIRMAN FOR SWIFTLY RESCHEDULING THIS HEARING AFTER THE STORM A WEEK AND-A-HALF AGO THAT DELAYED US.

AS WE SEE NATIONALLY AND IN MASSACHUSETTS, PEOPLE ONE TO PARTICIPATE IN OUR ELECTIONS.

LAST WEEKEND WE SAW SO MANY THOUSANDS OF PEOPLE REGISTERING TO VOTED IN THE MATCH FOR OUR LIVES.

THANK YOU FOR ASKING ME TO TESTIFY ON AN PATIENT THAT'S IMPORTANT TO MAYOR WALSH. HE'S A LONG TERM SUPPORTER EXPANDING ACCESS TO VOTE THROUGH A VARIETY OF INITIATIVES. I'M JOINED TODAY BY OUR RED REGISTRAR AND ONE OF OUR UNSUNG HEROES AND TAKE AN OPPORTUNITY TO HIGHLIGHT SOME OF THE STAFF OF THE ELECTION DEPARTMENT. I'VE BEEN THERE SINCE 2015. BEFORE GOING TO THAT DEPARTMENT I DIDN'T HAVE A FULL APPRECIATION FOR THE WORK THEY DO THERE SO I WANT TO JUST GIVE A SHOUT OUT TO THE STAFF OF THE ELECTION DIE.

AND WHEN ALSO TO THE MANY CITY AGENCIES THAT COLLABORATE TO ADMINISTER ELECTIONS.

IT'S UNBELIEVABLE.

ALMOST EVERY CITY DEPARTMENT HAS SOME ROLE IN ONE WAY OR ANOTHER IN HELPING TO DELIVER DEMOCRACY. AND SO OBVIOUSLY VOTER REGISTRATION IS AN IMPORTANT PART COMPONENT OF OUR DEMOCRACY AND WE BELIEVE THAT IT SHOULD NOT BE ANYMORE DIFFICULT THAN NEEDS TO BE.

SO THANK YOU FOR BRINGING THIS HERE, THIS ORDINANCE FORWARD SO WE CAN HAVE THIS PUBLIC CONVERSATION AND CONTINUE TO EXPLORE WAYS THAT WE CAN FURTHER OUR CLABBATIONS AMONGST CITY AGENCIES TO MAKE THIS HAPPEN. I ALSO, I WANT TO POINT OUT A COUPLE THINGS BEFORE I TURN IT OVER TO.

OTHER COLLEAGUES TO TALK SPECIFICALLY ABOUT THE THINGS THEY'RE GOING TO BE DOING THIS RESPONSE TO THIS ORDINANCE. I WANT TO HIGHLIGHT THE PART SHINE THAT WE HAVE AT THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOL DEPARTMENT THAT WE LAUNCHED IN 2017.

TO HAVE STUDENT WHO ARE 16 AND OLDER BE WORKING ON ELECTION DAY.

LAST SEPTEMBER OR THOF WE HAD ABOUT 41 STUDENTS WHO WORKED THE ENTIRE DAY JUST LIKE ANY OTHER COWORKER FROM 6:00 IN THE MORNING UNTIL CLOSING AT NIGHT. AND THEY ALSO WERE TRAINED ON ELECTIONS LAWS.

VERY EYE OPENING PROCESS TO THEM

AND WE'RE HAPPY TO BE WORKING WITH THE SCHOOL DEPARTMENT ON THAT INITIATIVE.

THE STUDENT WHO COMPLETED THE PROGRAM ARE SO HAPPY WITH IT THAT THEY DO NOT WANT TO CONTINUE WORKING WITH US TO SEE HOW THEY CAN HELP REGISTER STUDENTS AND TO BE POLL WORKERS IN THE COMING YEARS.

I WANTED TO SHOUT OUT FOR THAT. ALSO I WANT TO TOUCH ON ONE OF THE COMPONENTS OF THE ORDINANCE AS PROPOSED IS TO HAVE AUTOMATIC VOTER REGISTRATION DONE THROUGH THE PARKING CLERK AND FOLKS GETTING RESIDENT PARKING PERMITS.

I JUST WANT TO POINT OUT THAT THE STATE VOTER REGISTRATION DATABASE THAT WE USE IS PART OF A STATE'S SYSTEM IT'S CENTRALLY MANAGED BY THE STATE.

CURRENTLY THE ONLY AGENCIES ABLE TO INPUT INFORMATION INTO THAT SYSTEM IS RIGHT NOW THE REGISTRY OF MOTOR VEHICLES.

THERE'S A BILL THAT THE STATE
HEALTH IS LOOKING TO EXPAND THAT
AND MAKE THAT PROCESS ALLIC AND
TO ALSO INCLUDE THE MASS HEALTH
DEPARTMENT AND POSSIBLY IN THE
FUTURE OTHER DEPARTMENTS OF
AGENCIES WOULD BE ABLE TO
AUTOMATICALLY REGISTER VOTERS.
WHAT HAPPENS ONCE IT GETS
REGISTERED THROUGH THESE
AUTOMATIC CHALLENGES IT GOES
INTO A COMMUNITY.

IN POSTION WE HAVE OUR OURSE.

IN BOSTON WE HAVE OUR QUEUE AND WE SEE WHAT REGISTRATION WE RECEIVE THROUGH THAT QUEUE AND

THEN WE FINALIZE THE PROCESSING OF THEM AND ADD THEM TO OUR ROLLS.

I JUST WANT TO HIGHLIGHT THAT AS SOMETHING THAT'S NOT CURRENTLY AVAILABLE FOR THE PARKING CLERK TO BE ABLE TO DO BUT THEY DO WORK IN OTHER WAYS AND WE'RE HERE TODAY TO TALK ABOUT THE THINGS THAT WE CAN DO. SO WITH I'LL CLOSE FOR NOW AND TURN IT OVER TO MY COLLEAGUES. >> WHEN YOU SET UP A CENSUS INFORMATION, YOU HAVE TO FILL OUT WHETHER OR NOT YOU'RE REGISTER AND WHAT YOUR PARTY AFFILIATION IS BASICALLY UPDATED BUT YOU GUYS COULD SEND OUT A REGISTRATION FORM WITH THAT PACKET SINCE IT'S ALREADY GOING TO THE HOUSEHOLD. IN THE EVENT THAT SOMEONE IS ALREADY NOT REGISTERED. SO YOU'RE GETTING INFORMATION FROM THE ELECTION DEPARTMENT FROM THE CENSUS TO VERIFY HOW MANY PEOPLE HAVE BEEN IN THE HOUSE, THEY WANT TO KNOW HOW MANY DOGS YOU HAVE, THEY WANT TO KNOW WHEN YOUR FORT AFFILIATION AWE FILL --YOUR PARTY AFFILIATION IS. YOU STILL DON'T HAVE -->> WE DO CURRENTLY ASK THEM TO LET US KNOW IF HE THIS WOULD LIKE A REGISTRATION FORM. WE MAIL IT OUT TO THEM AT NO

WE ALSO ADVISE THEM OF THE

IT COULD BE FRUSTRATING WHEN THE BALLOT DIDN'T COME IN.

DO YOU HAVE ANY PLANS, LONE TERM PLANS TO MAKE IT EASIER FOR VETERANS THAT ARE DEPLOYED TO GIVE THEM AN OPPORTUNITY TO WEIGH IN ON VOTING, ESPECIALLY BEING OVERSEAS WITH TECHNOLOGY ISSUES, THE MAILS, THE PROBLEM. WHAT CAN WE ALSO DO TO MAKE SURE THOSE THAT ARE SERVING ON ACTIVE DUTY HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO VOTE.

>> THANK YOU FOR ASKING THE QUESTION.

IT'S EXTREMELY IMPORTANT TO US AND WE DO EVERYTHING POSSIBLE TO MAKE THAT AS EASY AS POSSIBLE FOR VETERANS AND FOLKS WHO ARE NOT GEE PHOTOGRAPHALLY ABLE TO VOTE HERE -- GEOGRAPHICALLY ABLE TO VOTE HERE.

I WILL SAY IT IS A CHALLENGE SOMETIMES WHEN WE'RE RELYING ON THE POSTAL SERVICE SYSTEM AS WELL.

I CAN TELL YOU THERE HAVE BEEN COMES WHEN WE RECEIVED BALLOTS THAT SHOULD HAVE GONE TO OTHER COMMUNITIES THAT WERE LABELED FOR OTHER COMMUNITIES AND WE HAVE TO ASSIST IN MAKING SURE IT GOES WHERE IT SHOULD HAVE GONE. THE U.S. POSTAL SERVICES, THEY'RE DOING A BETTER JOB WITH THAT.

WE'VE HAD MEETINGS WITH THEM AND TO TRY TO FINE TUNE THEIR

SERVICE AND ENSURING THAT THEIR FOLKS ARE HIGHLIGHTING ABSENTEE PLOTS TO MAKE SURE THEY GET TO US.

IN ADDITION THERE IS ACKNOWLEDGE ACKNOWLEDGE -- THERE IS AN E-MAIL PROCESS WHERE FOLKS CAN SMITH THEIR REGISTRATION THROUGH E-MAIL.

>> WILL THEY BE ABLE TO, IF THEY SUBMITTED TO YOU VIA E-MAIL, CAN THEY ALSO VOTE THROUGH E-MAIL TO YOU?

>> NO.

WE'D NEED, THEY NEED TO SEND THE BALLOT IN.

>> MY OWN EXPERIENCE IS WAITING FOR BALLOT NIGHT.

I THINK I GOT A BALLOT THREE MONTHS AFTER THE ELECTION WAS OVER.

IT'S VERY FRUSTRATING ESPECIALLY IN REMOTE AREAS OF THE WORLD. HOW CAN WE MAKE IT EASIER FOR THOSE THAT ARE ON ACTIVE DUTY IN REMOTE AREAS.

WE HAVE ADVANCED TECHNOLOGY.
CAN WE SEND THEM AN E-MAIL
ATTACHMENT WITH A BALLOT SO THAT
THEY CAN SEND THAT ATTACHMENT
BACK TO YOU.

>> THAT WOULD BE SOMETHING THAT WOULD HAVE TO BE APPROVED AT THE STATE LEVEL.

ANOTHER THING THAT I'VE HEARD CONVERSATIONS ABOUT IS THE FACT THAT DURING STATE ELECTIONS, THAT PRIMARY AND FINAL ELECTIONS ARE PRETTY CLOSE.

OUR PRIMARY IS GOING TO BE SEPTEMBER 4TH THIS YEAR AND OUR FINAL ELECTION WILL BE NOVEMBER 4TH.

SO THERE'S A VERY SHORT WINDOW AFTER THE PRIMARY ELECTION TO GET BALLOTS DEVELOPED AND THEM PRINTED AS WELL.

IN MANY OTHER STATES, THE PRIMARY'S HELD IN THE OR MUCH SOONER THAN IT IS IN MASS. I THINK WE'RE PROBABLY ONE OF FOUR STATES WHO HAVE THIS PARTICULAR CHALLENGE. SO THAT'S THE PART OF IT BUT ALL

THE CHANGES THAT WOULD NEED TO BE MADE IN TERMS OF HAVING A BIGGER WINDOW BETWEEN ELECTIONS, THOSE THINGS WOULD EITHER REQUIRE STATE REGISTRATION ON THE STATE LEVEL OR FOR THE CITY, IT WOULD BE LIKE A CHANGE IN CHARTER AS WELL.

.SO THOSE ARE THINGS BEYOND MY DEPARTMENT BUT WE NEED TO MAKE SURE THOSE USING THE ABSENTEE PROCESS ABLE TO EXERCISE THEIR FRANCHISE.

>> WE COULD CONSIDER DOING SOME RESEARCH ON WHAT OTHER CITIES OR OTHER STATES ARE DOING THAT MAKE IT EASIER FOR THEM TO ASSIST VETERANS DEPLOYED GIVING THEM ACCESS TO VOTING.

WHAT'S WORKING WELL ACROSS THE COUNTRY WITH OTHER CITIES OR OTHER STATES.

LIKE I SAY, ONE OF THE THINGS THAT WE HAVE COME UPON IS THE FACT THAT THAT SHORT WINDOW DOES HAVE A SIGNIFICANT IMPACT BUT WE'RE HAPPY TO LOOK AT ANY OTHER THINGS.

THE EQUITY IN HOW YOU'RE MAKING SURE THAT AREAS IN OUR CITIES THAT HAVE LOW REGISTRATION RATES OR LOWER TURNOUT RATES THAT FAMILIES THERE WILL HAVE ACCESS TO VOTER REGISTRATION.
FOR EXAMPLE, THERE ARE TWO LIBRARIES INFORM ROXBURY THAT ARE CLOSE.

I KNOW PART IS MAKING SURE WE HAVE VOTER REGISTRATION CARDS IN ROXBURY.

THE DUDLEY BRANCH IS CLOSED MISSION HILL BRANCH IS CLOSED. WHAT PLANS ARE IN PLACE TO ENSURE THAT THAT IS GOING TO BE MADE UP SOMEWHERE ELSE? I KNOW THAT THE DEPARTMENT DOES HAVE STAFF THAT WORKS WITH PRINCIPALS TO GET INFORMATION IN THE HANDS OF OUR GRADUATING SENIORS AND THE SUPERINTENDENT ASKED ME THIS PAST WEEK TO DO SOME WORK ON LOOKING AT HOW WE MIGHT BE ABLE TO FURTHER SHARE INFORMATION WITH OUR GRADUATE STUDENTS SO WE'RE LOOKING IN BOTH WAYS BUT WE HAVEN'T TALKED ABOUT AUTOMATIC REGISTRATION. >> HOW MANY OF THE YOUNG PEOPLE HAVE TAKEN ADVANTAGE OF THE EARLY REGISTRATION, THE PREREGISTRATION.

>> IN 2016, WE CAN GET YOU NUMBERS ON THAT BUT EACH YEAR WE GO, WE TRY TO GET INTO MOST OF THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS FROM ABOUT MARCH UNTIL JUNE. AND WE'RE PREREGISTERING STUDENTS AND REGISTERING THOSE WHO ARE 28.

WE ACTUALLY IN ADDITION TO DOING THE CENSUS MAILING TO EACH HOUSEHOLD IN THE CITY, WE ALSO GO DOOR TO DOOR.

TO EVERY NEIGHBORHOOD AND EVERY PART OF THE CITY, AT LEAST TWICE EVERY COMUR.

WE BEGIN ABOUT MID MAY. WHILE WE'RE GOING OUT TO DO THE CENSUS SURVEY, WE'RE ALSO RIDGE STRANGE VOTERS AND WE HAVE REGISTRATION FORMS WITH US WHEN WE'RE KNOCKING ON DOORS. >> THANK YOU I APPRECIATE THAT. I WONDER IN TERMS OF EQUITY, ARE YOU LOOKING AT SPEND MORE TIME OR PUTTING ADDITIONAL RESOURCES INTO NEIGHBORHOODS THAT HAVE HAD LOWER REGISTRATION RATES. SO NOT JUST ABOUT WE GO TO EVERY NEIGHBORHOOD AND THAT'S THE EQUAL THING TO DO BUT HOW DO WE ENSURE THAT THE NEIGHBORHOODS THAT HAVE HAD LESS PARTICIPATION HISTORICALLY ARE GETTING MORE

WE'RE PRETTY WELL STAFFED AT THE POLLS AND AS I MENTIONED WE HAVE AN ADDITIONAL LAYER.

IN ADDITION TO THAT, AT EVERY PRECINCT WE HAVE MACHINES THAT NOT ONLY IS IT ABLE TO HELP VOTERS WHO HAVE DISABILITY, IT ALSO ADDRESSES LANGUAGE NEEDS AT EVERY POLLING PLACE AND IT TRANSLATES INTO I THINK ABOUT A DOZEN DIFFERENT LANGUAGES. AND IT ALSO HAS AN AUDIO COMPONENT AS WELL.

SO TO ME THAT WOULD BE IMPORTANT TO MAKE SURE THEIR VOICES OF OUR YOUNG PEOPLE STUDENTS ARE AT THAT TABLE WHEN THAT DECISION IS BEING MADE.

WE NEED TO MAKE IT AN OPT OUT SYSTEM SO EVERYONE IS JUST REGISTERED TO VOTE AND THEY OF COURSE FOR WHATEVER REASON COULD OPT OUT BEING REGISTERED BUT WE NEED TO MAKE IT EASIER NOT HARDER.

I KNOW WE'VE HAD GOOD REFORMS BUT I WANT THE THIS CITY AND THIS COMMONWEALTH TO LEAD WITH REGARD TO VOTER REGISTRATION AND VOTER PARTICIPATION.

I THINK IN A BUDGET OF, YOU KNOW THE CITY OPERATING BUDGET OF 3.2 OR HOWEVER MANY BILLION DOLLARS SEVERAL HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS EXPENDITURE COULD BE AN INNOVATIVE WAY TO HELP GROW OUR VOTER PARTICIPATION AND ACCESS TO REGISTRATION.

SO IT'S A LITTLE OFF TONIC BUT I THINK IT GETS TO THE HEART WHAT WE WANT TO DISCUSS.

THAT IS SOMETHING I WILL
CERTAINLY BE ADD INDICATING
DURING OUR DELIBERATIONS OF THE
BUDGET BUT YOU KNOW YOU
MENTIONED ABOUT USING THE CITY
CENSUS PERHAPS AS A WAY TO MAIL

PROHIBITIVE AND LESS COSTJUST
MAIL IT -- HOW MANY CITY --

>> WE SEBL IT OUT FIR HOUSEHOLD SO IT'S 400,000.

>> I WOULD THINK, IT WOULD BE DUPLICATIVE CLEARLY TO SEND EVERYONE A VOTER REGISTRATION FORM.

I PRIDE MYSELF ON CONSERVING PAPER NOT WASTING IT BUT I THINK THIS COULD BE AN OPPORTUNITY THAT WE JUST TRY SOMETHING THAT'S INNOVATIVE STRONG AND ROBUST.

SO I JUST THINK IT COULD BE A WAY TO HELP GET TO THE GOAL THAT I KNOW WE ALL SHARE WHICH IS MAKE IT AS EASY AS HUMANLY POSSIBLE TO GET PEOPLE TO VOTE AND THEN WHEN IT'S INCUMBENT UPON US TO MAKE SURE THEY TURN OUT AND VOTE.

SO MY COMMENTS WERE RELATIVE TO HAVING ON-LINE AUTOMATIC REGISTRATION GO INTO THE STATE REGISTRATION.

>> IS THERE ANYTHING ON THE CITY LEVEL THAT WHEN YOU MAYBE ENTER INTO WHATEVER PAGE THAT IT DIRECTS YOU TOWARDS VOTER REGISTRATION.

THEY'RE NOT HERE BECAUSE THEY'RE NOT ON THE LIST, THEY'RE NOT IN THE ORDINANCE BUT THEY ARE ONE OF OUR PARTNERS.

THEY REGISTER STUDENTS AND INVITE US TO EVENTS TO REGISTER STUDENTS.

>> THAT'S A GOOD POINT.

THANK YOU DION AND THANK YOU FOR THE ENTIRE PANEL, MONICA, PRAW CILIA AND STEVE FOR I DON'T REMEMBER TIME AND ATTENTION TO THIS MATTER.

I'LL GO TO THE SECOND PANEL NOW. YOU'RE WELCOME TO STICK AROUND FOR A LITTLE BIT.

SO SHARYL, YOU HAVE THE FLOOR. IF YOU COULD JUST INTRODUCE YOURSELF AND YOUR AWE FILLATION FOR THE RECORD AND GIVE US YOUR THOUGHTS ON THIS PROPOSAL.

>> GOOD AFTERNOON.

THANK YOU FOR THE OPPORTUNITY TO

ADDRESS THIS IMHOAT.

MY NAME IS SHARYL CRAWFORD, I'M
THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF MASS
VOTE AN ORGANIZATION THAT WORKS
TO REGISTER, EDUCATE AND
MOBILIZE VOTERS WITH A FOCUS ON
HISTORICALLY UNDER REPRESENTED
COMMUNITIES IN MASSACHUSETTS
ESPECIALLY THE RISE
MASSACHUSETTS ELECTORATE.
I'M HERE TO TESTIFY IN SUPPORT
OF DOCKET NUMBER 0166, AN
ORDINARY INNOCENCE INCREASING
ACCESS TO VOTER REGISTRATION
ACT.

THAT VOTE BELIEVES ABILITY FOR ALL ELIGIBLE TO PARTS PART IS A FUNDMENTED CIVIL RIGHT AND A PRINCIPLE OF OUR DEMOCRACY. MASS VOTE HAS BEEN FIGHTING FOR A LONG TIME ALONG WITH OUR COALITION PARTNERS AND COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATIONS TO HELP MARGINALIZE OUR VOTING LAWS AND REMOVE BARRIERS THAT PREVENT EVERY VOTER FROM HAVING THEIR VOICE HEARD AND COUNTED. TOOK THEM ALL AWAY.

NOT FAR ENOUGH.

I'VE BEEN WITH ABCD BACK IN THE 60'S.

THE FATHER WAS AN INCORPORATOR. HOW DID WE DO IT?

IN THIS THOUSAND 50, 60 YEARS

SET UP COUNCILORS FOR THE FIRST ELECTIONS WE EVER HAD.

YOU GOT ELECTED TO THE BOARD AND THEN YOU SAT ON THE BIG BOARD WHICH WE STILL HAVE WITH 5 MEMBERS.

GET MULTIPLE PARTICIPATION IN PEOPLE'S LIVES AND HOW THEY CAN ACT AND REACT.

OVER THE YEARS I TAKE EVERY OPPORTUNITY WE DO EVERY ONE OF THOSE YOUTHS THAT COME INTO OUR PROGRAM SAY VOTE, REGISTER, VOTE.

WHY?

YOU DON'T HAVE MUCH ELSE IN THIS COUNTRY THAT'S GOT POWER.

TOO MANY PEOPLE DO NOT VOTE A COUPLE YEARS AGO BECAUSE THEY DIDN'T GET TO REGISTER IN TIME. TOO MANY PEOPLE AT ANY TIME VOTE BECAUSE THEY DIDN'T SEE THE REASON TO VOTE.

MAYBE WHAT'S HAPPENING IN WASHINGTON IS NOT HELPFUL.

I WAS DOWN THERE LAST WEEK.

BUT I COME TODAY WITH MY FRIENDS AS WE ALWAYS HAVE DONE FOR ALL THESE YEARS, TO PUSH PEOPLE TO CAJOLE, TO EDUCATE.

MY FIRST VOTE I WAS 21 JOHN KENNEDY.

MY SECOND VOTE WAS JOHN KENNEDY FOR PRESIDENT.

WHERE I GREW UP EVERYBODY VOTED. IF YOU DON'T VOTE, YOU DON'T GET YOUR -- IT DOESN'T MATTER.

TO YOU IT WAS IMPORTANT TO VOTE NO MATTER WHAT YOUR ECONOMIC CIRCUMSTANCES.

I'VE BEEN DEALING WITH ISSUES REGARDING

POFORTS POVERTY AND RACE AND ALL THOSE THINGS THAT KEEP PEOPLE UNDER THE THUMB OF THIS ECONOMY. I REFLECT BACK TO EARLY '50S. WHEN THE CONGRESS HAD RUN BY WHITE SOUTHERNERS,

SEGREGATIONISTS AND ALL THE COMMITTEE CHAIRS AND WE STARTED TO BUILD UP THE SUBURBS AFTER THE WAR, PEOPLE WENT OUT AND BUILT HOUSING AROUND EVERY CITY CENTER, THE SUBURBS, HOUSING, BUILT THE MIDDLE CLASS.

AND THAT MONEY WAS GIVEN TO THE FEDERAL HOUSING ADMINISTRATION TO GIVE LOANS TO BUILDERS AND TO GIVE LOANS TO HOMEOWNERS.

IN THAT LEGISLATION INSTRUCTIONS TO THE FHA WAS YOU COULD ONLY DO THIS FOR WHITE PEOPLE.

WE LEFT EVERYBODY ELSE BEHIND WHO COULDN'T GET ACCESS TO HOUSING.

SO WE HAVE NOW A SEGREGATED SOCIETY IN PART.

WE'RE TRYING TO BREAK DOWN THE BARRIERS BY TELLING PEOPLE ON BOTH SIDES, I'M FROM BE AN ELECTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE, I'M SORRY, I'M FOR AN ELECTED ANYTHING THAT PEOPLE CAN PARTICIPATE IN THEIR OWN LIVES. SO WHEN IT COMES TO VOTING, WE ARE DOING ONLY VOTING IN ROXBURY, WE HAVE PLACE OPEN FOR VOTING, WAY BACK BEEN YOU DON'T KNOW HER, DORIS USED E-USED TO RUN THE BINGO FOR US, SHE KEPT THE MONEY AND SHE RAN, THE VOTING BECAUSE IT'S IMPORTANT BECAUSE PEOPLE THEN NEVER START A POLL, THERE WAS NO POLLS CLOSE TO THEM.

SO WE'VE MADE A LOT OF ROG. THEY'RE GOING TO TEAR -- A LOT OF PROGRESS.

THEY'RE GOING TO TEAR DOWN ANY REMAINING BARRIERS.

THEY ARE GOING TO ENCOURAGE

YOUNG SISTERS.

ABOUT 300 WE BROUGHT UP TO THE STATE HOUSE AND STOOD UP THERE WITH THE LEGISLATORS.

AND WHAT DID THEY DO FOR THAT TIME?

LEARN CIVICS.

HOW DOES YOUR GOVERNMENT REALLY OPERATE?

WE STOPPED TEACHING THAT IN SCHOOL.

SO I WOULD SAY THAT WE GOT A BIG LIFT AHEAD OF US, WE CAN DO IT. WE HAVE OTO OPEN THE GATES TO SAY, VOTING IS A RIGHT.

IF YOU DON'T THINK OF WHAT YOU CAN DO TO THE DAY OF VOTING YOU CAN STILL GO.

NOT FEEL LIKE YOU'VE BEEN TURNED AWAY LIKE 5,000 PEOPLE WERE A COUPLE OF ELECTIONS AGO.

I DON'T HAVE WHAT THE LAST PANEL HAD BECAUSE THEY HAVE THE PROBLEM OF CARRYING THIS OUT.

BUT YOU KNOW WHAT?

THEY'RE GOOD PEOPLE ON HOW TO DO IT.

THEY KNOW HOW TO DO IT.

AND THE SECRETARY OF STATE FILED SOMETHING WITH THE LEGISLATURE.

I DON'T WANT TO WAIT UNTIL 2024. OR 2026.

I WANT 2020.

I'D LIKE 2018.

2020, TO GET SOMETHING PASSED UP THERE TO ENCOURAGE PEOPLE TO VOTE.

THE ELECTION BACK WHEN NIXON WAS HERE WAS CRITICAL.

I WANT ALL THE KIDS WHO ARE GOING UP TO 18 IN MARCH AND TALL OTHER KIDS I WANT THEM VOTING BECAUSE THAT TELLS THEM THEY HAVE A PIECE OF THE ACTION IN THIS COUNTRY.

WE HAVE THE LARGEST POPULATION OF YOUNG MANY WITH RESIDENTS. AN ESTIMATEOF THE TWO-THIRDS OF TRP CITY'S 165,000 APARTMENT LEASES TURN OVER ON SEPTEMBER 1st.

THOSE NEAR SYMPHONY HALL AND FENWAY AREA I'M KIND OF SHOCKED THAT IT'S THAT LOW.

AMONG THE GENERATION, MY AGE A LITTLE BIT YOUNGER, NOTORIOUSLY LOW.

I KNOW 2008 OFTEN GETS DISCUSSED AS A HIGH MARK, AND THE U.S. CENSUS THAT WAS ONLY 44% OF THOSE 18 TO 24 YEARS OLD REPORTED VOTING IN THAT ELECTION.

ABOUT 53% REPORTED BEING REGISTERED.

AND WHAT'S STRIKING IS IF YOU LOOK AT I IN THAT CONTEXT, ABOUT 83% OF THOSE ACTUALLY REGISTERED DID VOTE.

PROBLEM IS MANY SO FEW WERE ACTUALLY REGISTERED IN THE FISHES PLACE.

NOW THERE ARE LIMITS TO
SELF-REPORTING AS WE ALL KNOW
BUT THAT TREND IS SPECIFIC
AGAINST DEMOGRAPHICS.
THE DISPARITIES AROUND
GENERATIONAL, RACIAL, INCOME,
EDUCATIONAL IN VOTER TURNOUT
HAVE THEIR DISPARITIES IN VOTER
REGISTRATIONS RATES.

AND WHEN THEY ARE NOT REGISTERED TO VOTE THEY ARE IN PART INVISIBLE TO POLITICIANS. DURING THAT CYCLE THEY WON'T BE ASKED FOR THEIR NEEDS THEIR CONCERNS THEIR PROBLEMS THEIR IDEAS AND THAT WEAKENS THE DEMOCRATIC PROCESS ITSELF. WE AS A CITY STATE COUNTRY, CAN TAKE ALL POSSIBLE TO INCREASING ENGAGEMENT TO OUR ELECTIONS.

TO THE POINT OF THE ORDINANCE, WHEN THE CITY'S ALREADY INTERFACING RISK, CITIZENS OF BOSTON WOULD ALREADY GET

INFORMATION ABOUT THE ADDRESS, WE SHOULD BE PROVIDING REGISTRATION AS THE FIRST STEP TO ENGAGEMENT IN THE COMMUNITY. INSOFAR AS WE CAN HAVE THINGS IN AN OPT-OUT PROCESS INSTEAD OF OPT-IN IT CAN MAKE THINGS MORE EFFICIENT.

BECAUSE ANY STUDY WILL SHOW YOU YOU'RE LIKELY TO GET PEOPLE TO DO THINGS IF IT'S OPT-OUT RATHER THAN OPT-IN.

PEOPLE'S FIRST EXPERIENCE WITH VOTING SHAPE THEIR STEWED TO VOTING FOR REST OF THEIR LIVES. I WAS VERY HAPPY IN THE MARCH THIS WEEKEND, REGISTERING YOU NEWSHOUR VOTERS TO VOTE AND IT WILL BE ENCOURAGING TO GET MORE TO VOTE.
