AND WE HAVE SOME STATUTORY
LANGUAGE TO READ AS WELL.
BEFORE I DO THAT, I ALSO WANT TO
GIVE A QUICK HELLO AND THANK YOU
TO OUR SIXTH GRADE LEADERS FROM
THE BOSTON COLLEGIATE CHARTER
HIGH SCHOOL, WOULD YOU PLEASE
GIVE US A WAVE.
WELCOME TO CITY HALL AND SO, SO
MAD YOU ARE LEARNING ALL ABOUT
GOVERNMENT AND GETTING READY TO
SIT IN THESE SEATS NOT TOO FAR
FROM NOW.
OKAY.
SO HERE IS THE STATUTORY
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LANGUAGE TO READ INTO THE RECORD AS REQUIRED PURSUANT TO SECTION FOUR OF CHAPTER 40 O OF MASS GENERAL LAWS.

AT THE PUBLIC HEARING ON A PROPOSED BID, THE PRESIDING OFFICER OR CLERK SHALL READ INTO THE RECORD THE BASIS FOR DETERMINING THE DISTRICT FEE PURSUANT TO SECTION SEVEN AND THE PROCESS BY WHICH ELIGIBLE PROPERTY OWNERS MAY VOTE NOT TO RENEW SUCH BID.

OKAY.

HERE WE GO.

THE DISTRICT FEE STRUCTURE OF THE PROPOSED GREENWAY BID WHICH IS SET FORTH IN SECTION 4 OF THE FREIN WAY BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT IMPROVEMENT PLAN IN ITS ENTIRETY IS INTENDED TO RAISE \$1.5 MILLION EACH YEAR TO SUPPORT THE MAINTENANCE, HORTICULTURE COST AND FUTURE ENHANCEMENTS OF THE GREENWAY. THE PROPOSED BID ASSESSMENT APPLIES TO ALL TAXABLE PROPERTIES IN THE BID VALUED AT \$10 MILLION OR GREATER, EXCEPT FOR ONE TO FOUR FAMILY RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES AND ALL RESIDENTIAL CONDOMINIUM UNITS WITHIN THE PROPOSED BID. TAX-EXEMPT ENTITIES INCLUDING NOT FOR PROFITS ARE EXEMPT FROM BID ASSESSMENTS. THE BID ASSESSMENT IS 37 CENTS PER \$1,000 OF ASSESSED VALUATION UP TO \$200 MILLION, PLUS 11 CENTS PER \$1,000 OF ASSESSED VALUATION OVER \$200 MILLION. IF A PROPERTY CHANGES FROM TAX-EXEMPT TO TAXABLE, OR INCREASES IN VALUATION TO GREATER THAN \$10 MILLION, IT WILL THEN BECOME SUBJECT TO THE BID ASSESSMENT. RESIDENTIAL RENTAL PROPERTIES ARE ASSESSED AT HALF THIS AMOUNT, APPROXIMATELY MIRRORING THE CITY'S DIFFERENTIAL BETWEEN RESIDENTIAL AND BUSINESS TAX RATES THE COMMERCIAL COMPONENTS OF THIS SHALL BE UBT SUBJECT TO

THE BID ASSESSMENT. OUARTERLY ASSESSMENTS WILL BE PART OF THE CITY OF BOSTON PROPERTY TAX BILL TO PROPERTIES LOCATED INSIDE THE GREENWAY DISTRICT, AND COLLECTED BY THE CITY OF BOSTON COLLECTOR TREASURER ON BEHALF OF THE BID. IF THE ASSESSMENT GENERATES MORE REVENUE THAN THE BID HAS COMMITTED TO FUND THE GREENWAY SUBSEQUENT YEARS ASSESSMENT WILL BE REDUCED ACCORDINGLY. THE PROCESS BY WHICH ELIGIBLE PROPERTY OWNERS MAY VOTE NOT TO RENEW THE BID IS AS FOLLOWS. ON OR BEFORE THE FIFTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE ORGANIZATION OF THE BID AND THE FIFTH ANNIVERSARY THEREAFTER OF THE DATE OF THE MOST RECENT RENEWAL OF THE BID, THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE BID OR OF ITS DESIGNATED MANAGEMENT ENTITY SHALL CALL A RENEWAL MEETING OF THE BID MEMBERS TO REVIEW THE PROCEEDING FIVE-YEAR HISTORY OF THE BID.

TO PROPOSE AN UPDATED IMPROVEMENT PLAN, TO SUCCEED THE THEN CURRENT IMPROVEMENT PLAN AND TO CONSIDER WHETHER TO CONTINUE TO BID. THE RENEWAL MEETING SHALL BE HELD AT A LOCATION WITHIN THE DISTRICT. NOTICE OF THE MEETING SHALL BE GIVEN TO PARTICIPATING MEMBERS IN THE MANNER PROVIDED IN THE BYLAWS AT LEAST 30 DAYS PRIOR TO THE MEETING.

THE BID SHALL CONTINUE AFTER EACH RENEWAL MEETING IF A MAJORITY OF PARTICIPATING PROPERTY OWN (BLEEP) ARE NOT MORE THAN 30 DAYS IN ARREARS IN ANY PAYMENT DUE TO THE BID AND ARE PRESENT AT THE RENEWAL MEETING IN PERSON OR BY PROXY VOTE TO RENEW THE BID FOR A TERM OF FIVE YEARS, COMMENCING ON THE FIRST DAY OF THE NEXT FISCAL YEAR OF THE BID.

WE ALSO SEE IT REALLY LITERALLY AND FIGURATIVELY AS THE CAP STONE OF THE CENTRAL ARTERY PROJECT.

THE CENTRAL ARTERY WAS NEVER JUST A TRANSPORTATION PROJECT, IT WAS ALSO ABOUT CITY BUILDING, IT WAS ALSO ABOUT MAKING THE CITY OF BOSTON MORE OPEN IN A LOT OF DIFFERENT WAYS CONNECTING NEIGHBORS AND THE GREEN WAY IS REALLY THE PHYSICAL EMBODIMENT OF THAT BUT BECAUSE OF THE CONNECTION TO THE TUNNEL UNDERNEATH, WE HAVE A REALLY KEEN INTEREST IN MAKING SURE THAT THE PHYSICAL STRUCTURES OF THE GREEN WAY ARE WELL MAINTAINED, IT IS HARD TO BELIEVE THAT THEY ARE GETTING TO BE A DECADE OLD AT THIS POINT, WHICH MEANS THAT THEY ARE

BEGINNING TO COME INTO THE PLACE IN THE CYCLE WHERE THEY ARE GOING TO NEED MORE INTENSIVE CAPITAL CARE AND THAT IS FOR US, I THINK, ONE OF THE KEY REASONS WHY THE BID IS SUCH AN IMPORTANT THING, BECAUSE IT WILL ALLOW THE COMMONWEALTH TO SHIFT THE DOLLARS THAT WE HAVE ALLOCATED TO THE GREENWAY FROM EVERY DAY OPERATING EXPENSES INTO A MORE SUSTAINED CAPITAL PROGRAM, WHICH IS REALLY I THINK OF TIMELY IMPORTANCE FOR US AND WE ARE LOOKING FORWARD TO BEING ABLE TO WORK WITH THE CONSERVANCY AND THE BID AS WELL AS THE CITY .. TO REALLY DEVELOP AND REFINE A CAPITAL PLAN THAT WILL HELP TO BRING THE GREENWAY FORWARD. I THINK JUST ONE LAST THING THAT IS IMPORTANT TO MENTION. WE HAVE A LONGSTANDING COMMITMENT TO THE GREENWAY TO BUILD A MAINTENANCE FACILITY. WE ARE DOING THAT NOW. WE ARE INVESTING OVER \$3 MILLION IN THAT WHOLLY PAID FOR BY MASS DOT, DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTED AND WE HOPE IT WILL BE DONE BY 2020 IN CONSTRUCT, AND CONSTRUCTION BY 2019 AND OPEN BY 2020. SO THOSE ARE THE MAIN THINGS I WANTED TO SAY. I KNOW OTHER FOLKS WILL GO INTO MORE DETAIL ABOUT THE ACTUAL STRUCTURE OF THE BID ITSELF, AND I AM HAPPY TO ANSWER QUESTIONS OR HAND IT OVER TO EMMA. >> WE WILL TAKE EMMA FIRST AND THEN DO QUESTIONS TO BOTH OF YOU.

>> GOOD MORNING CHAIRWOMAN WU AND MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL. MY NAME IS EMMA HANDY AS I MENTIONED CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER OF THE CITY OF BOSTON. ON BEHALF OF MAYOR WALSH I AM HERE TO TESTIFY IN SUPPORT OF THE ACT 2 TO ESTABLISH THE GREENWAY BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT.

MAYOR WALSH AND THE CITY OF

BOSTON IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE COMMONWEALTH, THE GREENWAY CONSERVANCY AND A BETTER CITY ARE IN FULL SUPPORT OF ESTABLISHING THIS TO SUPPORT THE PROGRAMMING -- INSIDE THE FREIN WAY.

AS YOU KNOW, A BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT OR BID IS A DEFINED AREA IN WHICH BUSINESSES AND PROPERTIES ARE REQUIRED TO PAY AN ADDITIONAL ASSESSMENT IN ORDER TO FUND PROJECTS WITHIN THE DISTRICT'S BOUNDARIES. AN ESTABLISHMENT OF A BID IN BOSTON IS GOVERNED BY MASSACHUSETTS GENERAL LAW, AND INCLUDES THE FOLLOWING STEPS. 60 PERCENT OF PROPERTY OWNERS WITHIN THE PROPOSED BID MUST SIGN A PETITION OF SUPPORT, THE ASSESSED VALUE OF THE PROPERTY OWNED BY THE SUPPORTERS MUST BE AT LEAST 51 PERCENT OF THE TOTAL ASSESSED VALUE OF THE BID DISTRICT.

THE CLERK MUST APPROVE THE AUTHENTICITY OF THE PETITION AND THE BOSTON CITY COUNCIL MUST APPROVE.

THE GREENWAY BID BEFORE YOU HAD REACHED 82 PERCENT OF PROPERTY OWNERS ENDORSING THE EFFORT AND THE SUPPORT REPRESENTING 89 PERCENT OF THE TOTAL ASSET VALUE, AN AGREEMENT WELL ABOVE BOTH TO THE LEGAL FOR SUPPORT. THE CLERK ALSO INDICATED THE PETITION HAS MET THE CRITERIA REQUIRED.

THE PURPOSE OF THE PROPOSED BID IS TO SUPPORT THE ONGOING MAINTENANCE AND PROGRAMMING OF THE ROSE KENNEDY GREENWAY AS A VITAL ASSET.

THIS HAS BEEN A PRIORITY OF MAYOR WALSH, INCREASE THE OPERATING BUDGET FOR PARKS BY PHONE POINT OF VIEW \$3 MILLION OR ROUGHLY 30 PERCENT AND THE FY 19 BUDGET INCLUDES \$17.7 MILLION IN NEW CAPITAL FUNDING FOR PARKS PROJECTS.

DURABLE GREENWAY IS FINANCED BY

SUPPORT FROM THE COMMONWEALTH AND FUND-RAISING BY THE GREEN WAY CONSERVANCY BUT HAS NOT HAD A STABLE LONG-TERM ARRANGEMENT.

LAST YEAR, MAYOR WALSH, GOVERNOR BAKER, THE GREEN WAY CONSERVANCY AND A BETTER CITY WORKED CHOSELY TOGETHER TO DEVELOP A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING TO PROVIDE A STRUCTURED FINANCING PLAN FOR THE GREEN WAY OVER THE NEXT FIVE YEARS AND AS MODEL FOR THE FUTURE.

UNDER THE PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP FUNDING ARRANGEMENT, THE CITY OF BOSTON HAS AGREED TO SEEK CITY COUNCIL APPROVAL OF A CITY HEALTH FUND WITH \$5 MILLION FROM THE PROCEEDS OF 115 FEDERAL STREET AND THE INCOME BENEFITING THE ROSE KENNEDY GREENWAY. THIS INVESTMENT IS SUBJECT TO THE SALE OF THAT PROPERTY AND THE APPROVAL OF THIS COUNCIL. ONCE ESTABLISHED ALL INCOME GENERATED FROM THE FUND WHICH IS ANTICIPATED TO BE APPROXIMATELY \$250,000 ANNUALLY WILL BE PROVIDED TO THE TEEN WAY CONSERVANCY TO SUPPORT OPERATIONS, MAINTENANCE. THE CITY WILL HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO RECONSIDER THAT COMMITMENT AT THE END OF THE CONSERVANCY'S CURRENT TEN YEAR LEASE.

WE ARE ALL DOING OUR PART. I PROVIDE MASS DOT FOR THE CAPITAL SUPPORT, THE CONSERVANCY'S COMMITMENT TO INCREASING THEIR OWN SOURCE REVENUE AND OPERATIONAL EFFICIENCIES AND BETTER CITY FOR ENGAGING BUSINESS OWNERS IN THE FORMATION OF THIS BID. THIS WILL ALLOW THE GREENWAY TO FLOURISH AND PROVIDE PROGRAMMING FOR ALL WHO LIVE IN BOSTON. WITH HE EXPECT THE BID TO PRODUCE ROUGHLY \$1.5 MILLION A YEAR TO FUND THESE OPERATIONS, AND IT WILL BE IN PLACE FOR, IN PLACE FOR FIVE YEARS. FOLLOWING THE FIVE-YEAR TERM

OWNERS OF THE DISTRICT CAN VOTE TO RENEW THIS.

THE CITY IS ESPECIALLY PLEASED WITH THIS OPPORTUNITY TO ENGAGE OUR PARTNERS IN THE PRIVATE SECTOR TO HELP IMPROVE A PUBLIC AMENITY FOR YEARS TO COME.
THIS BID WILL ALLOW THE SPACE ALONG THE FREIN WAY TO CONTINUE TO BE THE JEWEL IT IS TODAY.

YOU MENTIONED THE CONSERVANCY MANY TIMES AND HOW THE FUNDING, IT GOES TO WHAT, THEY THEN MEET QUARTERLY, THEY THEN ALLOCATE, IF YOU COULD WALK US THROUGH THE ACTUAL PROCESS.

SO I THINK ACTUALLY SOME OF THE FOLKS WHO WILL BE TESTIFYING LATER ARE PROBABLY BETTER POSITIONED TO DO THAT, BUT IN GENERAL, THE WAY IT WILL WORK, THE CONSERVANCY ITSELF HAS A BOARD, THE BID WILL ALSO HAVE A BOARD, THERE WILL BE A RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE. TWO THAT WILL ALLOW, AND THERE ARE ACTUALLY A SERIES OF DOCUMENTS THAT KIND OF DEFINE HOW THIS WORKS.

BUT WILL ALLOW THE BID TO
TRANSFER MONEY TO THE GREENWAY

SO WE WILL GET TO THAT WHEN WE GET THERE, BUT, YES, I I THIS, I THINK CERTAINLY THOSE ARE THE KIND OF THINGS THE GREEN WAY NEEDS TO THINK AN ABOUT AND THE CONSERVANCY NEEDS TO THINK ABOUT WHEN GOING THE PROGRAMMING. - >> THIS IS GOOD STUFF, WE ACTUALLY GET TO TALK ABOUT TODAY FINALLY, HUH?
- SO EMMA, BASICALLY WE ASSESS THEM, IT IS AN ADDED ASSESSMENT ON THE PROPERTY OWNERS, WE CHECK THAT MONEY AND THEN JUST GIVE IT BACK, SO NO COST TO THE CITY OF BOSTON AT ALL?

MAINTENANCE FACILITY -- THE MAINTENANCE FACILITY GOING TO BUILD A FACILITY SPECIFICALLY FOR THE GREENWAY?

IT IS A LONG COMMITMENT THAT WE HAVE HAD.

THE NUMBER OF NEIGHBORHOODS THAT IT RUNS THROUGH, THE FACT THAT IT IS IN DOWNTOWN BOSTON, SUCH A HUB OF ATTRACTION FROM PEOPLE ALL OVER THE CITY, ALL OVER THE STATE, MANY, MANY VISITORS FROM OUTSIDE.

I THINK WITHIN THAT THERE IS A LOT THAT CAN BE DONE, NEEDS TO BE DONE THROUGH PROGRAMMING, TO ATTRACT DIFFERENT TYPES OF INTERESTS, DIFFERENT TYPES OF PEOPLE, PEOPLE FROM DIFFERENT TYPES OF PLACES BUT UNDERLYING ALL OF THAT THERE ARE PRETTY STRONG RESTRICTIONS IN PLACE THAT LIMIT HOW, HOW THE PARK CAN BE USED, HOURS IT CAN BE CLOSED. NUMBER OF THINGS THAT IT CAN BE USED FOR THAT ARE NOT FULLY OPEN TO THE PUBLIC.

EVOLVES AS WE SEE HOW THE
PRIVATE -- PRIVATE PIECE COMES
IN AND I CAN ASSURE YOU THAT IT
IS SOMETHING THAT IS CERTAINLY
OF GREAT INTEREST TO ME
PERSONALLY AND THE COMMONWEALTH
AS A WHOLE.

>> WHAT WOULD BE THE OPPORTUNITY FOR THE PUBLIC OR ANY OF US? WHO DO WE SPEAK TO SHOULD THERE BE A CONCERN ABOUT ACCESS? >> SO I WOULD THINK THAT THE FIRST -- THE FIRST ONE WOULD BE THE FREIN WAY CONSERVANCY ITSELF.

- I WOULD ECHO THE THREAD OF PUBLIC ACCESS AND EMPHASIZING THE IMPORTANCE OF THAT,

PARTICULARLY BECAUSE SO MANY OF THE TECHNICALLY PUBLIC SPACES IN THAT AREA ALREADY FEEL VERY PRIVATE, WHETHER IT IS THEY ARE DIRECTLY ADJACENT OR BETWEEN LARGE OFFICE BUILDINGS AND THEREFORE THE PUBLIC DOES NOT REALIZE IT IS OPEN TO WALK THROUGH, AND SIGNAGE AND THE CITY'S EFFORTS THERE ARE HELPING, BUT THE INFLUENCE OF THE COMMERCIAL CENTER IS SO FELT THROUGHOUT THE ENTIRE AREA THAT THERE REALLY NEEDS TO BE PROACTIVE ATTENTION ON THIS. SHE IS HERE AS WELL BUT I JUST WANTED TO CLARIFY THAT THERE IS SORT OF A DIFFERENCE IN MISSION AND HOW IN TERMS OF FROM YOUR PERSPECTIVE ARE THERE PARTICULAR MANAGEMENTS, DIRECTIVES OR, YOU KNOW, WAYS OF ARRANGING THE BOARD OR OTHER PROCESSES GIVEN THAT DIFFERENCE AND THE FOCUS ON THIS BEING A PUBLIC PARK OPEN TO EVERYONE?

>> I THINK PROBABLY THE -- I G TOES ME THE MAIN THING THAT IS OF REAL IMPORTANCE IS THE FOOTBALL THAT THE CONSERVANCY BID IS FOCUSED ON AN OPEN SPACE AND OPEN SPACE BOTH LITERAL HE AND FIGURATIVELY.

I THINK THAT THE ISSUES --OBVIOUSLY THERE IS SOME .. OVERLAP OF THE ISSUES BUT THE ISSUES ARE REALLY QUITE DIFFERENT AND I THINK THAT THE -- I THINK THAT NEW BID CAN LEARN FROM THE DOWNTOWN CROSSING BID ABOUT THINGS LIKE BOARD STRUCTURE, HOW YOU RELATE TO THE MEMBERS, HOW YOU CONTINUE TO EVOLVE AND SORT OF RESPOND TO BOTH THE NEEDS OF THE PUBLIC AND TO THE MEMBERS, BUT BEYOND THAT, I SUSPECT GIVEN THE STRICTURES OF THE LAW AND HOW IT WORKS THEY WILL BE SIMILAR IN FORM BUT I THINK QUITE DIFFERENTLY IN HOW THEY ACTUALLY ACT. GREAT.

AND I KNOW THE NEXT PANEL WILL GET INTO MORE DETAIL ON THAT. SO I HAVE THE FUNDING SCHEDULE, THE BID IMPROVEMENT PLAN STATES SPECIFICALLY THAT THE FUNDING CONTRIBUTIONS BY THE STATE AND CITY AS REFLECTED IN THE FUNDING SCHEDULE OF THE MOU ARE MATERIAL PRECONDITIONS FOR THE FUNDING CONTRIBUTION BY THE BID, AND SIMILARLY THE FUNDING

CONTRIBUTION BEINGS AT THIS BID ARE MATERIAL PRECONDITIONS FOR THE CONTRIBUTIONS BY THE STATE AND CITY SO EVER IS SORT OF ALL IN IT TOGETHER.

>> YES.

>> SO CAN YOU JUST SUMMARIZE AGAIN YOU SAID \$4.5 MILLION EXPECTED FROM THE -- BIDDERS AND THE CITY WILL HAVE \$250,000 OVER FIVE YEARS.

>> BASICALLY, WITH THE MANAGEMENT OF A \$5 MILLION POOL OF FUNDS THAT WE WILL BASICALLY TAKE THE INCOME GENERATED OFF THE POOL OF FUNDS AND USE THAT TO CONTRIBUTE \$250,000 A YEAR TO THE MAINTENANCE AND OPERATION OF THE GREENWAY.

>> AND THE MASS DOT PORTION OF THE SCHEDULE IS DIVIDED BETWEEN CASH, ADVANCE AND OFFICE/UTILITIES. THIS IS THE CASH PORTION DEPENDENT ON FUNDING FROM THE LEGISLATURE? OR IS IT SORT OF -- I MEAN, IS IT WITHIN SORT OF YOUR OPERATIONAL --

>> YES, SO WE ARE PRIMARILY THINKING ABOUT IT IN TWO BUCKETS, WE WILL CONTINUE TO PROVIDE OPERATING FUNDING TO THE CONSERVANCY AND IT WILL BE AT A LOWER LEVEL THAN WHAT WE HAVE CONE HISTORICALLY BECAUSE THE BID WILL HELP FILL IN SOME OF THAT SPACE AND IT WILL ALLOW US TO SHIFT MORE INTO OUR CAPITAL SIDE.

>> WHAT HAVE YOU BEEN PROVIDING HISTORICALLY?

>> HISTORICALLY, 2 MILLION A YEAR?

2 MILLION A YEAR.

AND I THINK THAT -- I DON'T THINK, BOTH OF THOSE TYPES OF FUNDING ARE WITHIN OUR CONTROL, AND THEY ARE ACTUALLY ALREADY PROGRAMMED INTO OUR ONGOING SPENDING.

WE HAVE FIVE YEARS WORTH OF CAPITAL FUNDING IN OUR FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL PLAN WHICH IS ALREADY PUBLISHED, AND THE OPERATING BUDGETS ARE ASSUMING IT GOING FORWARD.

>> OKAY. SO THE CAPITAL FUNDING IS 150,000 THIS YEAR AND THEN 350,000 -- OR 350,000 FOR THE NEXT THREE AND THEN 500,000. >> YES.

>> FOR IF TWO AFTER THAT AND THEN ON THE OPERATION SIDE ABOUT A MILLION -- 1.25 MILLION THIS YEAR AND 1 MILLION THEN, 750,000 FOR THE YEARS AFTER THAT. >> RIGHT.

SO THE IDEA IS WE DIDN'T JUST WANT TO CREATE A CLIFF THEY WERE GOING TO FALL OFF OF BUT SORT OF GRADUALLY RAMP DOWN AS THE BID RAMPS UP.

>> OKAY. AND THE GREENWAY WILL BE FUND-RAISING AND CONTRIBUTING

>> YES, THEY ALREADY DO AND THERE, THE EXPECTATION IS THERE WILL BE MORE.

>> OKAY.

GREAT.

COUNCILOR EDWARDS, YOU HAD ANOTHER QUESTION?

>> YES, YESTERDAY WE ACTUALLY HAD A HEARING ABOUT THE SHARING THE DISTRIBUTION BETWEEN MASS DOT AND THE LOCAL POLICE, AND YOU WERE MENTIONING THIS IS STATE LAND, THIS IS IN THE CITY OF BOSTON, IN TERMS OF SECURITY AND HOW THIS WOULD WORK, COULD YOU ELABORATE A LITTLE BIT ON -- ELABORATE A LITTLE BIT ON THAT? >> I WILL ASK JERRY.

JESSE TOTALK MORE.

MY UNDERSTANDING THERE IS A PRIVATE SECURITY FORCE THAT DOES SOME OF IT, AND I BELIEVE IT IS UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE BOSTON POLICE, IF NOT, STATE TROOPERS ARE PATROLLING.

- >> THANK YOU NAAH DAMN CHAIR, THANKS FOR TAKE MEG OUT OF TURN, I APPRECIATE THE TESTIMONY TO, OPPORTUNITY TO TESTIMONY TODAY AND MY TWO COUNCILORS THAT I SHARE THE GREENWAY WITH, IT IS AN HONOR TO WORK WITH THEM ON GETTING, HELPING GET TO TODAY WHERE WE ARE TODAY AND, YOU KNOW, IT TOOK A LONG TIME TO GET TO TODAY. YOU KNOW, THE NEIGHBORHOOD OFFICE THE NORTH END, CHINA TOWN, WEATHER DISTRICT, WHARF DISTRICT, THEY ALL WENT THROUGH THE BIG DIG AND THE ARTERY TUNNEL PROJECT, LIVING DAY IN AND DAY OUT AND THE CARROT HUNG OUT ON THE STICK WAS BEAUTIFUL PARKS AND WORLD CLASS PARKS THAT WERE GOING TO BE BASICALLY OUR BACKYARDS, WHICH WE DIDN'T NECESSARILY HAVE BEFORE WITH THE, WHEN THE ARTERY WAS THERE, AND THE GENE WAY, WHEN IT FIRST -- WHEN WE FIRST STARTED HAVING THE CONSERVANCY

TAKE CONTROL OF THE GREENWAY BACK IN 2008, 2009, THERE WERE SOME GROWING PAINS, IT CERTAINLY WASN'T SOMETHING THAT WAS EASILY ROLLED OUT AND TOOK A LOT OF TIME.

THERE WAS, YOU KNOW, A LOT OF POTENTIAL CRITICISM OF THE CONSERVANCY, A LOT OF CRITICISM OF HOW WE WERE HANDLING GRIT THE STATE'S PERSPECTIVE BUT I THINK WE STAYED THE COURSE AND WE WERE VERY FOCUSED AND WE GOT TO TODAY WHERE THE CONSERVANCY NOW THE IS READY FOR SOMETHING OF A BID NATURE.

I DON'T THINK A BID NATURE IS SOMETHING THAT WAS NECESSARILY IN THE CARDS EARLY ON IN THIS PROCESS.

BUT THE REASON WHY THE BID IS GOING TO BE SO IMPORTANT FOR THE LONG-TERM GROWTH OF THE GREENWAY IS THAT WE DON'T HAVE TO LIVE YEAR TO YEAR ON FUNDING MECHANISMS, RIGHT NOW, CURRENTLY THAT IS WHERE WE ARE, YOU KNOW, IN THE STRUCTURE WHERE WE ARE, WHERE WE ARE BASICALLY LIVING YEAR TO YEAR THROUGH MASS DOT, THROUGH SOME OF THE PRIVATE FUNDING, IT IS VERY CHALLENGING TO HAVE TO, FOR THE CONSERVANCY TO BE ABLE TO PROGRESS AND GO OUT, IT IS VERY CHALLENGING FOR THE NEIGHBORHOODS THAT ABUT THE GREENWAY TO KNOW EXACTLY WHAT IS GOING TO HAPPEN, ANNUALLY WITH THE FUNDING FOR THE GREENWAY AND SO FOR US TO ACTUALLY BE ABLE TO, YOU KNOW, SECURE THE BID, IT IS A VERY IMPORTANT STEP, LONG-TERM TO MAKE SURE THAT WE HAVE THE PROPER -- AND WE HAVE THOSE WORLD CLASS PARKS THAT WE PROMISED THE PEOPLE OF THOSE NEIGHBORHOODS WHILE THEY WERE GOING THROUGH CENTRAL ARTERY TUM PROJECT, THE CONSERVANCY UNDER JESSE'S GUIDANCE HAS DONE GREAT WORK, WE ARE VERY HAPPY WE HAVE BEEN PARTNERING WITH THEM, MASS DOT HAS BEEN CONTINUING TO KEEP THINGS MOVING IN A POSITIVE

DIRECTION AND SO FOR US TO GET HERE TODAY, ALONG WITH THE CITY OF BOSTON IS A GREAT STEP AND I WHOLE HEART THINK SUPPORT THE BID AND I AM HOPING ANY QUESTIONS OR COMMENTS OR ANYTHING NECESSARY, I AM OPEN TO ANY QUESTIONS OR COMMENTS.

MY TESTIMONY RUNS ABOUT TWO MINUTES AND 45 SECONDS.

PLEASE ACCEPT MY TESTIMONY IN OPPOSITION TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A GREEN WAY BUSINESS

IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT.
AS A COMMONWEALTH ABANDONS ITS
RESPONSIBILITY TO MAINTAIN THE
GREENWAY WE ARE NOW CEDING
CONTROL OVER THIS PRICELESS
ASSET TO INTERESTS WITH NO
INCLINATIONS THAT ARE ALIGNED
ARE GREATER OBJECTIVES WITH BEST
PUBLIC SPACES, WITH RESPECT TO
CELEBRATING THE ECONOMIC AND

CULTURAL DIVERSITY OF WATERFRONT VISITORSHIP.
MY CONCERN MOST PARTICULARLY TO EXPRESSED INTENTION OF THE BID

TO THE PROGRAMMING AND DECISION-MAKING PROCESSES CURRENTLY ADMINISTRATED BY THE CONSERVANCY, THE FOUNDATION FOR MY CONCERN IS BASED ON TWO WELL DOCUMENTED TRACK RECORDS.

ONE TRACK RECORD TO CONSIDER IN REGARDS TO THE GROUND BREAKING WORK OF THE CONSERVANCY OVER THE PAST DECADE, THE OTHER TRACK RECORD IS TO CONSIDER THE HISTORY OF WATERFRONT PROPERTY OWNERS WITH MANAGEMENT OF THEIR OWN PRIVATELY OWN PUBLIC SPACES CROSSES BOSTON'S WATERFRONT. THE FREIN WAY CONSERVANCY'S

DECADE LONG HISTORY HAS SERVED TO PIVOT BOSTON ON A PUBLIC STAGE. THE CON SEARCH VAN SITUATE MANAGED GREENWAY PARKS TO HAVE RELIABLE PUBLIC ACCESS, HIGH QUALITY PROGRAMMING AND HIGH STANDARDS FOR CREATION OF PUBLIC ART.

I WANTED TO CONGRATULATE RICK DO MINNOW AND JESSE BLACKBERRY, THE PROPERTY OWNERS WHO WORKED IN ESTABLISHING AND CREATING THIS BID.

I KNOW THEY WORKED VERY HARD FOR THE LAST YEAR AND A HALF MAKING SURE THAT PEOPLE UNDERSTOOD WHAT THE BID WOULD BE ALL ABOUT. >> IN LISTENING TO SOME OF THE QUESTIONS THAT YOU HAVE ASKED AND WHAT THE DIFFERENCE IS BETWEEN ONE BID AND ANOTHER I AM HAPPY TO ANSWER ANY OF THOSE OUESTIONS, BECAUSE IT IS REALLY FIRST OF ALL, I THINK THAT IN CREATING THIS BID, IT WILL PROVIDE AN OPPORTUNITY FOR JESSE BRAC BERRY AND THE REST OF THE STAFF NOT TO HAVE TO WORRY .. UNIFORMED AMBASSADORS ON THE STREET, AND WHEN THEY COME TO

BOSTON, THEY DON'T JUST CONCENTRATE ON THIS 34 BLOCK AREA THAT WE PROVIDE SERVICES

SO WHEN WE TALK ABOUT ACCESS AND INCLUSION, BECAUSE THE DOWNTOWN BOSTON BID IS THE HUB OF THE TRANSIT SYSTEM .. THAT HAS SUBWAY LINES AND TRANSIT LINES COMING IN FROM ALL OF THE NEIGHBORHOODS ACROSS THE CITY, AND THE GREENWAY IS REALLY ONE BLOCK FROM THAT OR THREE BLOCKS FROM THAT TRANSIT SYSTEM, IT

WOULD BE HIGHLY UNLIKELY THE PEOPLE FROM ACROSS THE CITY WOULD NOT BE ABLE TO ENJOY THIS WONDERFUL SPACE.

AND I CAN UNDERSTAND THE
QUESTION ABOUT ACCESS, AND WITH
PROGRAMMING AND MAKING SURE THAT
DANCE TROOPS AND ARTISTS AND
MUSICIANS FROM ACROSS THE CITY
ARE PARTICIPATING WHEN THERE IS
PROGRAMMING BEING PROVIDED.
THAT OBVIOUSLY WE CAN ALL DO
MORE OF, WE DO A LOT OF IT IN
THE DOWNTOWN BOSTON BID AREA.
AND THAT IS ONE OF THE WAYS I
THINK THAT BOTH BIDS CAN WORK
TOGETHER.

WE HAVE A LOT OF PEOPLE THAT ARE ASKING TO PERFORM IN THE DOWNTOWN CROSSING AREA AND I THINK THAT WITH THIS NEW BID BEING CREATED THAT THERE WILL PROBABLY BE MORE COMMUNICATION BETWEEN WHAT THE DOWNTOWN BOSTON BID IS DOING AND WHAT THE GREENWAY PROVIDES AS WELL. SO I THINK THAT LOOKING AT THIS BID BEING CREATED, WILL ALLOW THE GREENWAY CONSERVANCY STAFF NOT WORRY ABOUT A FUNDING SOURCE EVERY YEAR AS THEY HAVE IN THE PAST.

IT WILL BE A RELIABLE STREAM OF MONEY.

THAT IS WHAT MAKES BIDS SO WONDERFUL, AND AS YOU KNOW, BIDS HAVE BEEN IN EXISTENCE SINCE THE SEVENTIES.

WE HAVE OVER 1,000 BIDS IN THIS COUNTRY, NEW YORK CITY HAS OVER 70, LOS ANGELES HAS OVER 45. THE OLDEST IN MASSACHUSETTS IS IN SPRINGFIELD AND THE MOST RECENTLY CREATED WAS IN HUDSON MASS, JUST A FEW MONTHS AGO. PEOPLE ARE TALKING ABOUT BIDS AROUND US, KENDALL SQUARE, CENTRAL SQUARE, WORCESTER IS IN THE PROCESS OF CREATING A BID. IT ALLOWS PROPERTY OWNERS AND OTHERS TO ENGAGE THIS THE PROCESS -- IN THE PROCESS. OUR BID HAS 33 MEMBERS ON OUR BOARD.

THEY REPRESENT NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS, RESIDENTS, SMALL BUSINESSES, AND PROPERTY OWNERS. WE WANT TO MAKE SURE THAT EVERYBODY IS ENGAGED IN THE PROCESS WHEN WE ARE MAKING DECISIONS AND WHEN WE ARE SPENDING MONEY THAT PROPERTY OWNERS HAVE PROVIDED US. SO EVERYBODY NEEDS TO BE ENGAGED IN THE PROCESS. ESPECIALLY THE CITY OF BOSTON. THIS CANNOT BE SUCCESSFUL UNLESS THERE IS A CLOSE COLLABORATIVE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE BID ORGANIZATION AND THE CITY PROVIDING BASIC CITY SERVICES. IS IN OUR BID, WE WOULD NOT BE SUCCESSFUL IF WE DID NOT HAVE A CLOSE WORKING RELATIONSHIP WITH OUR AREA A 1 CAPTAIN, CAPTAIN FAWN AND HIS TEAM, DPW, BTD, THE FIRE DEPARTMENT, INSPECTIONAL SERVICES, EMS, ALL OF THESE FOLKS PROVIDE AN OPPORTUNITY FOR US TO MAKE SURE THAT THE PEOPLE WHO ARE PAYING THE ASSESSMENTS HAVE THE KIND OF SERVICES THAT THEY NEED WHENEVER SOMETHING EXTREME HAS TAKEN PLACE. DATA COLLECTION IS EXTREMELY IMPORTANT TO US. WE COLLECT INFORMATION ON A DAILY BASIS ABOUT HOW MANY 911 CALLS ARE MADE. WE TRACK EVERYTHING. SO THAT, AGAIN, WHEN THE PROPERTY OWNERS WHO ARE PAYING THE ASSESSMENTS WANT TO KNOW THE VALUE OF WHAT A BID PROVIDES, WE HAVE CURRENT INFORMATION FOR THEM AT ALL TIMES. WE HAVE WORKED CLOSELY WITH THE BOSTON POLICE DEPARTMENT INSTALLING OVER 45 CAMERAS THROUGHOUT THE DISTRICT, THAT HAS PROVIDED A VERY, VERY INVALUABLE SOURCE OF INFORMATION FOR THEM AFTER CRIME HAS BEEN COMMITTED. AS I SAID, IT IS THE CLOSE COLLABORATION, WORKING WITH THE TREASURER AND ASSESSOR'S OFFICE,

THEY ARE THE ONES COLLECTING THE

ASSESSMENT. WE HAVE A CLOSE WORKING RELATIONSHIP WITH ALL OF THE DEPARTMENTS BECAUSE THAT IS WHAT PEOPLE ARE EXPECTING OF US. AND I THINK THAT SOME OF THE QUESTIONS ABOUT HOW WILL IT WORK, ARE PROBABLY UNKNOWN TO THE GREENWAY FOLKS AT THE MOMENT, IN TERMS OF WHAT THIS ADDED RESPONSIBILITY WILL BE, BECAUSE IT IS A RELATIONSHIP WITH PROPERTY OWNERS THAT MAYBE THEY HAVEN'T HAD IN THE PAST, EXACTLY THE WAY IT WILL BE AS THE 60 PROPERTY OWNERS ARE PAYING AN ASSESSMENT QUARTERLY NOW AND THEY WILL BE EXPECTING SOMETHING IN RETURN. I SEE IT AS THE FUTURE OF CREATING A FUTURE BRYANT PARK FOR BOSTON.

BRYANT PARK IS KNOWN AROUND THE WORLD .. SO I ENCOURAGE YOU ALL TO SUPPORT THIS WONDERFUL NEW ADDITION TO BOSTON, THE GREENWAY BID, AND ALLOW THE 0 CON SEARCH VAN SITUATE TO CONTINUE THE WONDERFUL WORK THAT IT HAS BEEN DOING.

- THE RESEARCH WAS INVOLVED WITH THREE SEPARATE EFFORTS TO TRY TO CREATE THE DOWNTOWN BID.
- THE THIRD BEING THE SUCCESSFUL ONE.
- AND OUR OFFICE IS -- WE ARE IN THE -- SAGE BUILDING SO RIGHT IN THE MIDDLE OF THE BID, AND ABLE TO SEE THE SERVICES AND I SERVE AS CORRECT FOR -- DIRECTOR OF THE BID AND I MUST SAY .. I HAVE BEEN IMPRESSED IN TERMS OF THE COMMITMENT THAT THE DIRECTORS AND THE MEMBERS HAVE TO THE BID AND ENSURING THAT SERVICES THAT ARE PROVIDED ARE DONE WELL AND I EXPECT, YOU KNOW, THE SAME IN TERMS OF THE DOWNTOWN BID. I MEAN, I AM SORRY, THE GREENWAY
- BID.
- I THINK THE PURPOSE OF THE

GREENWAY BID WAS REALLY TO CREATE A MECHANISM THAT WOULD CONTRIBUTE TO THE FINANCING TO PRESERVE, PROTECT, MAINTAIN, ENHANCE THE GREENWAY BID. THAT IS NOW THE CONSERVANCY'S RESPONSIBILITY.

IT REALLY IS A GENERAL FRAMEWORK FOR SHARED FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY.

I MEAN, BASICALLY, IT IS ONE WHERE THERE IS PRECONDITIONS THAT FRANKLY, YOU KNOW, THE CITY AND THE STATE MIGHT NOT HAVE BEEN A PART OF THIS AGREEMENT IF BUTTERS DIDN'T THE BIDDERS DIDN'T AGREE TO DO THE BIDS OR THE BIDDERS MAY NOT HAVE CREATED THE BID IF THE STATE AND THE CITY WERE NOT PART OF THE FINANCING.

SO THIS IS REALLY MECHANISM,
SORT OF THE PETITION THAT BRINGS
THIS ALTOGETHER AND SORT OF FORM
HIGHS THE, FORMALIZE IT IS
MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT OR
UNDERSTANDING, IT HAS ALREADY
BEEN SET.

THIS IS A BID ESTABLISHED UNDER 40 O, CHAPTER 40 O OF THE ACTS OF THE DIRECTOR AND THIS IS THE SAME LAW THAT WAS THE BASIS FOR THE CREATION OF THE DOWNTOWN BID.

THE MECHANISM, THE FINANCING MECHANISMS YOU HAVE BASICALLY ALREADY TALKED ABOUT.

IT IS WORTH NOTING THAT -- IT IS REALLY -- THOSE WHO WOULD BE PAYING THE ASSESSMENT ARE BASICALLY PROPERTIES OWNERS THAT HAVE PROPERTY OF \$10 MILLION OR MORE, SO THOSE PROPERTIES STRADDLE AT LESS WOULD NOT BE ASKED TO MAKE AN ASSESSMENT. IT IS, ALSO EXEMPT WOULD BE RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES ONE TO 4 UNITS, CONDOMINIUM UNITS, CONDOMINIUMS, RESIDENTIAL CONDOMINIUMS ARE ALSO EXEMPT, TAXES AND PROPERTY ALSO EXEMPT, SO IT IS SPECIFIED MORE FOR THOSE WROTE ABLE TO MAKE THOSE PAYMENTS.

THE CITY OF BOSTON'S ANNUAL CONTRIBUTION IS BASED ON AN ESTIMATED INCOME THAT WOULD BE GENERATED FROM THE PROCEEDS OF THE \$5 MILLION FROM THE -- WHICH ARE THEMSELVES PROCEEDS FROM THE SALE OF THE CAPITAL ASSET, THE WINTHROP SQUARE GARAGE. THIS FUNDING MECHANISM DOES RAISE OUESTIONS FOR US REGARDING THE PROPERTY -- PROPER USE OF PROCEEDS FROM THE SALE OF A CITY OWNED CAPITAL ASSET, BUT THIS IS NOT AN ISSUE GERMANE TO THE CREATION OF THIS OR THE APPROVAL OF THIS BID.

I WOULD NOTE, THOUGH, THAT WITH THE MASS DOT'S CONTINUED SUPPORT OF THE CAPITAL PORTION OR PART -- PART OF THE CAPITAL NEEDS OF THE GREENWAY BID THAT THAT IS AN OBLIGATION FOR THE CITY TO THE DOWNTOWN BID AS WELL AND WE ARE PLEASED THAT IN THIS FISCAL 19 CAPITAL BUDGET THAT THERE ARE SOME FUNDS FOR THAT.

BUT GIVEN THE REVENUE THAT IS
GENERATED FROM DOWNTOWN AND HOW
THAT HAS GROWN IN PART BECAUSE
OF MORE PEOPLE WILLING TO -- AND
WANTING TO LIVE DOWNTOWN AND
OBVIOUSLY MORE COMMERCIAL
BUILDINGS DOWNTOWN, PARTLY
BECAUSE OF THE ATTRACT
DIFFERENCE OF THE AREA AS A
RESULT OF THE BID.

SO I THINK IT REALLY IS INCUMBENT UPON THE CITY TO DO MORE IN TERMS OF THE CAPITAL, STREET, SIDEWALK KIND OF WORK FOR DOWNTOWN THAN WE HAVE SEEN IN THE PAST.

BUT ALTOGETHER, I THINK THIS IS A WORTHY ENDEAVOR AND IT WOULD REALLY ENHANCE THE CITY AND ENSURE THAT, YOU KNOW, THE GREENWAY WILL CONTINUE TO BE AN ATTRACTIVE AREA PROVIDING SERVICES AND REAL BENEFIT TO THE CITY OF BOSTON AND AS A RESULT THE RESEARCH DOES STRONGLY RECOMMEND THAT THE CITY COUNCIL APPROVE THIS DOCKET CREATING THE DOWNTOWN BID.

MY NAME IS RICHARD DOMENICO THE CEO OF BETTER CITY, CITY BRAC BERRY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE ROSE GREENWAY GREENWAY CONSERVANCY.

SO FIRST BOTH JESSE AND I WOULD LIKE TO THANK THE CITY COUNCIL FOR HAVING THIS HEARING AND FOR FORMALLY INTRODUCING THIS PETITION BEFORE YOUR BODY, WE ARE SO GRATEFUL FOR ALL OF YOUR ENGAGEMENT AND DISCUSSION WITH US AS WE HAVE WORKED REAL HARD TO TRY TO THINK THROUGH HOW TO CREATE A BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT FOR THE ROSE KENNEDY GREENWAY.

WE HAVE A BETTER CITY -- I WILL SHOW A COUPLE OF IMAGES, I THINK YOU GUYS CAN APPRECIATE, SO A LONG TIME AGO THERE WAS A YOUNG COMMISSIONER THAT WORKED ON THE CENTRAL LOTTERY, AND THAT LED TO THE ROSE KENNEDY GREENWAY. AND --

>> IT WAS --

>> IS DO MEN KNOW ONE OF THOSE ITALIAN GUYS?

BUT THE COMMONWEALTH IN THE CITY OF BOSTON AND THE COMMUNITIES ALONG THE CENTRAL ARTERY TUNNEL BUT IT IS, YOU KNOW, THE NEIGHBORHOODS THROUGHOUT THE CITY WORKING TO THE TO MAKE THIS MEGA PROJECT BECOME A REALITY AND BODIES LIKE THE CITY COUNCIL

WERE VERY INSTRUMENTAL TOGETHER WITH LEADERSHIP OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS AND THE CITY OF BOSTON TO MAKE THIS POSSIBLE.

WE ARE VERY FORTUNATE THE CONSERVANCY WAS GIVEN THE OPPORTUNITY TO OPERATE AND MAINTAIN THIS VERY SPECIAL SPACE AND THE COMMONWEALTH HAS BEEN LIVING UP TO ITS OBLIGATIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES FOR A NUMBER OF YEARS TO HELP SUPPORT THIS EFFORT. INTERESTINGLY ENOUGH, BELIEVE IT OR NOT, THE ARTERY BUSINESS COMMITTEE WHICH WAS STARTED IN 1989, WHILE I WAS COMMISSIONER, TOOK A VERY ACTIVE ROLE IN THINKING ABOUT THIS WHOLE PROJECT, BUT ALSO THE CENTRAL ARTERY.

BACK IN 1989, IT WAS ACTUALLY A BUTTER ESTABLISHED BY THE BUSINESS COMMUNITY SO THIS IS NOT NEW. THE BUSINESS COMMUNITY AND THE PROPERTY OWNERS ALONG THE GREENWAY HAVE BEEN, HAVE HAD AN ACTIVE CIVIC INTEREST IN THIS SPACE SINCE 1989.

THEY HAVE BEEN ENGAGED WITH ALL TYPES OF CONTRIBUTIONS, PLANNING, RESEARCH, ANALYSIS, AND PARTNERSHIP FOR THE COMMONWEALTH OF THE CITY OF BOSTON. I CAN TESTIFY TO THAT BECAUSE FORMER SECRETARY IS A THROUGH ECONOMY AND ANY USED TO MEET WITH THEM OBAMA TO ACTUALLY SPEAK TO HOW WE CAN GET THIS STUFF DONE AND, IN FACT, THE ARTERY BUSINESS WORKED ON THE MASTER PLAN FOR THE GREENWAY SPACE, CREATED EDGE STUDIES IN HOW THE PRIVATE SPACES WOULD HELP SHAPE AND EVOLVE, TO CREATE THIS NEW SPACE AND MAKE SURE THAT WE COMBINED THOSE SPACES WITH THE PUBLIC SPACE. SO THERE HAS BEEN A VERY LONG AND WONDERFUL RELATIONSHIP OF THE PRIVATE SECTOR TO THIS INCREDIBLY WONDERFUL OPEN SPACE

THAT HAS A LOT OF REAL SERIOUS PRODUCTIVITY AND A LOT OF

SERIOUS ENGAGEMENT AND SO IT IS KIND OF REASONABLE AND IN FACT ALMOST NATURAL PO FOR US IN 2017, NOW GOING INTO 2018, BECAUSE WE STARTED THIS EFFORT IN 2017, TO BE ASKED TO PART HER ONCOMING UP WITH A SHARED RESPONSIBILITY REGARDING THIS SPACE.

SO IT IS BUILT OFF THE SHOULDERS OF MANY, MANY YEARS OF CONTRIBUTIONS BOTH, AND PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN THE PRIVATE SECTOR AND THE PUBLIC SECTOR.

SO AS WAS REFERENCED BY THE COLLEAGUES THAT SPOKE BEFORE US, THERE WAS A GENERAL AGREEMENT THAT WAS ESTABLISHED IN 2017 BETWEEN THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS AND THE CITY OF BOSTON AS WELL AS THE CONSERVANCY AND A BETTER CITY WHICH IN TURN WE REPRESENTED THE BUTTER COMMUNITY.

OF THE 60 PROPERTIES THAT ARE IN THE BID, 20 OF THE PROPERTY OWNERS ACTUALLY WERE SITTING ON THE BUTTER COMMITTEE AND HAD A HISTORICAL ROLE AS I MENTIONED EARLIER.

WE SAW THE IDEA AND OPPORTUNITY OF SOMETHING THAT WAS REALLY SPECIAL, AND WHAT WAS REALLY IMPORTANT IS THAT ALL OF THESE AGENCIES CAME TOGETHER.

I KNOW THAT ALL FOCUS ON COLLABORATION AND PEOPLE WORKING TOGETHER ON A REGULAR BASIS, IS THE NATURE OF THE CITY COUNCIL. YOU WOULD BE VERY PROUD OF THIS COLLABORATION.

MASS DOT, THE COMMONWEALTH OF
MASSACHUSETTS, THE CITY OF
BOSTON, BOSTON PLANNING
DEVELOPMENT AGENCY, JESSE BRAC
BERRY AND THE CONSERVANCY AND

WHEN THAT TYPE OF COLLABORATION COMES TOGETHER AND WORKS, IT IS ONE OF THOSE THINGS AND MOMENT WES SHOULD CERTAINLY PAUSE AND CELEBRATE AND NOW WE ACTUALLY ARE AT A PLACE WHERE WE CAN GIVE YOU A FORMAL BID TO CONSIDER. OBVIOUSLY WE HAVE BEEN WORKING WITH ALL OF YOU AND I CAN'T TELL YOU HOW MUCH I APPRECIATE THAT, AND AS YOU HEARD FROM THE SENATOR BONE CORE AND MIKE WITS THEY BOTH HAVE BEEN ACTIVE PARTICIPANTS WITH ALL OF YOU AND I APPRECIATE YOUR IN NUT SHAPING THIS.

WE ALSO GOT A LOT OF INPUT FROM NEIGHBORHOOD BUSINESS LEADERS AS WELL AND ALSO RESIDENTS THAT LIVE ALONG THE GREENWAY.
SO LET ME JUST TALK QUICKLY ABOUT THE GOALS OF THE GREENWAY BID.

I THINK ONE OF THE IMPORTANT THINGS THAT YOU SHOULD REALIZE AND I AM SO GLAD FORMER CITY COUNCILOR SAM STONE SPOKE AND THE RESEARCH DIRECTOR SAM TYLER SPOKE AS WELL AS THE OTHERS I REALLY APPRECIATE AND RESPECT EVERYBODY'S COMMENTS THAT PRECEDED JESSE AND IT'S, INCLUDING STEVE, AND WE THINK THAT ROSEMARIE MARLEY AND SAM HAVE BEEN PROVIDING INCREDIBLE GUIDANCE, AS YOU ARE ASKING COUNCILOR FLYNN AND MICHELLE, WE TALKED ABOUT THIS AS WELL, EVERY STEP OF THE WAY, ROSEMARIE SANSONE, SAM TYLER, PIPER WHO IS WITH THE LAW FIRM THAT CREATED THE BID IN THE DOWNTOWN HAVE BEEN INCREDIBLY HELPFUL ADVISORS TO ME AND JESSE IN CREATING THIS, WITHOUT THEIR HELP WE WOULD NOT BE HERE TODAY SO I WANT TO THANK THEM PUBLICLY FOR THEIR REALLY GREAT SUPPORT. WE HAVE, AS I WAS MENTIONING TO YOU BEFORE WE HAVE SPECIFIC GOALS, WE ARE LOOKING TO RAISE \$1.5 MILLION THROUGH AN

INCREMENTAL INCREASE IN PROPERTY TAXES.

AS YOU WERE ASKING THE CFO EARLIER, THIS IS NEW TAX DOLLARS.

SAME THING.

IT WILL NOT AFFECT THE TAX BASE
OF THE CITY OF BOSTON.
IMAGINE JUST LIKE IN THE
DOWNTOWN BID WHERE ROSEMARIE
SANSONE AND HER LEADERSHIP
AGREED TO HAVE AN INCREMENTAL
INCREASE ON THEIR TAXES WHILE
THE PROPERTY OWNERS THAT ARE IN IN
THIS BID HAVE AGREED TO DO THE

THEY HAVE AGREED TO ACTUALLY HAVE AN INCREMENT INCREASE ON THEIR TAXES THAT WILL BE COLLECTED, ORGANIZED, 1 MILLION OF THOSE DOLLARS WILL GO INTO THE OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF THE ROSE KENNEDY GREEN WAY.

500 -- I AM SORRY, \$500,000 WILL THEN GO INTO ENHANCEMENTS.

SO THIS WAS KIND OF, WHAT IS WONDERFUL ABOUT BIDS IS IT IS A VOLUNTEER ACTION OF THE PROPERTY OWNERS TO BE PARTNERS WITH THE PUBLIC SECTOR TO ENHANCE AND COMPLEMENT THE SPA SPACE.

I WANT TO GO TO THE NEXT SLIDE SO WE CAN GIVE YOU A BREAK DOWN OF THE RELATIONSHIP OF THE DOLLARS.

AND JESSE WILL SPEAK TO THIS SOON.

COMPLIMENT THE SPACE.

BUT PLEASE LOCHTE BIG GROWN PIECE OF THE PIE.

THIS IS WHERE A PARTNERSHIP WITH THE NONPROFIT KNOWN IT IS A CONSERVANCY AND AGAIN I HAVE BEEN GRATEFUL TO WORK WITH JESSE OVER THE YEARS IS INCREDIBLY IMPORTANT, NOT ONLY DOES THE CONSERVANCY DO A GREAT JOB WITH TAKING CARE OF THE SPACE BUT BECAUSE THE COMMON WEFLT WAS WISE IN CREATING THIS PARTNERSHIP THE CONSERVANCY HAS BEEN LEVERAGING ITS ACTIVITIES AS NONPROFIT TO GENERATE FUNDING TO ACTUALLY GO-GO BEYOND THE TRADITIONAL OPERATIONS OF THIS

SPACE. WHAT A GREAT DEAL.
THE RETURN ON THE INVESTMENT FOR
COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS
HAS BEEN SUBSTANTIAL.

THAT'S WHY AS PROPERTY OWNERS WE WERE VERY PROUD AND PLEASED TO ACTUALLY INVEST IN THIS VERY VALUABLE ENTERPRISE.

WHERE WE COULD SEE OUR DOLLARS GOING INTO SOMETHING WHICH WAS PRODUCTIVE AND ACTUALLY ANTICIPATED TO BE INCREDIBLY WELL USED.

SO PLEASE KNOW THAT WHILE WE ARE MAKING A CONTRIBUTION, TO THE CONSERVANCY AND TO THE GREENWAY THE CONSERVANCY WILL STILL HAVE A PRETTY SUBSTANTIAL RESPONSIBILITY, A GREAT RESPONSE, WORK AS A CHARITABLE NONPROFIT, AND DO ITS JOB RELATIVE TO THE WHOLE DEVELOPMENT PART OF THE RESPONSIBILITIES.

WE APPRECIATE THAT AND RESPECT THAT BUT I JUST WANT WANTED TO MAKE SURE THAT DOESED NOT END THAT PART OF THE CONSERVANCY'S RESPONSIBILITY ALTHOUGH IT IS A SIGNIFICANT CONTRIBUTION.
AGAIN, AND JESSE WILL SPEAK TO

THAT LATER BUT I JUST WANTED TO MAKE THAT CLEAR.

THIS IS AN OPERATING PIE CHART, WE WILL BE PUTTING 18 PERCENT OF BID DOLLARS INTO THAT OPERATING THE PIE CHART.

MASS DOT WILL PUT IN ANOTHER 18 PERCENT, CITY OF BOSTON FOUR PERCENT, THIS DOES NOT RELATE TO THE CAPITAL DOLLARS THAT WERE SPOKEN TO EARLIER, COMMON HEALTH WEALTH WILL STAY INVOLVED WITH CAPITAL, WE WILL BE INVOLVED WITH ENHANCEMENT FUNDING, THOSE DOLLARS ARE NOT REFLECTED IN THIS PIE CHART. THIS IS JUST THE OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF THE SPACE. THE MASSACHUSETTS BID LAW, AS MANY OF THE SPEAKERS BEFORE US WAS CREATE BED AT THIS COMMONWEALTH AND IT IS A VERY SPECIFIC LAW AND IT REALLY

REQUIRES VERY PRESCRIPTIVE ACTIVITIES IN CREATING A BID IF YOU DON'T FOLLOW IT YOU DON'T GET TO DO A BID, IT IS THAT PLAIN AND SIMPLE.

WE HAVE TO CREATE A BID DISTRICT AND BOUNDARY LINES, WE HAD TO ENGAGE ALL OF THE PROPERTY OWNERS THAT WERE DEFINED IN THE GENTLEMAN AGO AT THIS OF THE BID.

WE HAD TO THEN WORK WITH THEM TO CREATE A BID MANAGEMENT PLAN AND COME UP WITH A SPECIFIC FORMULA. WE THEN HAD TO WORK WITH THEM TO GET THEM TO SIGN UP AND BE A PART OF THE BID, VOLUNTARY, VOLUNTARILY AS WU MENTIONED EARLIER WE MET THE THRESHOLDS OUR BID HAS BEEN CERTIFIED BY THE CITY CLERK, WE ARE VERY PROUD OF THAT AS WELL. WE HAVE HAD TO SUBMIT OUR BID TO

WE HAVE HAD TO SUBMIT OUR BID TO THE CITY CLERK AND NOW THIS BID IS AWAITING COUNCIL APPROVAL. JUST A LITTLE BIT OF HIGHLIGHTS REGARDING THE PROCESS.

WE HAD A BIDDER COMMITTEE MEETINGS OVER THE LAST YEAR SO THINK OF A 52 WEEKS IN A YEAR. WE ALMOST MET EVERY TWO WEEKS IN THE COURSE OF A YEAR.

TO GET THIS THING ORGANIZED.
I HAVE TO GET THE BIDDER
COMMUNITY SOME OF THE FOLKS WHO
ARE HERE TODAY A LOT OF CREDIT,
BECAUSE THEY TOOK THIS THING
VERY SERIOUSLY.

AROUND THE TABLE IN MY OFFICE, SAT THE MAJOR PROPERTY OWNERS AND SOME OF IS THE SMALL PROPERTY OPENERS WELL TO GOING INTO THE LEAVES AND MAKING SURE WE FIGURE THESE THINGS OUT. GETTING JESSE'S ENGAGEMENT AND HIS BOARD'S PARTNERSHIP AND GETTING THE COMMONWEALTH AND THE CITY'S INVOLVEMENT WAS ONE OF THOSE THINGS THAT REALLY REQUIRED A LOT OF WORK, BUT WAS WELL WORTH IT.

AND WE DID EVERYTHING IN OUR POWER TO CONNECT WITH THE INDIVIDUAL PROPERTY OWNERS TO

MAKE SURE THAT THEY KNEW WHAT WAS GOING ON AND WHAT THE RELATIONSHIP TO THIS BID MEANT TO THEM.

YOU HAVE A LOT OF THIS INFORMATION IN YOUR PACKET. BUT WE CREATED GREENWAY BID BOUNDARIES.

WE DECIDED TO CREATE A LEVEL OF \$10 MILLION OF WHICH WE WOULD CONSIDER ANY PROPERTY WITHIN THE BID DISTRICT.

WE ALSO LOOKED AT FUTURE
DEVELOPED PARCELS RELATIVE TO
THE RELATIONSHIP IN THE FUTURE,
AND THE FUTURE RELATIONSHIP TO
BEING VALUED AT \$10 MILLION AND
MORE AS DIRECTOR TYLER MENTIONED
RESIDENTIAL I CON KNOW PROFITS
NONPROFITS, WE INCLUDED
NONPROFIT BUS THEY WILL NOT BE
ASSESSED, AND THE RESULTS WAS 61
OWNERS REPRESENTING 50 BUILDINGS
IN TERMS OF THE TOTAL POPULATION
OF THE PEOPLE THAT WE NEEDED TO
WORK WITH.

AND WAS REFLECTED BY THE CITY OF BOSTON'S CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER, WE EXCEEDED THE MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS.

THE LEGAL THRESHOLD FOR PROPERTY OWNERS TO SIGN UP, THE 60 PERCENT, WE GOT TO 82 PERCENT, AND IN TERMS OF THE ASSET VALUE WE GOT TO 89 PERCENT.

IS ASSESSMENT FORMULA WE PREPARED FOR PROPERTY OWNERS WAS SOMETHING THAT WAS VERY MUCH INFORMED BY THE DOWNTOWN BID. AGAIN HERE IS WHERE ROSEMARY AND HER OFFICE AND ALL OF THE GOOD COLLEAGUES THAT WORK WITH HER HELPED US TREMENDOUSLY.

WE CAME UP WITH A FAIR AND EQUITABLE APPROACH AND DECIDED

EQUITABLE APPROACH AND DECIDED THAT RESIDENTIAL RENTALS WOULD BE ASSESSED AT 50 PERCENT OF THE ASSET VALUE, WHICH MADE A LOT OF SENSE.

THE OTHER THING WE SIDED TO DO IS JUST AS IN THE DOWNTOWN BID INCLUDE A HARDSHIP WAVE SO IF FOR SOME REASON SOMEBODY IS

FACING DIFFICULTIES THEY CAN
COME TO THE BID BOARD AND WORK
WITH US TO SEE IF THERE IS SOME
RELIEF WE CAN GIVE THOSE
PARTICULAR PARTIES.

AS THE CFO MENTIONED EARLIER THIS WILL BE PART OF THE REGULAR CITY OF BOSTON TAX COLLECTION PROCESS, A BILL WILL GO OUT, WE HOPE THE BILL GOES OUT IN JULY BECAUSE WE WANT TO TRY TO MEET THE SCHEDULE THAT COUNCILOR WU MENTIONED TO YOU EARLIER AND THEN THAT WILL START THE PROCESS OF PROVIDING CASH FLOW TO THE OVERALL OPERATING BUDGET OF THE CONSERVANCY AND THE GREENWAY AND WILL ALSO BEGIN TO SET THE STAGE FOR SETTING UP THE ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM AND THE RELATED OTHER ASPECTS OF THE BID THAT WILL BE INVOLVED.

A COUPLE OF OTHER POINTS I WANT TO MAKE IS, THE BID FROM A LEGISLATIVE STANDPOINT AND FROM A FUNDAMENTAL STANDPOINT IN TERMS OF HOW IT WAS ORGANIZED IS VERY SIMILAR TO THE DOWNTOWN BID.

BUT THIS BID, THE RESPONSIBILITY IS VERY DIFFERENT.

WE WILL HAVE A FIDUCIARY
RELATIONSHIP WITH THE
CONSERVANCY TO PERFORM ITS
OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE WORK.
WE WILL ASK THEM TO PERFORM THAT
WORK WELL AND I AM SURE THEY
WILL.

BUT RELATIVE TO THE NATURE OF THE PROGRAMMING AND THE PUBLIC SPACE THAT WILL STILL WHOLE HARDLY FIT WITHIN THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS, THE CITY OF BOSTON, AND ITS RELATIONSHIPS TO THE CONSERVANCY, THAT IS WHAT IS ONE OF THE WONDERFUL PARTS OF THE IDEA OF THIS BID, WE ARE BASICALLY PROVIDING AN ESSENTIAL PART OF THE OPERATING BUDGET FOR THE TERM OF OUR BID AND WE HOPE IT WILL GO LONGER THAN FIVE YEARS BUT EVERY BID IN MASSACHUSETTS HAS A SUNSET

CLAUSE AND OF COURSE AS ROSEMARY IS WORKING ON IT WE HOPE TO CONTINUE THIS BID BUT FOR THE PERIOD OF THE BID, WE HAVE ARE PROVIDING OPERATING AND MAINTENANCE FUNDS TO THE CONSERVANCY.

AND WE ARE JUST SIMPLY ASKING THEM PLEASE CONTINUE TO DO A GOOD JOB.

WE NEED TO FIGURE OUT WHAT KIND OF PROMP ACCOUNTS WE MAKE? AND WORK WITH THEM TO MAKE THOSE INVESTMENTS?

>> BUT RELATIVE TO WHAT HAPPENS OUT THERE, IT IS KIND OF THE SAME THING THAT HAS BEEN GOING HONOR THE LAST TEN YEARS OR SO. THE PUBLIC GETS TO ENJOY THE SPACE, THE CONSERVANCY WORKING WITH THE COMMONWEALTH OF THE CITY OF BOSTON FINDS THOSE MOMENTS IT CAN BE A LITTLE ENTREPRENEURIAL AND PROVIDE SOME COOL PROGRAMMING AND THAT PARTICULAR RELATION THINK IS SOMETHING THAT, IS FOR THE PUBLIC INTEREST IS HELD CONSISTENT WITH THE WAY IT IS TODAY.

SO I JUST WANTED TO MAKE THAT CLEAR.

AND AGAIN WE LOOK FORWARD TO BEING THAT PARTNER AND WE ARE EXCITED ABOUT, YOU KNOW -- AGAIN WE HAVE BIDDERS HERE INITIALLY THE IDEA IS, OKAY I AM ASKING YOU TO PAY A ILL LIT BIT MORE IN TAXES BUT THEY WERE TOTALLY HONESTLY RIGHT OUT OF THE GATE, AS SOON AS WE CAME OUT WITH A FORMULA THAT HAD THIS KIND OF PHILOSOPHICAL GOAL OF MAKING SURE OF THE SHARED RESPONSIBILITY, WAS PART OF THE IDEA, TOTALLY ENAMORED AND WORKED REALLY HARD TO GET THIS BID BEFORE YOU TODAY SO THANK YOU FOR THE TIME.

I AM GOING TO TURN OVER THE REST OF THE PRESENTATION TO JESSE.

CHAIR WU, VICE CHAIR BAKER AND TO OUR COUNCILORS, COUNCILOR, OUR DISTRICT COUNCILORS, COUNCILOR FLYNN AND EDWARDS TO COUNCILOR ESSAIBI GEORGE AND COUNCILOR JANEY, I WANT TO THANK ONE OF OUR BOARD MEMBERS F BOYLE FROM MASS DOT IS IN ATTENDANCE AS WELL AS 4 OF THE CONSERVANCY STAFF.

I THINK -- AND I ALSO WANT TO THANK WHOARCH IS IN ATTENDANCE BECAUSE I THINK WE ARE TALKING ABOUT PUBLIC SPACE AND TALKING ABOUT A PUBLIC PARK AND NICE TO SEE ENGAGEMENT FROM THOSE WHO ARE TESTIFYING AND PARTICULARLY KIND OF GRAPHING TO SEE A CLASS OF SCHOOL KIDS HERE FOR THIS HEARING, PARTICULARLY. I MENTION KIDS AND THE LIGHT GOES OFF.

>> YOU TALKED TOO LONG ABOUT THE PRESENTATION --

>> THIS IS AN INCREDIBLY EXCITING DAY BECAUSE AS HAS BEEN SAID BEFORE, MANY PARTIES CAME TOGETHER TO FORM THIS AGREEMENT AND MY THANKS TO RICK FOR PLAYING A LEADER SHIP ROLE IN THAT EFFORT TO THE CITY AND TO THE STATE AND TO ALL OF THE PROPERTY OWNERS THAT ARE HERE, AS HAS BEEN EMPHASIZED THIS WILL ALLOW THE CONSERVANCY TO CONTINUE TO LEVERAGE ADDITIONAL PRIVATE SECTOR FUNDING FOR THE PUBLIC PARK AND TO CONTINUE TO DO THE WORK THAT WE HAVE BEEN FOCUSED ON.

SO LET ME TALK A LITTLE BIT ABOUT THAT WORK.

WE IN 2017 HAD ABOUT 400 FREE EVENTS IN THE PARK, AND WE EXPECT WITH THE INTRODUCTION OF THE BID, OUR WORK TO CONTINUE, I DON'T SEE THIS AS, TO THOSE WHO ARE CONCERNED, I DON'T SEE THIS AS A CHANGE, AS RICK HAD SAID, THIS IS A FUNDING MECHANISM THAT CREATES CERTAINLY, AND, CERTAINTY AND A GREAT PARTNERSHIP THAT HAS EXISTED FOR MANY TIMES, CONTINUE CONTINUES

AND SO OUR WORK CAN CONTINUE. SO 2018 WE WILL SEE MORE COMMUNITY FESTIVALS, MARKETS, FITNESS CLASSES, 100 FREE FITNESS CLASSES ALL DOWNTOWN, ALL ON THE ORGANICALLY MAINTAINED LAWNS. WE HAVE A ROBUST VOLUNTEER PROGRAM WHERE WE ENGAGE COMMUNITY MEMBERS AND GROUPS FOR A DAY OR FOR AN ONGOING WAY AND THAT COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT WILL CONTINUE. IT IS CRITICAL WHEN WE MAINTAIN THE PARK ORGANICALLY YOU ARE NOT SPRAYING THE PARK WITH PESTICIDES WE HAVE COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT HELPING TO PULL THE WEEDS. IN ADDITION WE HAVE COMMUNITY FOCUS PROGRAMMING, A LOT OF THAT OCCURS IN CHINA TOWN PARK, AND

THAT WILL CONTINUE IN THIS YEAR. WE HAVE A PARTNERSHIP WITH THE BOYS AND GIRLS CLUB IN WHICH WE BRING KIDS FROM CLUBS ALL ACROSS THE CITY FOR A DAY ON THE GREEN WAY, FOOD TRUCK LUNCH, A TOUR OF THE PUBLIC ART, A RUN THROUGH THE FREE FOUNTAIN, A RIDE ON THE CAROUSEL, THOSE BUT FOOD --THOSE FOOD TRUCKS THE FIRST GOURMET FOOD TRUCK IN BOSTON, MICHELLE AND I WORKED ON THAT A LONG TIME AGO AND IT IS ON THE FREIN WAY AND NOW 38 LOCAL ENTREPRENEURS THAT HAVE A WAY TO GET STARTED, THAT WE ARE WORKING WITH THIS YEAR.

AND MANY OF THOSE, THAT VERY FIRST FOOD TRUCK, CLOVER, NOW HAS 12 RESTAURANTS ACROSS THE CITY EMPLOYING PEOPLE.
THIS SPACE IS AN INCUBATOR FOR THOSE KIND OF SMALL BUSINESSES.
OUR PUBLIC ART PROGRAM, WHICH IS I THINK HELPED CHANGE THE CONVERSATION ABOUT PUBLIC ART HERE, THESE PIECES BY HALA. HALANI AND

-- CROSS ARE CURRENTLY ON EXHIBIT AND YOU ARE SEEING IT HERE FIRST, SOME OF THE ART THAT IS COMING THIS YEAR.

WE -- THE THEME IS GLOW FOR OUR

PUBLIC ART CURATOR, LUCAS IS HERE.

WE WILL HAVE INSTALLATIONS FROM LUFT WORK, FROM LOCAL ARTIST ANN LILLY ASHES, A NEW MURAL THAT WE ARE JUST TEASING THERE AND NOT QUITE REVEALING YET. AND THEN ONE THING THAT WE THINK IS REALLY EXCITING IS THERE WILL BE AN EXHIBIT OF HISTORIC NEON SIGNS THOORKS EASY ARE ALL SIGNS THAT EXISTED ACROSS MASSACHUSETTS AND I THINK THEY ARE ILLUSTRATIVE OF OUR INTEREST IN GIVING COMMUNITIES NOT JUST IN THE CITY, BECAUSE THIS WAS A PARK THAT WAS BUILT WITH STATE AND FEDERAL DOLLARS BUT PEOPLE FROM ACROSS THE STATE AND ACROSS THE REGION, A REASON TO COME TO THE GREENWAY, WHEN THEY COME DOWNTOWN, WHEN THEY ARE GOING, ANYWHERE DOWNTOWN, MAKE A STOP ON THE GREENWAY AND SEE THE SIGN THAT USED TO BE IN YOUR COMMUNITY FOR SO MANY YEARS. A LAST EXAMPLE OF THE TYPE OF WORK THAT WE DO AND THAT WE DO WITH PRIVATE SUPPORT, THANK YOU TO THE LYNCH FOUNDATION, WE WILL BE RENOVATING A GARDEN IN THE NORTH END AND OPENING IT THIS SPRING, THE CAROLYN LYNCH GARDEN, AND WE WILL BE ADDING TABLES, CHAIRS, UMBRELLAS, PLACES TO GATHER EXCITED ABOUT ALL OF THIS WORK IN 2018 AND ALL OF THE WORK TO COME FOLLOWING THAT, IT DOESN'T MAKE FOR QUITE AS INTEREST AGO SLIDE BUT WITH THE SUPPORT OF THE COMMONWEALTH ON CAPITAL WE WILL ALL -- WE ARE CURRENTLY DOING MASONRY REPAIR WORK, IT IS, OF COURSE, A PARK SITTING OVER A TUNNEL THAT IS VIBRATING EVER SO SLIGHTLY WITH ACRES OF SPECIALTY PAVING, AND SO THAT IS NOT THE IDEAL CONDITION FOR PARKS AND SO THE CAPITAL -- EXCUSE ME, THE CAPITAL SUPPORT FROM THE COMMONWEALTH HAS BEEN REFERENCE ADD FEW TIMES, IS CRITICAL TO MAINTAINING THAT PARK IN THE

NEAR NEW CONDITION THAT WE ALL WOULD LIKE IT TO BE IN.

YOUR PRESENTATIONS WERE INCREDIBLY INFORMATIVE, AND I JUST HAD SOME FOLLOW-UP QUESTIONS, AGAIN, AS WE ARE MOVING INTO -- I THINK YOU MADE IT VERY CLEAR IS WHAT THIS DOES IS FREE YOU UP TO BE ABLE TO PROGRAM IN A WAY THAT I HOPE AND WE ENCOURAGE YOU TO BE INCREDIBLY ACCESSIBLE, WHEN I WAS INTERVIEWED I THINK BY SOMEBODY ON, I CAN'T REMEMBER WHOSE STAFF SPECIFICALLY ABOUT MY THOUGHT OF THE GREENWAY, I WAS VERY HONEST. IT STRUCK ME AS A YUPPY PLAYGROUND, AND MY CONCERN IS THAT AS WE ARE INVESTING IN THIS AND THE MONEY THAT WE ARE HAVING NUT THE LOCAL BUSINESSES THAT SURROUND THAT THAT WE ARE NOT VERY CAUTIOUS ABOUT BREAKING THAT, HOPEFULLY YOU AGREE WITH ME, WE DON'T WANT IT JUST TO BE THAT, THAT IF WE ARE NOT CONSCIOUS OF THE CITY OR NOT CONSCIOUS IN OUR LEADERSHIP ABOUT MAKING SURE THAT THIS IS COMPLETELY ACCESSIBLE BY ALL BOSTONIANS THEN TO ME A LOT OF

THIS INVESTMENT REALLY IS NOT FOR THE CITY OF BOSTON, IT IS FOR THE LOCAL BUSINESS OWNERS PROPERTY VALUES.

I WILL JUST STATE THAT, AND SO I REALLY WANT TO TALK THEN ABOUT THE CONSERVANCY, THE MEMBERS WHO ARE ON THEM MAKING DECISIONS, DIVERSITY OF THE CONSERVANCY AND THEN I WOULD LIKE TO TALK A LITTLE BIT ABOUT THE BID AND THOSE FOLKS WHO WOULD BE ON THE BOARD FOR THE BID.

SO IF YOU COULD TALK TO THEY A LITTLE BIT ABOUT THAT.

>> SURE.

SO I THINK ONE OF THE -- ONE OF THE QUESTIONS THAT -- ONE OF THE TOP PICKS IN DISCUSSION HAS BEEN, THE INFLUENCE AND HOW WILL THE PUBLIC PERSPECTIVE BE MAINTAINED.

AND, YOU KNOW, I THINK THE CLEAREST WAY TO EXPRESS THIS IS, WE HAVE A BOARD FOR OUR NONPROFIT THAT IS DEFINED BY STATE LEGISLATION FROM 2008 AND REVISED IN 2012.

IT ESTABLISHES A 21 MEMBER BOARD.

14 OF THOSE SEATS ARE APPOINTED BY PUBLIC BODIES, STICKS ARE FROM COMMUNITY GROUPS AND EIGHT ARE FROM ELECTED OFFICIALS OR STATE AGENCIES AND THE BID WILL END UP WITH TWO OF THOSE 21 SEATS, AND SO IN -- IN WHAT I HOPE IS REASSURING TERMS, THE GOVERNMENT IS, IT IS A NONPROFIT AND IT IS A NONPROFIT WITH SIGNIFICANT PUBLIC INFLUENCE, YOU KNOW, AND PUBLIC INFLUENCE

>> CAN YOU TELL ME, DO YOU HAVE A LIST OF THE MEMBERS OF THE CONSERVANCY BOARD, THE 21 MEMBERS?

>> I -- SO IT IS ON OUR WEBSITE, I COULD RATTLE THEM OFF FOR YOU, ALTHOUGH IT MIGHT BE A TEST TO GET TO --

>> THE NO, MA'AM FAIRS, NOMINATORS, THE SIX COMMUNITY

GROUPS TWO FROM THE NORTH END ..
THE WHARF DISTRICT COUNCIL, THE

AND CHINA TOWN, TWO KLEIN TOWN
NEIGHBORHOOD GROUPS, TWO FROM
THE MAYOR, TWO FROM THE
GOVERNOR, ONE FROM THE STATE
SENATOR, ONE FROM THE STATE
REPRESENTATIVE, GRUN MASS DOT,
ONE FROM EEOA AND SEVEN FROM THE
CONSERVANCY, OF THOSE 21, TWO

- >> THE RACIAL OR ETHNIC MAKE-UP OF THE CONSERVANCY CAN YOU TELL ME THAT?
- SO ON OUR BOARD.
- >> I BELIEVE WE HAVE TWO ASIAN AMERICANS, AND TWO AFRICAN-AMERICANS I MIGHT BE UNDERSTATING BOTH OF THOSE NUMBERS.
- >> WOMEN VERSUS MEN?
- >> THAT IS APPROXIMATELY 50-50.

- >> AND IN TERMS OF FOLKS WHO LIVE IN BOSTON?

- >> AND THEN YOU CAN COME BACK WITH THIS ANSWER, SO THOSE WHO LIVE IN BOSTON, VERSUS THOSE WHO DON'T, AND THEN ALSO FOR KNOWS WHO LIVE IN BOSTON WHERE?
- >> HOW MANY OF THEM ARE ALL BORDERING THE GREENWAY?

HOW MANY OF THEM ARE COME FROOG

MATTAPAN AND DIFFERENT NEIGHBORHOODS? >> THAT WOULD BE GOOD INFORMATION. [COMING FROM MATTAPAN] >> THE OTHER THING I WILL SAY WHICH IS JUST MY MEMORY COMMITMENT TO THIS, I GREW UP IN NEW YORK CITY, I GREW UPTAKING GYM CLASS IN CENTRAL PARK. I THINK CENTRAL PARK IS AN EXAMPLE OF THE TYPE OF DEMOCRATIC SPACE IN WHICH PEOPLE GATHER AND THAT'S WHAT PARKS SHOULD BE, AND THAT IS THE ASPIRATION FOR THE GREEN WAY. IT IS A PARK RIGHT DOWNTOWN WHERE THIS SORT OF INSTALLED BASE OF PEOPLE LIVING AND WORKING ON IT IS LIVING AND WORKING ALONG THE PARK IS NOT REPRESENTATIVE OF THE DIVERSITY OF OUR CITY.

>> SO THE PEOPLE FOR WHOM THIS IS THEIR FRONT DOOR PARK AND THEREFORE THE KIND OF DEFAULT USER GROUP COMING OUT OF SOUTH STATION IS NOT AS DIVERSE AND IS WHY WE NEED TO BE AS PROACTIVE AS WE POSSIBLY CAN BE. SO YOU REFERENCED WE HAVE CONSULTING TEAMWORK ON A STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN FOR US AND ONE OF THE KEY WORK STREAMS THEY ARE WORKING ON IS THINKING ABOUT AUDIENCE DIVERSITY, BECAUSE AS I SAID, THIS IS BUILT WITH STATE AND FEDERAL DOLLARS, MEANING IT ISN'T A PARK JUST FOR THOSE WHO LIVE AND WORK ALONG THERE, AND SO WHILE THAT MAY BE THE DEFAULT AUDIENCE WE HAVE TO BE EXTREMELY PROACTIVE AT THE CONSERVANCY IN TRYING TO CREATE PAR SHIPS, PARTNERSHIPS AND DO OTHER THINGS THAT DRAW DIVERSITY OF VISITORS TO THE PARK. >> AND I WOULD ECHO THE LEADER SLIP IS ALSO WILLING TO DO THAT AS WELL.

WHO IS MAKING THAT DECISION? >> SO IT IS THE CONSERVANCY THAT IS SELECTING THE FOOD TRUCKS THAT OPERATE ON THE GREEN WAY, THEY NEED TO BE PERMITTED THROUGH THE CITY OF BOSTON. I MEAN, FROM THE VERY FIRST YEAR THAT WE DID THIS, IT WAS A GLOBE EDITORIAL COMMENDING THE DIVERSITY OF SELECTION AND ACTUALLY TALKING ABOUT KIND OF ETHNIC OR IMMIGRANT DIVERSITY OF FOODS IN BOSTON, AND HOW THAT WAS WELL REFLECTED IN THE VERY FIRST CHAIR, WE NOW HAVE, I MEAN, NEW THIS YEAR WE HAVE SOUTH INDIAN FOOD, WE HAVE KOREAN FOOD, THE -- WE HAVE THE JAMAICA-ME HUNGRY TRUCK, I THINK THE SELECTION OF FOODS, I CAN'T SPEAK TO THE FACT THAT ALL OF THE PROPRIETORS ARE -->> THAT WAS GOING TO BE MY OUESTION.

I THINK THE SELECTION OF FOOD IS WONDERFUL, BUT MAKING SURE THAT THE ACTUAL OWNERS ARE ALSO REFLECTIVE OF BOSTON AND ITS DIVERSITY AND ITS ABILITY TO --FOR THEM TO HAVE ACCESS TO PROSPER AS WELL.

>> YES. AND I THINK ONE OF THE GREAT THINGS ABOUT SORT OF FOOD TRUCKS PARTICULARLY, I MEAN, MANY PARTS WILL, PARKS WILL BUILD A RESTAURANT, ONE OF THE GREAT THINGS ABOUT FOOD TRUCKS IS IT IS RELATIVELY COMPARATIVELY LOW BARRIER TO ENTRY, I DON'T WANT TO SAY -- I MEAN IT PROBABLY COSTS \$100,000 TO GET THE TRUCK OFF THE GROUND BUT COMPARED TO OPENING A PRICK AND MORTAR RESTAURANT IT IS A MUCH MORE ECONOMICALLY

ACCESSIBLE PATH SO I AM GLAD WE CAN BE ENGAGED IN FOSTERING THOSE KIND OF OPPORTUNITIES.

>> AND AT THIS UNDERSTAND THAT THERE WAS A PETITION TO ALLOW FOR THE SALE OF ALCOHOL ON THE GREENWAY OR IS THAT AT SOME POINT THERE WAS A LIQUOR LICENSE TO BE AVAILABLE THE GREENWAY WOULD BE ABLE TO HAVE THAT S THERE ANYTHING WITHIN THE GREENWAY'S POLICY OR MISSION WITH REGARDS TO CANNABIS AND ITS AVAILABILITY ALSO IN THE GREENWAY?

>> SO THERE IS NO SMOKING
ALLOWED IN BOSTON PARKS, THAT IS
BOTH, THAT IS ALL SUBSTANCES AND
WE OPT IN TO THAT AS WELL, I
MEAN, WHILE THIS IS NOT
TECHNICALLY A CITY PARK AND
THEREFORE THAT REGULATION
DOESN'T SPECIFICALLY APPLY, WE
HAVE A POLICY OF NO SMOKING.
>> YES.

>> IF A FOOD TRUCK WERE TO OFFER SOME COMBINATION OF CANNABIS INFUSED FOOD, IF YOU WERE TO HAVE YOU COULD CONSUME IT NOT SPEAKING FROM PERSONAL EXPERIENCE BUT I KNOW YOU CAN CONSUME IT IN DIFFERENT WAYS. SO IS THERE --

>> NONE CURRENTLY ON OFFER.
WE HAVEN'T GOTTEN ANY PROPOSALS
TO THAT EFFECT.

THANK YOU FOR RAISING IT US FOR TO THINK ABOUT FOR THE NEXT FOOD TRUCK SEASON.

THERE IS CERTAINLY -- THAT IS A WHOLE NEW WORLD FOR MANY OF US TO THINK ABOUT THE RAMIFICATIONS AND SO THANK YOU FOR RAISING IT. >> THANK YOU.

AND JUST IN TERMS OF -- YES. SO ALONG WITH THE GOAL OF MAKING SURE THAT WE MAINTAIN THIS ACCESS TO BE ABSOLUTELY FREE, I THINK THE MAJORITY OF YOUR ACTIVITIES ARE 100 PERCENT FREE AS YOU NOTED.

WHEN YOU ARE SELLING ALCOHOL, WHEN YOU ARE LOOKING AT WHAT YOU ARE GOING TO SELL, IS THERE A

MISSION TO MAKE SURE THAT IT STAYS WITHIN A CERTAIN PRICE RANGE?

HOW IS THAT DETERMINED?

>> YES.

SO WHEN WE DO AN ANNUAL RFP FOR FOOD TRUCKS, WE HAVE DONE RFPS FOR THE BEER GARDEN THAT WAS THERE LAST YEAR, AND IN THAT, WE EMPHASIZE IN OUR INTEREST IN SUSTAINABLE, LOCAL AND AFFORDABLE, YOU KNOW, IT IS ONE OF MANY FACTORS WE ARE THINKING ABOUT, I THINK THAT, YOU KNOW, THE TRULY BEER GARDEN WAS A HUGE SUCCESS THAT IS ON THE PRICE POINT OF BEERS, ALL OF THE SORT OF LOCAL CRAFT BREWERIES ARE GOING TO BE MORE EXPENSIVE THAN YOUR NATIONAL BEER BRANDS. WE ALSO HAD, IN ADDITION TO THE TRILLIAN BEER GARDEN ALSO THE THURSDAY NIGHT BLOCK PARTIES DONE BY THE SAME FOLKS THAT DO BOSTON CALLING CONCERTS, THAT WAS SPONSORED BY BUD LIGHT AND VERY DELIBERATELY IN OUR MINDS, THERE WERE TWO DIFFERENT TYPES OF PRICE POINTS AND ENTRY POINTS FOR THOSE WHO WANTED TO HAVE A DRINK IN A PUBLIC PARK AND IT WASN'T ALL A FIVE TO \$10 BEER BUT ALSO A LESS EXPENSIVE OPTION UNLESS THE PARK.

>> ABSOLUTELY. AND COUNCILOR WE HAD A NUMBER OF CONVERSATIONS ABOUT THIS. WE ARE VERY COMMITTED TO EXACTLY THAT. >> THAT IS AN IMPORTANT ISSUE FOR ME AND I KNOW YOU HAD 400 FREE EVENTS AND I DO WANT TO MAKE SURE THAT, YOU KNOW, A LOT OF THOSE EVENTS ARE IN CHINA TOWN, THEY ARE OPEN TO THE CHINA TOWN COMMUNITY.

THEY ARE ALSO IN, YOU KNOW, CANTON KNEES AND IN MANDARIN, THEY ARE WELCOMING TO THE COMMUNITY.

AND THE COMMUNITY HAS INPUT ON WHAT SORT OF THOSE PROGRAMS WOULD BE.

SO I JUST HOPE YOU WOULD MAKE A COMMITMENT THAT YOU WILL FACTOR IN THE RESIDENTS OF CHINA TOWN AS YOU DO THESE PUBLIC EVENTS AS WELL.

## >> ABSOLUTELY.

I THINK IT IS WORTH SORT OF NOTING FOR EVERYBODY, OUR MODEL FOR PROGRAMMING IS HOSTED RATHER THAN PRODUCED, SO IN OTHER WORDS, WHAT IS OCCURRING IN THE PARK IS A REFLECTION OF WHAT PEOPLE IN THE CITY WOULD LIKE TO SEE IN THE PARK.

SO IN CHINA TOWN, FOR EXAMPLE, WE PARTNER WITH THE ASIAN COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION ON A SERIES OF KUNG FU MOVIES THAT HAS BEEN A PARTNERSHIP FOR A LONG TIME. WE PARTNERED WITH CHINA TOWN MAIN STREET GROUP ON SEVERAL FESTIVALS.

WE ARE PARTNERING THIS YEAR WITH THE YMCA TO DO FITNESS CLASSES IN THE PARK AND SO WE WOULD LOVE TO HAVE MORE PROPOSALS FROM THE CHINA TOWN COMMUNITY AND FROM DIVERSE COMMUNITIES ACROSS THE CITY OF THINGS THEY WOULD LIKE TO SEE.

I THINK THAT IS PART OF HOW WE CAN DO AUTHENTIC PROGRAMMING. IT IS HARD FOR US AS A STAFF TO PUT ON THAT MANY EVENTS AND SO WE DON'T.

IT WOULD BILLIONS HARD FOR US AS A STAFF TO PUT ON AN AUTHENTIC AUGUST MOON FEST CENTRAL OR AN AUTHENTIC BRAZILIAN FESTIVAL WITHOUT THOSE COMMUNITIES'S DIRECT INVOLVEMENT SO IT ISN'T SIMPLY THAT WE ARE REACHING OUT FOR THEM FOR THEIR INPUT IT IS

THAT THEY ARE PRODUCING THE EVENT AND WE ARE HAPPY TO HOST THEM ON THE GREEN WAY AND HELP FACILITATE THAT.

SO, YES, I THINK MANY OCCUR IN CHINA TOWN AND A MORE WOULD BE GREAT AND I WOULD ENCOURAGE EVERYBODY EVERYONE IN THE WHOLE AUDIENCE, IF YOU KNOW WHO WANT TO DO AN EVENT IN THE GREENWAY AND BRING DIFFERENT GROUPS TO THE GREENWAY, SEND THEM OUR WAY, SEND THEM SPECIFICALLY TO --. SOME ORGANIZATIONS THAT I WILL REACH OUT IN CHINA TOWN, CHINA TOWN AND HAVE THEM FOLLOW UP WITH YOU.

>> AND THERE ARE SOME THEMES I WOULD LIKE TO SEE HAPPEN IS CERTAINLY WE HAVE AN IMMIGRANT COMMUNITY. WE HAVE A HIGH CONCENTRATION OF POVERTY AT TIMES IN CHINA TOWN.
WE HAVE SOME PUBLIC HEALTH

I WOULD LOVE TO COMBINE ALL OF THOSE FACTORS AND MAYBE DO SOME TYPE OF EDUCATIONAL FORM, FORUM THAT IS BENEFICIAL TO THE COMMUNITY, PROVIDING SOME SERVICES TO THE CHINA TOWN COMMUNITY ON SOME SOCIAL ASPECTS AS WELL, NOT JUST ENTERTAINMENT. THANK YOU.

ANOTHER GOOD PARTNER IN THAT WOULD BE AACA, WITH WHOM WE HAVE HAD A PARTNERSHIP FOR THE PAST YEAR AND A HALF.

WHERE THEY HAVE BEEN RUNNING WITH FUNDS THAT WE COLLECTIVELY GOT FROM TUFTS THEY HAVE BEEN RUNNING SMOKING CESSATION INITIATIVE FOCUSED ON THE PAPARK -- ON THE PARK.

AS AFTERNOON EXAMPLE, THE TYPE OF ADDRESSING HEALTH CONCERNS AND WORKING WITH THE LOCAL COMMUNITY AND GETTING PRIVATE FUNDING TO TAKE ON THOSE THINGS AND COUNCILOR WOULD BE DELIGHTED TO WORK WITH YOUR OFFICE FURTHER ON THAT.

CAN YOU TALK ABOUT ARE THERE ANY PARTS OF THE GREENWAY THAT ARE NOT ADA COMPLIANCE?

>> ESSENTIALLY, NO.

THE PARK WAS BUILT -- I MEAN THE BIG DIG BUILT IT TO BE ADA COMPLIANT.

THERE ARE PARTS THAT HAD TEMPORARY DESIGNS AND SO THERE ARE SOME STONE DUST PATHS BUT IN EVERY PLACE THERE IS, YOU KNOW, AN ALTERNATIVE ROUTE AND IN FACT I THINK IT IS -- IT IS A LEADING PARK IN THAT REGARD, NOT JUST IN THE CITY BUT IN THE COUNTRY. AND THEN WHEN WE WORKED ON THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE GREEN WAY CAROUSEL AT TIFFANY -- FOUND IMMIGRATION GROAFER WE WORKED WITH THE INSTITUTE FOR HUMAN CENTER DESIGN TO MAKE THAT THE MOST SORT OF ACCESSIBLE CAROUSEL IN NEW ENGLAND.

SO NOT ONLY DOES IT HAVE SEVERAL DIFFERENT PLACE FORCE THOSE IN WHEELCHAIRS TO RIDE, BUT THOSE WHO HAVE COGNITIVE OR OTHER DISABILITIES, IT ALSO ACCOMMODATES THEM IN SUBTLE WAYS AND SO, YOU KNOW, I THINK IT IS SOMETHING THAT THERE WAS GREAT FORESIGHT BY MASS DOT IN THINKING ABOUT THIS YEARS AGO IN IN THE PLANNING OF IT AND WE ARE PROUD TO CONTINUE THAT TRADITION.

>> OKAY.

>> AND I AM ACTIVE IN THE DISABLED VETERANS COMMUNITY IN BOSTON AND I YOU MENTIONED 400 EVENTS BUT IF YOU ARE ABLE TO HAVE ANY EVENTS THAT ASSIST THE DISABLED, THAT ASSIST VETERANS I THINK THAT WOULD GO A LONG WAY AND BE HELPFUL, TO BE INCLUSIVE. >> WE -- REFERENCING BACK TO AN EARLIER QUESTION ABOUT WHO POLICE IT IS PARK, WHICH WILL IN A MOMENT CONNECT TO YOUR QUESTION, SO BPD POLICE IT IS

PARK, THEY HAVE THE FULL RESPONSIBILITY WE DON'T HAVE A PRIVATE SECURITY FORCE, BUT WE HAVE TWO PARK RANGERS, WHERE THE CLASSIC PARK HAD IN A WELCOMING WAY OUR SENIOR PARK RANGE SEARCH A VETERAN AND SO SHE RAISES THESE ISSUES HERSELF INTERNALLY SHE THE PROGRAM WAS ESTABLISHED NOT SIMPLY FOR SECURITY BUT TO PROVIDE A WELCOMING FACE AND WE ACTUALLY WORKED IN THE DESIGN OF THE PROJECT WITH THE PINE TREE INN AND OTHERS SO IT WAS NOT SIMPLY LET'S PUSH THE PROBLEM OFF THE GREENWAY BUT LET'S HELP DIRECT PEOPLE TO SERVICES. OUR SENIOR PARK RANGER IN ADDITION 0 TOO BEING A VETERAN IS KNOWS SIGN LANGUAGE SO IT IS ONE MORE WAY PERHAPS OUR MOST FRONT FACING INDIVIDUAL WHO IS SPENDING THEIR TIME WALKING THE PARK THE IS ABLE TO ENGAGE WITH A DIVERSE AUDIENCE.

>> ON THE BOARD ITSELF, ARE YOU ABLE TO PROGRAMS RECRUIT SOMEONE FROM THE DISABILITY COMMUNITY? >> THAT COULD BE A REPRESENTATIVE IN -- AND WEIGH IN ONLY SOIL, WEIGH IN ON SOME POLICY THAT WOULD WEIGH ON THE DISABILITY COMMUNITY IN THE PARK.

>> ABSOLUTELY IT COULD BE A CONSIDERATION.

ONE OF THE CHALLENGES IS BECAUSE SO MANY OF THE SEATS ARE ACTUALLY FILLED BY OTHER NOMINATORS, WE ARE SOMEWHAT LIMITED IN OUR ABILITY TO ACCOMMODATE ALL OF THE MANY GOALS THAT ONE WANTS FROM A BOARD IN TERMS OF DIVERSITY AND NETWORKS AND DIFFICULT VERSE AT THIS PERSPECTIVES, BUT I THINK BEYOND OUR BOARD WE WOULD BE DELIGHTED TO MAKE CONNECTIONS WITH LEADERS IN THIS AREA AND THOSE THAT COULD SUGGEST AREAS WE OUGHT TO BE TRYING TO ADVANCE THE GREENWAY'S ACCESSIBILITY TO THOSE -- OF ALL SORTS OF BACKGROUNDS.

SO WHETHER THERE IS A SPOT ON THE BOARD OR WHETHER IT IS JUST THE BEGINNING OF A CONVERSATION WHERE WE THINK ABOUT THIS PROGRAMATICALLY WE WOULD BE HAPPEN TO THINK ABOUT THAT. >> THE FINAL QUESTION. IS OPPORTUNITY I WOULD LIKE TO JOINT COUNCILOR EDWARDS IN THE RECENT STORMS WE HAD IN BOSTON, WE WALKED THROUGHOUT THE GREENWAY AND WE WALKED THROUGH THE NORTH END AS WELL. WHAT ARE YOUR PLANS AS IT RELATES TO CLIMATE CHANGE, HIGH TIDES?

WILL ANY OF THE GREEN WAY BE IMPACTED BY CHANGES IN WEATHER PATTERNS AND WHAT ARE SOME OF THE PRECAUTIONS THAT YOU HAVE TAKEN?

>> SO IN THE TWO RECENT STORMS WHERE THERE WAS MAJOR FLOODING, THE WATER STOPPED LITERALLY AT THE CURB OF THE GREENWAY AT STATE STREET.

HAD THE WATER BEEN TWO INCHES HIGHER, WE WOULD HAVE HAD SALTWATER ON THE LAWNS AND HAD IT BEEN A FEW INCHES HIGHER THAN THAT WE WOULD HAVE HAD SALTWATER IN THE BEDS AND WE HAD INTERNAL CONVERSATIONS ABOUT THE TYPING OF THOSE PARTICULARLY BECAUSE IT WAS WINTER, THE IRRIGATION IS NOT ON, YOU CAN'T FLUSH THE SALT OUT, I MEAN, THE A -- I MEAN IT IS A REAL ISSUE, I WILL ALSO SAY I HAVE BEEN AT THE CONSERVANCY FOR ABOUT EIGHT AND A HALF YEARS AND THOSE ARE THE ONLY TWO TIMES THAT SOMETHING LIKE THAT HAS HAPPENED AND OTHER PLACES FROM THE GREEN WAY ARE FURTHER FROM THE WATER BUT WE KNOW THE PROBLEM IS GETTING WORSE NOT BETTER.
