- Parking is a key point of discussion; on-street parking, commuter parking, and commercial delivery parking were discussed.
- Transportation was discussed as a system to serve all users, with an emphasis on families.
- Connectivity was a central issue for access to nearby neighborhoods and access to the SWC.

 - 0.5% to 1.0% growth per year







Investigations On Street Parking



- Existing curb regulations
- Occupancy
 - 8 a.m., 12 p.m., 5 p.m., 8 p.m.
- Turnover (Egleston Square)
 - Morning Peak
 - Lunch
 - Evening Peak
- 2 weekdays in June
 - Tuesday: after street cleaning conditions (Washington northbound) (restricted)
 - Thursday: base





Investigations Off Street Parking

- MAPC is conducting Perfect Fit Parking Study
- Availability of and desire for residential parking, bike parking
- Early Results:
 - 80% units thus far counted are subsidized
 - Almost all rental units
 - 50% parking included in cost
 - 67% reserved spaces provided
 - Approximately 1 parking space provided for every 2 units




Priority Projects: Egleston Square Improvements Balancing Competing Desires

- Parking availability for local businesses
- Safe bicycle movement
- Reduce delay, to reduce neighborhood cut-through
- Pedestrian safety and comfort
- Related Action Items:
 - Columbus Avenue inbound bus/bike lane
 - Washington Street a.m. bus lane/queue jump





Public Realm Improvements

Priority Projects: Public Realm Improvements Community Proposed Locations

- Public Space Activation
 - Street furniture adjacent to parks and further down Washington Street
 - Washington Street and Forest Hills Street
- Pedestrian Safety and Traffic Calming Improvements
 - Raised crossings at side streets
 - Daylighting at intersections and crosswalks on Washington Street and on side streets










March Public Meeting














WikiMap



- Reload fare card with cash or credit card at vending machines located at all stations and some stops





Existing Projects Sidewalk Café Permit Applications

- Department of Public Works, Public Improvement Commission
- Materials that can be moved, minimum maintained sidewalk width can be required
- As additional pedestrian space is created on Washington Street, existing businesses can choose to pursue this

Best Practices TDM and Development Parking

- Encourage more local developers and building managers to perform and monitor TDM, report annually to the city
- Establish standardized TDM requirements for all developments
- Hire TDM Coordinator





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Neighborhood Traffic Calming



- Identify missing crosswalk locations
- Improve and widen sidewalks
- Curb extensions
- Clarify parking spaces
- Raise crossings
- Narrow lanes



5.2 Traffic Calming

Jackson Square

- Pedestrian flows out of station need improved crosswalks
- Evaluate curb space/lane designation for buses leaving station

5.3 Centre Street/Ritchie Street/ Columbus Avenue Intersection

- Coordination with Highland Park Slow Streets
- Coordination with Vision Zero engineering at Centre Street/Heath Street/ Columbus Avenue Intersection










Green Street Activation






Washington Street Bike Lanes

Comment: NB car traffic is particularly aggressive here. Poor passing space.




