NEITHER OF WHICH ARE VERY POSITIVE, HOWEVER, THE TERM FOSTER CARE ALUMNI WAS CREATED TO BE AN INCLUSIVE TERM THAT BRINGS TOGETHER ALL THE TRIBES OF US WHO HAVE EXPERIENCED FOSTER CARE. WE CONSIDER PEOPLE TO BE FOSTER CARE ALUMNI IF YOU WERE IN FOSTER CARE FOR ANY PERIOD OF TIME IN ANY U.S. STATE OR COUNTRY IN THE WORLD. THIS INCLUDES A VARIETY OF EXPERIENCES IN FOSTER HOMES WHICH PEOPLE MOST OFTEN THINK OF IN GROUP CARE SETTINGS WHICH HAVE A VARIETY OF DIFFERENT PLACES, IN KINSHIP CARE WHICH MEANS THAT YOU'RE PLACED WITH A RELATIVE OR KIN FOLLOWING REMOVAL FROM YOUR CAREGIVER. IT ALSO INCLUDES FOLKS WHO HAVE BEEN REUNIFIED OR THEY HAVE GONE HOME AFTER BEING IN FOSTER CARE AND ALSO IN THE STATE OF MASSACHUSETTS, YOUTH WHO CONTINUE WITH DCF AFTER THE AGE OF 18 THROUGH TRANSITION AWAY SERVICES AND FOLKS LIKE MYSELF WHO WERE ADOPTED FROM FOSTER CARE. WE ALL NEED MIRRORS, PEOPLE WHO LOOK LIKE US, WHO HAVE BEEN THROUGH WHAT WE HAVE, TO KNOW THAT SUCCESS IS POSSIBLE. WE'RE WALKING ON BOSTON COMMON BECAUSE SHOWING UP IN A PUBLIC SPACE IS TRANSFORMATIONAL AS YOU ALL ARE HERE TODAY. WE'RE ALSO WALKING TO RAISE AWARENESS ABOUT FOSTER CARE TO BRING TOGETHER RESOURCES FOR

CURRENT AND FORMER FOSTER YOUTH, INCLUDING COMPANIES WHO WILL BE EMPLOYMENT RESOURCES TO CURRENT AND FORMER FOSTER YOUTH AND TO BRING TOGETHER AN INTERGENERATIONAL GROUP OF FOLKS WHO HAVE EXPERIENCED FOSTER CARE. MANY FOLKS LIKE MYSELF HAVE GONE ON 30 AND OVER TO ASSIMILATE THIS INTO OUR LIFE EXPERIENCE AND POTENTIALLY NEVER TOLD OUR PARTNER, OUR COLLEAGUE AT WORK, OUR PERSON WE CYCLE WITH ON SATURDAYS THAT WE WERE IN FOSTER CARE. WE ARE HOPING THAT ANYONE WILL JOIN US IN THIS EVENT. IF YOU CARE ABOUT FOLKS WHO HAVE EXPERIENCED FOSTER CARE BECAUSE YOU'RE AN ALLY AND WE WOULDN'T BE HERE WITHOUT YOU TODAY. THE RESPONSE BY THE MAYOR AND REFERRED TO THE COMMITTEE ON APRIL 11 IN ACCORDANCE WITH CHAPTER 190, SECTION 15 OF THE ACTS OF 1982, THE BODY MUST TAKE ACTION ON THESE DOCKETS TODAY, OR THEY WILL AUTOMATICALLY TAKE EFFECT. MOVING ON TO DOCKET 0764. >> DOCKET NUMBER 0764, THE COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS, TO WHICH WAS REFERRED ON MAY 16, 2018, DOCKET NUMBER 0764, AN ORDINANCE ALLOWING SHORT-TERM RENTALS IN THE CITY OF BOSTON, SUBMITS A REPORT RECOMMENDING THE ORDINANCE OUGHT TO PASS IN A NEW DRAFT. >> A COUPLE OF GROUND RULES, APPARENTLY THERE IS GOING TO BE FIREWORKS AT THE COUNCIL TODAY -- NOT HAVING IT -- SO I WANT TO RECOGNIZE THE ADD VOL CASSIE OF EVERY SINGLE PERSON WHO IS HERE AND WHO COULD NOT ATTEND THE MEETING. I KNOW THIS IS AN ISSUE EVERYONE CARRIES ABOUT AS WELL AS THE COLLEAGUES AND MY STAFF WHO WORKS FOR THE COLLEAGUES. SO WE WANT TO BE RESPECTFUL. DOCKET 0764 AN ORDINANCE ALLOWING SHORT-TERM RESIDENTIAL RENTALS IN THE CITY OF BOSTON, SPONSORED BY MAYOR WALSH. COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS HELD A WORKING SESSION ON DOCKET 0764 ON

MAY 21, 2018, PROVIDING FRAMEWORK TO ALLOW AND REGULATE SHORT TERM RENTALS IN THE CITY THROUGH A REGISTRATION PROCESS. IT ESTABLISHES THREE CATEGORIES OF SHORT TERM RENTALS WHICH ARE HOME SHARE UNITS, LIMITED SHARE UNIT AND OWNER ADJACENT UNIT. IT SHOULD BE NOTED THAT THIS ORDINANCE DOES NOT ALLOW FOR INVESTOR UNITS, BUT DOES ALLOW FOR EXEMPT RESIDENTIAL UNITS THAT HAVE BEEN FURNISHED AND CONTRACTED FOR INSTITUTIONAL AND BUSINESS STAYS. THE PROPOSAL ALSO PROHIBITS RESIDENTIAL UNITS SUCH AS INCOME-RESTRICTED UNITS FROM SHORT-TERM RENTALS. THE PROPOSAL EXEMPTS RESIDENTIAL UNITS SUCH AS LICENSED LODGING HOUSES, EXISTING BED AND BREAKFAST FROM BEING PART OF THE DOCKET. THERE WERE REGISTRATION FEES AND PENALTIES AND OTHER PROTECTIONS, FOR EXAMPLE RIGHTS TO A HEARING, IN PLACE FOR CITY AND SHORT-TERM RENTAL OPERATORS. THE COMMITTEE HEARD FROM CHIEF SHEILA DILLON, WILLIAM CHRISTOPHER, I.G.R. POLLSY ANALYST CHRISTOPHER ENGLISH. PATRICIA BOIL MCKENNA AND JOYCE LINEHAN, ALL OF WHOM SPOKE ON BEHALF OF PAYOR WALSH'S ADMINISTRATION. MY COLLEAGUES AND I ALONG WITH THE ADMINISTRATION HAVE HEARD FROM MEMBERS TO HAVE THE PUBLIC THAT ATTENDED NOT ONLY WORKING SESSIONS ON THIS DOCKET BUT TOOK INTO CONSIDERATION COMMENTS AND SUGGESTIONS THAT WERE STATED IN A PRIOR LENGTHY PUBLIC HEARING ON A PREVIOUS DOCKET WHICH WAS THEN FOLLOWED UP BY TWO PUBLIC WORKING SESSIONS ON THE SAME SUBJECT MATTER. MY ROLE AS THE CHAIR IS TO BE FAIR AND OBJECTIVE THROUGHOUT THE COLLECTIVE LEGISLATIVE PROCESS, TAKING INTO CONSIDERATION ALL VIEWPOINTS AS WELL AS ALL PERSPECTIVE AMENDMENTS THAT WERE PRESENTED TO THE COUNCIL IN GIVING EVERYONE AN OPPORTUNITY TO BE HEARD. I FORWARDED IN THIS AMENDED VERSION OF THE DOCKET TAKES INTO ACCOUNT THE IMPARTIAL TOTALITY OF THE SUM AND SUBSTANCE OF THE TESTIMONIES AND SUGGESTIONS PRESENTED TO THE BOSTON CITY COUNCIL AND, SO, AS A RESULT OF THAT TESTIMONY, THE COMMITTEE IS PRESENT AGO NEW DRAFT WITH THE FOLLOWING AMENDMENTS, ADDING A SENTENCE TO UPDATE THE DEFINITION OF SHORT-TERM RENTAL REGISTRIES, TRIPLED BY NOTICE AND TRANSPARENCY WHILE ADDRESSING PRIVACY KERNS, AMENDING SUBSECTION D TO ALLOW AN OWNER ADJACENT UNIT TO OFFER THEIR OWN ADJACENT UNIT AS A SHORT-TERM RENT FORTUNATELY 365 DAYS A YEAR, ADD AGO SENTENCE AT THE END OF SUBSECTION A THAT REQUIRES THE INSPECTION SERVICES TO SUBMIT TO THE SHORT TERM RENTAL REGISTRY AND MAKE THAT AVAILABLE WITHIN 30 DAYS. ALSO ADDING NEW LANGUAGE IN SECTION 2 THAT REOUIRES THE COMMISSION OF INSPECTION SERVICES TO ANNUALLY PREPARE A REPORT DETAILING THE ACTIVITIES OF THE SHORT-TERM RENTAL REGISTRY WHICH WILL BE FILED IN THE CLERK'S OFFICE BEGINNING JUNE 30, 2019. OUR HOPE IS AT SOME POINT AFTER THE ANNUAL REPORTING THAT WE MAY BE ABLE TO GET A BI-ANNUAL OR QUARTERLY AT THE STEPPING OFF POINT WAS TO WORK WITH THE COMMISSIONER OF INSPECTIONAL SERVICES, ALLOW HIM AND HIS TEAM

TO GET A PROCESS STARTED. IT IS MY INTENTION THAT THE AMENDED LEGISLATION HAS BEEN FILLED WITH ISSUES THAT NOT ONLY ADDRESS MANY ASPECTS OF A GROWING INDUSTRY BUT ALSO ASSIST IN ALLEVIATING THE BURDENS PLACED ON THE REPRESENTLE HOUSING MARKET IN OUR GROWING CITY. (BRIEF RECESS) >> THE COUNCIL MEETING IS BACK IN SESSION, JUST POINTS OF CLARIFICATION. FIRST OF ALL, IF EVERYONE COULD TAKE THEIR SEATS, THAT WOULD BE GREAT. JUST SOME POINTS OF CLARIFICATION. SO COUNCIL FLAHERTY THANK YOU FOR YOUR REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION. AT THIS TIME, I KNOW THERE ARE VARIOUS COLLEAGUES WHO WANT TO OFFER AMENDMENTS TO WHAT HAS BEEN RECOMMENDED BY THE CHAIR OF THE COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS. COUNCILLOR O'MALLEY, YOU HAVE

D, SHORT-TERM RENTAL OF ANY OWNER ADJACENT UNIT AND MAY OFFER THEIR OWN ADJACENT UNIT AS A SHORT-TERM RENTAL FOR UP TO 120 DAYS, CONSECUTIVE OR NONCONSECUTIVE DAYS PER YEAR. THANK YOU, MADAM CLERK. >> THANK YOU, MADAM PRESIDENT. A PART OF PARLIAMENTARY INQUIRY, I SPEAK ON BOTH OF THESE AND WE VOTE ON THEM INDIVIDUALLY. >> THAT IS CORRECT. NK YOU, MADAM PRESIDENT, MADAM CLERK. LADIES AND GENTLEMEN, I AM A FAN OF THE GAME JENGA, A BLOCK GAMES WHERE THE BLOCKS FITS CRISS-CROSS ON THE OTHER, BUILD A TOWER, THE PURPOSE IS TO REMOVE THE BLOCKS ONE BY ONE SO YOU TAKE DOWN THE TOWER. I THINK IT'S ON ANALOGOUS SITUATION TO GRAFTING LEGISLATION. IF YOU PULL OUT A BLOCK AT THE WRONG TIME OR JUNCTURE, THE WHOLE THING CAN COLLAPSE. WHILE I APPRECIATE THE CHAIRMAN OF GOVERNMENT OPS AND THING THERE ARE GOOD THINGS IN HIS REVISED ORDINANCE, I THINK THERE COULD BE SOMETHING THAT COULD CAUSE ALL BLOCKS TO FALL, REMOVING THE 120-DAY CAP AND ALLOWING FOR 365 OR UNLIMITED NIGHTS DURING THE COURSE OF THE YEAR. I'M PROPOSALLING AN AMENDMENT TODAY TO REINSTATE THE 120-DAY CAP ON OWNER ADJACENT AND SHORT-TERM RENTALS. IN THE ORIGINAL PROPOSAL FROM THE WALSH ADMINISTRATION IT WAS 90, THEN 120 AND IN THE MOST RECENT ONE HAS GONE TO 365 DAYS. THIS PROCESS HAS EDUCATED ALL OF US ON THE DANGERS OF INVESTOR AIRBNB DOWNTOWN AS WELL AS INVESTOR AIRBNB AND SIMILAR OWNER OCCUPIED LANDLORDS. IF WE REMOVE THE 120-DAY CAP ON THE AIRBNB ON IN ORDINANCE WE

ARE CONDEMNING THE OUTER NEIGHBORHOODS AND MOST VULNERABLE RESIDENTS TO THE UNINTENDED CONSEQUENCES. MY DISTRICT AND YOURS INCLUDE TWO AND THREE-FAMILY HOMES, LANDLORDS LIVE IN ONE AND RENT OUT THE REST TO THE WORKING CLASS OF THE CITY, THOSE NOT ABLE TO YET OWN A HOME. THE COMBINATION OF HOMEOWNERSHIPS AND WORKING CLASS RENTERS IS NOT NEW TO MY CITY. IT'S HOW MY AND MANY OF YOUR FAMILIES GREW UP, HOW RESIDENTIAL NEIGHBORHOODS HAVE THRIVED FOR MIXED COMMUNITIES FOR HUNDREDS OF YEARS. WE HAVE AN INNOVATION ECONOMY I HAVE ALWAYS SUPPORTED AND AM A FREQUENT USER MYSELF, BUT WE ARE CHOOSING ON HOW TO IMPLEMENT THE INNOVATION ECONOMY FOR THE BENEFIT OF ALL BOSTON RESIDENTS, SO I ASK YOU TO CONSIDER THE UNINTENDED CONSEQUENCES OF HAVING NO CAPS IN OUR NEIGHBORHOODS, PARTICULARLY OUR OUTER NEIGHBORHOODS. BY BANNING MOST AIRBNBS AND LARGER BUILDINGS WHILE ALLOWING UNLIMITED AIRBNB AND ADJACENTS, REPUSH THE EVICTIONS AND OTHERS FROM ROCKS DEL, BACK BAY TO EAST BOSTON. BEELIMINATEING THE CAP WE CHANGE A LANDLORD'S ECONOMIC INTEREST, THEY WILL MAKE FAR MORE MONEY BY HAVING A SHORT-TERM AIRBNB PLATFORM THAN RENTING OUT THE UNITS TO A LONG-TERM UNIT. BY ELIMINATING THE CAP WE ALSO PUSH UP THE PRICE OF BUYING A HOME. OUR NEIGHBORHOOD TRIPLE DECKERS ARE SOLD BASED ON THE VALUE OF THEIR RENT. IF THEY ARE SOLD BASED ON THE FAR HIGHER VALUE OF YEAR-ROUND AIRBNBS, BUYING A HOME WILL COST MORE AND BE FURTHER OUT OF REAM. IN THE OUTER NEIGHBORHOOD LOCAL LANDLORDS WHO LIVE DOWNSTAIRS

AND RENT UPSTAIRS, RENT TO NURSES, ARTISTS, PAR BAR TENDS BUT NOW USE THE UPSTAIRS FOR AIRBNB INSTEAD. THIS IS IMPORTANT TO NOTE, WE SHOULDN'T LOOK FOR THE FIGURES OF HOW MANY TRIPLE DECKERS AND NATIOUS ARE CURRENTLY USING OTHER AIRBNBS AND PLATFORMS BUT WHAT THE POTENTIAL COULD BE. MANY OF YOU KNOW BY NOW ESTIMATED WITH 120-CAP, 20% OF THE TWO TO THREE FAMILY UNITS WILL CONVERT TO AIRBNB. WITH NO CAP, WE COULD LOOK AT 10 10%. 1700 HOMES CHANGING FROM RENTERS TO TOURISTS. THIS IS THE UNINTENDED CONSEQUENCE I HOPE WE TAKE SERIOUSLY. I URGE YOU TO SUPPORT ME IN THIS EAVMENT I HOPE YOU WILL VOTE WITH ME TO STOP TURNING BOSTON INTO MANY HOTELS. YOU SHOULD BE ABLE TO MAKE MONEY IN RENTING YOUR HOME OUT TO PEOPLE AND TAKE ADVANTAGE OF AIRBNB AND THAT'S WHY WE ALLOW 120 UP FROM 90. BUT TREMENDOUS PERIL SHOULD THIS PASS TO 365. URGE YOU TO JOIN ME IN 120. THE SECOND AMENDMENT, THIS IS MORE STRAIGHTFORWARD. THIS HAS TO DEAL WITH REPORTING. I RESPECT, OBVIOUSLY, EVERYONE'S SUPPORT FOR SHORT-TERM RENTAL IN TWO AND THREE-FAMILY HOMES AND WE KNOW THERE ARE MANY SIDES OF THIS ISSUE, BUT THE SECOND AMENDMENT THAT WILL BE BEFORE US INCLUDES B&B AND I.S.D., WITH THE COUNCIL, SHOULD IT GO INTO EFFECT, THE TECHNOLOGY NEEDED TO ENFORCE IT, I BELIEVE THIS IS A VERY IMPORTANT ADDITION. I LAID OUT THE POTENTIAL IMPACTS OF REMOVING THE 120-DAY CAP AND THIS AMENDMENT ALLOWS US TO TRACK HOW THE ORDINANCE AFFECTS RENTERS, HOME BIKES HOMEOWNERS AND THE OVERALL HOUSING STOCKED, CALLS FOR TRACKING PACTS TO SEE

HOW EVERY BLOCK IS AFFECTED. BAD ACTION COULD DETER VIOLATERS FROM BEING CAUGHT. EVEN THOUGH I DON'T AGREE WE'VE THING, I PAY TREMENDOUS CREDIT TO THE CHAIRMAN FOR PUTTING TOGETHER SOMETHING SO THOUGHTFUL AND HOPE THE TWO AMENDMENTS ARE ADDED TO IT TO MAKE IT BETTER. >> YOU HAVE THE FLOOR. THANK YOU, MADAM PRESIDENT. I JUST WANT THE -- SO THEY'RE TRYING NOT TO SPEAK ON EVERY AMENDMENT SO I WILL DO SUMMARY -->> NO, YOU CAN SPEAK ON EVERY AMENDMENT AS THEY COME UP. MAKES IT EASIER. >> OVERALL, I WANT TO SAY THIS HAS BEEN A LONG PROTEST FOR THE CITY OF BOSTON AND A LOT OF HOURS OF WORK FOR SO MANY ACROSS THE CITY SO I DO WANT TO THANK MAYOR WALSH AND THE ADMINISTRATION SO MUCH FOR ALL THE TIME AND RESEARCH THEY PUT IN. I WANT TO THANK COUNCILLOR FLAHERTY FOR SHEPHERDING US THROUGH A LOT OF LEARNING AND DISCUSSIONS AND REALLY WORKING HARD TO MAKE SURE THAT EVERY PERSPECTIVE WAS HEARD THROUGH HIS PUBLIC OFFICE HE RAN. I WANT TO THANK COUNCILLOR EDWARDS, MY PARTNER IN THINKING THROUGH CHANGES FROM THE BEGINNING ON THIS, AS WELL AS THE ADVOCATES, SOME OF WHOM ARE ALREADY MENTIONED FOR DOING INCREDIBLE AMOUNTS OF OUTSIDE RESEARCH, BOTH QUANTITATIVE, ANECDOTAL, SECRET SHOPPING RESEARCH ON AIRBNB. INCLUDED THE PROVISION THAT COUNCILLOR O'MALLEY IS HOPING TO REINSTATE WITH HIS AMENDMENT. IT IS THE 120-DAY CAP IS SOMETHING THAT I HAVE ACTUALLY EVOLVED ON. SO I WANT TO CLARIFY AND PUT OUT THERE THAT WHAT I THINK MOST --IS MOST IMPORTANT IS REASONABLE REGULATION THAT WE ENACT TODAY TO LIMIT THIS -- LIMIT THE LOOP LOOPHOLES. WE NEED LEGISLATION PASSED AT THE END OF ALL THESE AMENDMENTS THAT ELIMINATES THE INVESTOR UNITS FROM BOSTON'S MARKET AND ALSO LIMITS IT TO OWNER OCCUPANT. SO WHAT I'M SAYING IS WE WILL BE VOTING THIS WAY AND THAT WAY AT THE END IF THIS AMENDMENT DOES NOT SURVIVE, I WILL STILL SUPPORT COUNCILLOR FLAHERTY'S RECOMMENDED VERSION AS WELL. BUT I WANT TO EXPLAIN WHY I THINK THIS AMENDMENT IS IMPORTANT AND WHY MY THINKING HAS CHANGED ON IT. COUNCILLOR EDWARDS AND I HAD PROPOSED OUR ORIGINAL AMENDMENT, IT DID NOT INCLUDE A CAP ON OWNER-ADJACENT UNITS. I HAVE SINCE LEARNED ABOUT A NEW CO-HOSTING MODEL THAT A LOT OF THE PLATFORMS ARE IMPLEMENTING. THIS ALLOWS FOR OWNER OCCUPANTS WHO WOULD FIT INTO OUR FRAMEWORK TO VERY EASILY PARTNER WITH OR BE CONTACTED BY OR, YOU KNOW, HAVE CORPORATIONS REACH OUT TO THEM IN ORDER TO SET UP A NEW BUSINESS MODEL, AND THE REALITY IS THAT WE'RE NOT QUITE SURE WHAT THE IMPACTS WILL BE ON THE TWO AND THREE-FAMILY SORT OF HOUSING STOCK OUTSIDE OF DOWNTOWN BECAUSE WE DON'T KNOW HOW DEMAND WILL CHANGE, HOW MUCH THE FIRST PART OF OUR REGULATION ELIMINATING INVESTOR UNITS WILL IMPACT THE NEIGHBORHOODS. WHAT WE DO KNOW IS THAT THE CORPORATIONS AND THE PLATFORMS ARE ALREADY CHANGING TO

ACCOMMODATE THAT. THEY'RE ALREADY CREATING THE MECHANISMS TO BE ABLE TO REACH OUT TO EVERY TWO OR THREE FAMILY OWNER OCCUPANT ON THE STREET AND SAY COULD WE, FOR JUST A CUT OF YOUR PROFIT, DO EVERYTHING FOR YOU AND MAKE IT MUCH EASIER THAN IT IS RIGHT NOW TO MANAGE THOSE PROPERTIES? AGAIN, CHANGING -- GETTING AWAY FROM THAT ORIGINAL VISION OF PURE HOME SHARING. THERE IS A POSSIBILITY, WITHOUT THE CAP, THAT WE WILL END UP WITH THESE HORIZONTAL HOTELS OF MANY UNITS ON THE STREET THROUGH PARTNERSHIP MODELS BEING --CONTINUE BEING OPERATED AS DE FACTO HOTELS. WE DON'T KNOW IF THIS WILL HAPPEN AND THAT'S THE UNCERTAINTY. I THINK SOME OF THE DISAGREEMENT IS MANY OF US, AS I THOUGHT BEFORE, AS MY ORIGINAL THINKING WAS, THAT, YOU KNOW, THE DOWNTOWN DEMAND WON'T EASILY TRANSLATE INTO THE NEIGHBORHOOD BECAUSE FROM TRANCE -- DISTANCE FROM TRANSIT, DISTANCE FROM A LOT OF THE TOURIST ACTIVITIES, BUT BECAUSE OF THE BIG UNCERTAINTY, I VOTE ON THE SIDE OF A MORE RESTRICTED AND LIMITED PIECE OF LEGISLATION TO START. WITH IT WILL BE VERY DIFFICULT. I KNOW WE'LL CONTINUE TO TRY TO STAY UP TO DATE AND ADJUST AS WE GO ALONG, BUT A YEAR, TWO YEARS FROM NOW, IT WILL BE DIFFICULT TO CONTINUE TAKING THINGS AWAY FROM NEW BUSINESS OPPORTUNITIES THAT HAVE ARISEN IN THE LOOP LOOPHOLES THAT WE HAVE LEFT OPEN. SO, AGAIN, I SUPPORT THE EFFORTS OF OUR CHAIR HERE AND THE EFFORTS OF THE COUNCIL AS A WHOLE TO GET SOMETHING DONE TODAY BECAUSE WE DESPERATELY NEED ACTION TO STEM THE FLOW OF FUTURE UNITS BEING SUCKED INTO THE DE FACTO HOTEL MARKET.

BUT I WILL BE SUPPORTING COUNCILLOR O'MALLEY'S AMENDMENT HEARTILY WITH BOTH AMENDMENTS. >> COUNCILLOR BAKER. I AGREE WITH THE STATEMENT THAT THE -- REMOVING THE CAP WILL PUSH THE BUSINESS INTO THE NEIGHBORHOODS BUT I WILL NOT BE VOTING FOR THE FIRST AMENDMENT. HOPEFULLY, WHEN THE DATA COMES IN, WE CAN REVISIT THIS HONESTLY AND -- THANK YOU, MADAM CHAIR, AND GOOD JOB, COUNCILLOR FLAHERTY. >> THANK YOU, COUNCILLOR BAKER. FILED IN COUNCIL JUNE 13, TO 18. >> LET ME ADD A LITTLE SPICE TO THE SAUSAGE. >> BECAUSE YOU'RE ITALIAN? I'M ITALIAN. LET ME THANK COUNCILLOR FLAHERTY FOR ALL HIS WORK HERDING THE CATS HERE AND GETTING TO WHERE WE ARE ACTUALLY VOTING ON THIS TODAY. I CAN'T SUPPORT THE RECOMMENDATION FROM THE COMMITTEE REPORT WITHOUT THE INVESTOR UNITS BECAUSE I BELIEVE, AND I'VE SAID MANY TIMES AT THE WORKING SESSIONS, ABOUT UNINTENDED CONSEQUENCES THAT WERE BROUGHT UP BY BOTH COUNCILLOR O'MALLEY AND COUNCILLOR WU. I SEE ALL THE ELIGIBLE UNITS DURING OUR WORKING SESSION IN ORDER TO PROTECT DOWNTOWN WHICH HAS A TOTAL OF 419 OWNER OCCUPIED TWO AND THREE FAMILIES, AND THE TEN NEIGHBORHOODS THAT MAKE UP THE DOWNTOWN, 419. IN THE NEIGHBORHOODS MIX NEIGHBORHOOD, A LITTLE SOUTH OF 17,000. COUNCILLOR WU IMPRESSED ONE OF MY BIGGEST FEARS THAT THERE ARE GOING TO BE AGENTS OUT THERE CONTACTING EVERY OWNER OCCUPANT TRYING TO GET THEM TO LIST, THEY'LL DO ALL THE WORK. I DON'T SEE HOW WE GET AROUNDÑi THAT WITHOUT HAVING COMPETITION. I BELIEVE ALSO WE'RE CREATING AN IMBALANCE IN THE MARKET. 419 IN THE DOWNTOWN CORE VERSUS 17,000 IN THE NEIGHBORHOODS. ECONOMICALLY, I THINK THAT'S BAD IMBALANCE, AND THE IMBALANCE OF -- OH, LET ME REGROUP.

SO THE MOST AFFORDABLE HOUSING IN OUR CITY IS IN THE NEIGHBORHOODS. WE'RE INCENTIVIZING A NEW BUSINESS MODEL WITHOUT HAVING ANY COMPETITION, ANY DOWNTOWN AVAILABILITY IN UNITS, WHETHER THEY ARE BIG BUILDING UNITS, 100-BUILDING UNITS, WHATEVER, AND THEY'RE ABLE TO DO FIVE UNITS. LESS IMPACTFUL ON EVERYBODY'S NEIGHBORHOOD AND CREATES SOME COMPETITION ECONOMICALLY. I WOULD ALSO SAY THAT PUTTING IN HARD-WORKING PEOPLE WHO ARE TIED TO THE SHORT-TERM RENTAL BUSINESS RIGHT NOW, WE'RE GOING TO BE ELIMINATING JOBS. AND FINALLY, WHEN WE START TALKING ABOUT ENFORCING DAYS, I STILL CAN'T BE SATISFIED WITH WHAT I'VE HEARD ABOUT HOW WE ARE GOING TO COUNT DAYS. HOW WILL WE KNOW IF SOMEBODY GOES TO FLORIDA FOR THREE WEEKS AND LEAVES THEIR APARTMENT EMPTY AND CLOSING AN AIRBNB FOR A COUPLE OF WEEKS? HOW DO WE DO THAT? I THINK WE NEED REGULATION BUT COMPETITION FROM BUILD WRINGS PEOPLE GO INTOÑi BUILDINGS, IF THEY'RE ACTUALLY IMPACTING THE BUILDING, OUR NEIGHBORHOODS DON'T FEEL THAT IMPACT. IF WE TAKE AWAY THAT COMPETITION ENTIRELY, WE'RE GOING TO FEEL IT IN EVERY ONE OF OUR NEIGHBORHOODS AND WE'RE GOING TO BE GETTING CALLS FROM EVERYBODY ON OUR RESIDENTIAL STREETS WITH PEOPLE WALKING UP AND DOWN WITH SUITCASES. SO I CAN'T VOTE FOR THIS RECOMMENDATION WITHOUT SOME MEASURE OF COMPETITION FROM THE INVESTOR CLASS. LET ME SAY, WE ARE ALL HORRIFIED WHEN WE HEAR THE ANECDOTAL STORIES OF LANDLORDS VACATING, EVICTING TENANTS TO MAKE IT A DE FACTO HOTEL. THAT SHOULD BE ADDRESSED IN

ZONING AND IN USE. WE DON'T HAVE TO ADDRESS IT THROUGH AIRBNB LEGISLATION. SO I HAVE NO ILLUSION THAT THIS IS GOING TO PASS, BUT I FELT IT WAS NECESSARY TO EXPLAIN WHY I AM PUTTING THIS FORTH. THANK YOU. >> THANK YOU, COUNCILLOR CIOMMO. WAIT, WAIT, NO. NONE OF THAT. THANK YOU. COUNCILLOR BAKER, YOU HAVE THE FLOOR. >> THANK YOU, MADAM CHAIR AND COUNCILLOR CIOMMO. I BELIEVE THIS AMENDMENT TAKES AN APPROACH THAT ONCE WE ALLOW OWNERS OF SMALL UNITS TO RENT 365 DAYS, WHICH I THINK WE SHOULD, AND BAN INVESTMENT UNITS, THIS WILL LIKELY REMOVE MOST IF NOT ALL SHORT-TERM RENTALS IN CERTAIN NEIGHBORHOODS CREATING AN UNEVEN PLAYING FIELD BY ALLOWING A VERY SMALL OF INVESTOR UNITS THROUGHOUT THE CITY, IT DISPERSES THE NUMBERS OF FTRs THROUGHOUT THE CITY TO MANY AREAS. I'M CONCERNED THAT COMPLETELY ELIMINATING INVESTOR UNITS WILL PUSH ALL THE SHORT-TERM RENTALS OUT OF DOWNTOWN AND COO INTO THE SURROUNDING NEIGHBORHOODS WHERE MOST AFFORDABLE HOUSING EXISTS TODAY THEREFORE ELIMINATING THE AFFORDABLE HOUSING. TOTALLY ELIMINATING INVESTOR UNITS WILL BE COUNTERPRODUCTIVE TO WHAT SOME SAY WE SHOULD DO, CREATE MORE AFFORDABLEçóñr HOUSING. ALLOWING BUILDINGS TO BE USED FOR FTR WILL BE ALLOW AFFORDABLE HOUSING IN THE NEIGHBORHOODS. >> COUNCILLOR MACK KARATE. THANK YOU, MADAM PRESIDENT AND COUNCILLOR CIOMMO FOR PUTTING THIS FORWARD AND THANK YOU TO COUNCILLOR FLAHERTY. HE'S WORKED AWFULLY HARD. AGREE WITH HIM, DISAGREE WITH HIM, LIKE HIM, HATE HIM, INDIFFERENT, HE'S WORKED HIS

BUTT OFF AND I APPRECIATE THAT. THIS GOES BACK TO WHAT COUNCILLOR O'MALLEY SAID ABOUT THE UNINTENDED CONSEQUENCES, WHEN AIRBNB STARTED TO POP UP, I WILL BE THE FIRST TO ADMIT WHEN WE STARTED LOOKING AT THE PLATFORMS WITHIN OUR OFFICE, I'M A DISTRICT 5 CITY COUNCIL. HIGH 5 MATTAPAN, WASN'T AWARE OF A HUGE ISSUE. WE HAD A COUPLE, SEVERAL COMPLAINTS, NOTHING BIG. SOUTH OF 3700 PEOPLE ON THE PLATFORM JUST IN ROSLINDALE ALONE. MY DISTRICT 5 IS ALL TWO FAMILIES AND THREE FAMILIES, AND A LITTLE BIT OF COMPETITION MAY HELP US FROM KEEPING OUR FAMILIES TO HAVE TO LEAVE. SO I AGREE WITH MARK AND I WILL BE VOTING IN THE AFFIRMATIVE. >> THANK YOU, COUNCILLOR McCARTHY. COUNCILLOR O'MALLEY, YOU HAVE THE FLOOR. >> THANK YOU, MADAM PRESIDENT. I KIND OF NOW REGRET MY AMENDMENT HAPPENED AT THE BEGINNING BECAUSE I THINK I'VE HEARD AGREEMENT FROM SEVERAL OF MY FOLKS THAT THIS WILL INDEED AS WRITTEN PUSHED THIS ISSUE OUT INTO THE NEIGHBORHOODS. I THOUGHT A 120 CAP WOULD ADDRESS THAT. IN OTHER RESPECTS, I DO NOT THINK HAVING A 5% STR ALLOWANCE IN FILLINGS WILL ADDRESS THAT OR ADDRESS SOME OF THE UNINTENDED CONSEQUENCES THAT HAVE BEEN DISCUSSED. I THINK THAT THE WAY THIS IS WRITTEN IS A LITTLE ILL CONCEIVED, AND I DONATE DON'T KNOW PRACTICALLY HOW IT WOULD BE ENFORCED, SO PERHAPS THROUGH YOU TO THE MAKER, WHO DERLS WHICH 5% OF UNITS IN A BUILDING WOULD BE ALLOWED FOR FTR, FIRST-COME, FIRST-SERVE? IS IT BASED ON WHO'S LIVED THERE LONGEST?

IT SEEMS TO ME THIS WOULD BE EXTRAORDINARILY DIFFICULT TO ACTUALLY ENFORCE, AND THAT IS WHY I WILL BE VOTING AGAINST THIS AMENDMENT. THANK YOU. >> THANK YOU, COUNCILLOR O'MALLY. COUNCILLOR CIOMMO, DO YOU WANT TO ADDRESS? >> IF A LANDLORD HAS A 100-UNIT BUILDING, THEY CAN CHOOSE WHAT 5 APARTMENTS. I DON'T THINK WE CARE. WHEN WE TRY TO ENFORCE NO MORE THAN FOUR, WE CAME UP WITH THE UNIVERSITY ACCOUNTABILITY REPORT BY ADDRESS. MY CONCERN HAS BEEN, WHEN WE START COUNTING DAYS, WHO IS GOING TO SIT AT THE COMPUTER LOOKING AT HOW MANY DAYS THAT ONE IS ADVERTISED ON THIS PLATFORM AND ADVERTISED ON THAT PLATFORM? I THINK, IF WE GET THE SHORT-TERM RENTAL PLATFORMS TO PROVIDE US A UNIVERSALLY ACCOUNTABILITY REPORT THAT GIVES US ADDRESSES AND BASICALLY, BY ADDRESS, THAT'S HOW WE WOULD ENFORCE IT, I HOPE THAT CLARIFIES. AND ONE OTHER THING, PARTICULARLY IN ALLSTON-BRIGHTON, WE HAVE A HIGH STUDENT POPULATION, A LOT OF HOUSING STOCK GOES TO STUDENT RENTALS. I SEE A MODEL THAT NINE MONTHS A YEAR FROM AUGUST TO MAY WILL HAVE STUDENT RENTALS, AND THEN AIRBNB JUNE, JULY AND AUGUST. IT'S A PRETTY GOOD WAY TO MAKE A LOT OF MONEY OFF ONE OWNER. IT'S OWNER OCCUPIED, I GET THAT. I'M AN OWNER OCCUPANT. BUT I THINK IT PERVERTS THE MARKET. SO I WANTED TO SAY HOW I THINK IT PARTICULARLY AFFECTS ALLSTON ALLSTON-BRIGHTON. >> THANK YOU, COUNCILLOR CIOMMO. IS THERE A SECOND TO TAKE A

VOTE? >> SECOND. MADAM CLERK, REFLECT THERE IS A SECOND FROM COUNCILLOR BAKER. AT THIS TIME ALL THOSE IN FAVOR --(VOTING) THE NAYS HAVE IT, THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT BY COUNCILLOR CIOMMO FAILED.
