THANKS TO THE QUICK RESPONSE OF APPROXIMATELY 60 MEMBERS OF THE BOSTON FIRE DEPARTMENT ON SCENE, THE BLAZE WAS CONTROLLED ON THE THIRD FLOOR.

THESE FIREFIGHTERS ENCOUNTERED INTENSE HEAT AND A LARGE NUMBER OF FIRE AND RAN INSIDE AND RESCUED A WOMAN TRAPPED ON THE PORCH OF THE THIRD FLOOR. THE FIRE ALARM OPERATOR AND A NEIGHBOR OF COUNCILOR FLAHERTY STAYED ON THE PHONE WITH HER AND KEPT HER CALM THE ENTIRE TIME. FIVE PEOPLE WERE INJURED AND THEY RISKED THEIR LIVES TO SAVE OTHERS AND CONTAIN THE BLAZE. IN AN ACT OF SELFLESSNESS THE FIREFIGHTER ON THE THIRD FLOOR REMOVED HIS AIR MASK AND GAVE IT TO HER TO WEAR AND CARRIED HER DOWN TWO FLIGHTS OF STAIRS OUT OF THE BURNING BUILDING. BOSTON'S EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES WERE ABLE TO QUICKLY TREAT RESIDENTS SUFFERING FROM SMOKE INHALATION AND RUSHED RESIDENTS AND FORTUNATES FIREFIGHTERS AND THEY SECURED

THE STREETS AND CONTROLLED CROWDS AND SECURED BOSTON FIRE AND EMS.

WITH LITTLE FANFARE OUR FIRST RESPONDERS PLACE THEMSELVES IN DANGER TO PROTECT THEIR CITY AND SAVE LIVES.

ELECTRIC SCOOTERS ARE APPEARING ON THE STREETS BECAUSE RESIDENTS USE THEM TO TRAVEL INTO THE CITY.

IF WE CAN COORDINATE THE INTRODUCTION OF SCOOTERS IN BOSTON AND SURROUNDING COMMUNITIES, WE CAN ENSURE THEY CAN PROVIDE TRANSPORTATION ACROSS THE REGION. THEY PROVIDE CONVENIENT AND NEARLY DOOR TO DOOR TRANSPORTATION, THEY HELP FOLKS GET TO A FAR OFF T STATION, PARTICULARLY NOTE WORTHY IN ROXBURY, HYDE PARK AND MATTAPAN WHERE THERE IS NO CLOSE RAPID TRANSIT SYSTEM BUT MANY FOLKS COULD USE IT TO GET THERE. IT HELPS FOLKS THAT WORK IN THE MIDDLE OF THE NIGHT. AND SHOWS SHIFT WORKERS WHO COMMUTE AT TIMES WHEN THE THE MTBADOESN'T RUN. DOCKLESS DOESN'T REQUIRE THE CONSTRUCTION OF EXPENSIVE DOCKS AND COULD BRING NEW FUNDING TO THE CITY FOR ELECTRIC SCOOTER PROVIDERS. THERE ARE MANY CONCERNS BUT THAT'S WHY WE'RE HAVING A HEARING AS THE FIRST UP TO ADDRESS THEM. I HOPE WE CAN CRAFT SENSIBLE REGULATION THROUGH BOSTON HELPS WITH TRANSIT EQUITY WITH SHIFT WORKERS BUT MIGHT CREATE CONCERNS. ELECTRIC SCOOTERS WILL PROVIDE A CONVENIENT WAY FOR PEOPLE TO GET AROUND AND PARTICULARLY HELP AREAS OF THE CITY WHO ARE UNDERS -- UNDERSERVED.AS WE EXPLORE THIS NEW REGULATION, WE CANNOT WAIT TOO LONG, OUR RESIDENTS ARE VOTING WITH THEIR FEET TO GET AROUND IN WAYS NOT APPROVED BY THE CITY. HOPE WE CAN GET IN FRONT TO HAVE THE ISSUE AND PROVIDE FOR CHANGES THE DOCKLESS MOBILITY WILL PROVIDE. >> THANK YOU, MADAM PRESIDENT AND COUNCILLOR O'MALLEY FOR INTRODUCING THIS. 30 YEARS AGO A FRIEND OF MINE SAID TO ME WHEN WE WERE TRAVELING IN CALIFORNIA, WHAT

YOU'RE SEEING IN CALIFORNIA

TODAY YOU WILL SEE IN BOSTON OR THE EAST COAST SIX OR EIGHT MONTHS LATER.

I WAS IN CALIFORNIA, SANTA MONICA IN MARCH, THE BIRDS WERE ALL THE OVER THE PLACE -- THAT'S THE NAME OF THE SCOOTERS -- PLASTIC STRAUS WERE ALSO THERE, SO WE'LL BE HEARING ABOUT THOSE NEXT.

SO SOME OF THE CHALLENGES THEY HAD THERE WAS MORNING THE OPERATORS IN THE END AND WHERE THEY ARE PUTTING THEIR DOCKLESS SCOOTERS.

AS WE ALL KNOW, BOSTON IS UNDERGOING RAPPED REDEVELOPMENT AND REVITALIZATION AND SOUTH BOSTON IS PROBABLY ONE OF THE NEIGHBORS THAT'S BEEN MOST IMPACTED BY THAT INCREASED DEVELOPMENT AND REVITALIZATION AND IF YOU GO TO THE SOUTH BOSTON WATERFRONT YOU LOOK AT THE BUILDING SITE AND THE INDUSTRIAL PARK AND THE PROPOSAL FOR FORM EDISON SITE, YOU LOOK AT THE GROWTH ZONE, THE SECTION OF DORCHESTER AVENUE FROM ANDREW SQUARE TO BROADWAY, WHETHER YOU LOOK AT, QUITE FRANKLY, THE

INVESTORS AND DEVELOPERS, I THINK TIME HAS COME TO REVISIT THE NEW ZONING SCHEMES. THE NEIGHBORHOOD WENT THROUGH REZONING A COUPLE OF YEARS AGO WITH ARTICLE 68 AND, AS A RESULT, THERE WERE SOME DEEFFICIENCIES IN SOME TO HAVE THE SCHEMES, PARTICULARLY PERTAINING TO THE NO MINIMUM LOT REQUIREMENT SPACE SAVER. AS A RESULT OF WHICH WE HAD TO REACT AND IMPLEMENT THE SOUTH BOSTON PLANNING OVERLAY DISTRICT KNOWN AS iPod OVERLAY, AND WITH THIS IN MIND, COUNCILLOR PRESENTING THIS ORDER FOR HEARING REGARDING THE OVERALL ZONING OF SOUTH BOSTON, THE REZONING OF EAST AND WEST BROADWAY AS WELL AS THE DEFICIENCIES THAT EXIST BECAUSE THERE'S NO MINIMUM LOTS AND A BIG PART OF IT IS BORNE OUT OF MEETING FATIGUE, FOLKS ARE MEETING OUT IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD. THEY'RE GOING TO SO MANY MEETINGS BECAUSE SO MUCH DEVELOPMENT IS HAPPENING, TRYING TO RAISE THEIR FAMILIES AND TRYING TO WORK THEIR ONE OR TWO JOBS, TRYING TO TAKE CARE OF THEIR ELDERLY AND SICK RELATIVES AND AS A RESULT THEY'RE GRABBING US ON THE LOCAL STREETS SAYING WHAT'S GOING ON AND HOW DOES THIS OR THAT WORK, AND IT REALLY INSPIRED THE MEETING THAT OCCURRED LAST WEEK IN EAST BOSTON THAT COUNCILLOR EDWARDS PROPOSED AND COUNCILLOR WU WAS KIND ENOUGH TO CHAIR, AND WE'RE LOOKING TO HAVE A CITY COUNCIL HEARING ON THE OVERALL ZONING OF SOUTH BOSTON, THE PROPOSALS THAT ARE IN THE PIPELINE AND ARE CURRENTLY BEING DISCUSSED AND HOW THAT IS WITH ARTICLE 68. EVERYONE ELSE WANTS TO TALK ABOUT OUR NEIGHBORHOOD, LIKE MANY OF YOURS, THEY'RE CUT THROUGH COMMUNITIES. BOSTON CAN ONLY BE SO BIG. WE'RE NOT NEW YORK, WE'RE NOT

CHICAGO, WE'RE NOT L.A., WE'RE ONLY SO BIG, AND A BIG CHUNK OF US IS SURROUNDED BY WATER. WE'RE ARGUABLY A PENINSULA. DESPITE THIS WE'LL CONTINUE TO GROW AND INVITE PEOPLE TO COME HERE, INVEST HERE, GET A GREAT EDUCATION, GET GREAT MEDICAL HEALTH CARE AND FINANCIAL SERVICE ATTENTION. ON JUNE 25th, 2018, MORE THAN 1250 WORKERS HAVE BEEN LOCKED OUT BY NATIONAL GRID.

I VISITED THE MEN AND WOMEN IN WEST ROXBURY.

THERE WAS A GREAT RALLY IN CITY HALL PLAZA THAT WENT TO THE STATE HOUSE.

COUNCILLOR FLYNN AND I DID A LETTER SHORTLY AFTER THE LOCKOUT BEGAN AND WE HAD A THOUGHT OF DOING A RESOLUTION.

MY THOUGHT WAS A TWO-WEEK BREAK. IT CONTINUES.

IT'S BEEN MORE THAN A MONTH.
THESE ARE MEN AND WOMEN BEING

WOMEN BEING TREATED SO
INCREDIBLY UNFAIRLY, MEN AND
WOMEN WORKING FOR A COMPANY WHO
HAVE SEEN THEIR PROFITS GROW
EXPONENTIALLY YET NOT SUPPORTING
THE MEN AND MEN, THE HIGHLY
SKILLED MEN AND WOMEN WHO
PERFORM VITAL PUBLIC SAFETY

THIS HEARING AND PARTNERSHIP WITH A BROAD AND DIVERSE GRAPH AND COALITION I WAS A PART OF THAT'S PART OF EQUITABLE OPPORTUNITIES NOW IS TO MAKE SURE THAT, IN REAL TIME, WE ARE IMPLEMENTING THIS LEGISLATION IN SUCH A WAY, THAT WE ARE PRIORITIZING THESE BUSINESSES THAT ARE LOCALLY OWNED AND THAT THERE IS AN EQUITY IN BOTH WORKFORCE AND ALSO IN OWNERSHIP, AND, AGAIN, I SEE THIS IS A CRIMINAL JUSTICE ISSUE, BUT THIS IS NOT ONLY ABOUT THOSE WHO HAVE PREVIOUSLY BEEN INCARCERATED. AS I STATED BEFORE, I HAD SEVERAL LOOKING IN HYDE PARK, MATTAPAN AND ROSLINDALE, ALREADY.

THE TEAMS THAT ARE LOCAL TEAMS ARE WELCOMED TEAMS.

ONE OF THE MOST MEMORABLE VISITS THAT WE HAD WHEN I WAS IN DENVER WAS IN SIMPLY A SMALL STORE OWNED BY A MINORITY COUPLE. I HAD A CAPITOL MEMORIAL SHIRT AND HE SAID YOU'RE KIDDING ME, HE WENT TO ARCHBISHOP IN NEW ORLEANS AND GREW UP IN

THE POINT HE WAS MAKING IS HE WAS THE ONLY MINORITY BUSINESS OF ALL THE LICENSES DENVER HAD GIVEN AROUND.

THIS IS A HUGE ISSUE CERTAINLY IN MY DISTRICT AND THROUGHOUT THE CITY, THE ISSUE OF EQUITY

AND WHO IS GOING TO BE LEFT BEHIND.

SO MANY FOLKS IN MY DISTRICT HAVE BEEN MARGINALIZED AND PENALIZED AROUND THIS ISSUE OF CANNABIS, AND THIS IS A REAL OPPORTUNITY TO HELP SUPPORT WOMEN BUSINESS OWNERS, MINORITY BUSINESS OWNERS, AND I WORRY, BUT WE ARE GOING TO MISS OUT, AND NOT JUST BECAUSE WE'RE NOT NECESSARILY GOING TO IMPLEMENT IT WELL, BUT BECAUSE WE, YOU KNOW, STILL HAVE A LOT OF THE NOT IN MY BACKYARD ISSUE. WHEREAS THE NEW V.A.W.A.

LEGISLATION WAS INTRODUCED TO CONGRESS AS MEMBERS WERE DEPARTING FOR RECESS, LEAVING A FEW SHORT WEEKS ON RETURN TO DISCUSS THE REAUTHORIZATION AND PASSAGE OF THE LEGISLATION BEFORE THE SEPTEMBER 30th EXPIRATION, THEREFORE IT BE RESOLVED THAT THE BOSTON CITY COUNCIL MEETING ASSEMBLED GO ON RECORD IN SUPPORT OF THE VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN ACT AND NEWLY ADDED PROVISIONS EXPANDING YOUTH EDUCATION AND PREVENTION PROGRAMS, STRENGTHENING PROTECTION FOR VICTIMS AND DEVELOPING A VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN DIRECTOR POSITION WITHIN H.U.D. AND URGES CONGRESS TO PASS THE REAUTHORIZATION V.A.W.A. FILED ON AUGUST 1, 2018.

>> COUNCILLOR PRESSLEY, YOU HAVE THE FLOOR.

>> THANK YOU, MADAM PRESIDENT.
IN A FEW MOMENTS, WE'LL TAKE A
VOTE ON THE REVISED SEXUAL
HARASSMENT POLICY THAT WE'VE
DEVELOPED AS A BODY AND
INITIATED BY COUNCILLOR ZAKIM
AND MYSELF.

SO WE KNOW THAT THERE IS A NEED FOR AN ELEVATED CONSCIOUSNESS AROUND SEXUAL HARASSMENT, SEXUAL ASSAULT AND SEXUAL VIOLENCE AND THE #METOO MOVEMENT, ENOUGH IS ENOUGH AND TIME'S UP.

WHAT HAS BEEN MISSING FOR THE NATIONAL CALL FOR ACTION AND ELEVATED CONSCIOUSNESS IS DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, AND I DO BELIEVE THAT IS BECAUSE IT IS AN ISSUE WHERE IT IS NOT ONLY PAINFUL THAT CONSIDER THAT SOMEONE YOU LOVE COULD BE OPPRESSED AND BRUTALIZED IN SUCH A WAY, BUT EVEN HARDER TO GRAPPLE WITH THE FACT THAT SOMEONE YOU LOVE COULD DO THAT TO SOMEONE.

IT'S INCUMBENT UPON US TO MAKE SURE THAT IN THIS ELEVATED MOMENT OF CONSCIOUS ISSUES THAT WE ARE INTEGRATING DOMESTIC VIOLENCE INTO OUR POLICY MAKING. I GREW UP IN A HOME WHERE SOMEONE BEAT MY MOTHER AND DID EVERYTHING TO BEAT NOT ONLY THE LIFE OUT OF HER BUT THE HOPE OUT OF HER, AND IT WAS A RELATIONSHIP THAT SHE STAYED IN OUT OF ECONOMIC DEPENDENCE AND FOR FEAR THAT WE WOULD HAVE NO PLACE TO CALL HOME. AND THAT IS A STORY FOR MILLIONS OF WOMEN.

AND WHEN OUR COMMONWEALTH -- AND IN OUR COMMONWEALTH ALONE, APPROXIMATELY HALF OF WOMEN IN MASSACHUSETTS HAVE BEEN CONNECTED TO THIS ISSUE IN SOME WAY.

IN THIS REVOLUTION WHICH IS SELF-EXPLANATORY, THERE WERE TWO WHEREASES I WANT TO LEFT UP THAT I THINK ARE ESPECIALLY IMPORTANT.

THERE IS NEW VIOLENCE AGAINST
WOMEN LEGISLATION THAT
INCORPORATES PROVISION FOR
EXPANSION OF EDUCATION AND
PREVENTION PROGRAMS, AND THIS IS
THE PART I WANT TO UNDERSCORE,
STRERPTENNING PROTECTIONS FOR
WOMEN UTILIZING HOUSING GRANTS.
THIS CONTINUES TO BE AN ISSUE
WHERE WOMEN LIKE MY MOTHER
CANNOT GET EMERGENCY HOUSING AND
REMAIN IN AN ABUSIVE ENVIRONMENT
TO HAVE SHELTER AND BECAUSE OF
ECONOMIC DEPENDENCE.

STRENGTHENING PROTECTIONS FOR WOMEN UTILIZING HOUSING GRANTS AND CREATING A VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN DIRECTOR POSITION IN THE DEPARTMENT OF H.U.D.

NOW THE REASON WHY WE'RE DOING THIS RESOLUTION IS BECAUSE THE NEW BY LAW LEGISLATION WAS INTRODUCED TO CONGRESS AS THEY WERE RECESSING, UPON THEIR RETURN LEAVING A FEW WEEKS TO PASS THE RELATIONSHIP BEFORE THE SEPTEMBER 30th EXPIRATION. IN THAT THIS IS OUR ONLY OPPORTUNITY TO LIFT UP THIS ISSUE AND TO STAND IN SOL TATER

AND TO DOUBLE DOWN IN THE NEED FOR THESE NEW PROTECTIONS, THAT IS WHY COUNCILLOR EDWARDS AND I ARE INTRODUCING TODAY.

>> I WANT TO COMMEND THE MAKER. THANK YOU AGAIN FOR INVITING ME TO HAVE COMMENTS ABOUT THIS. I FULLY SUPPORT THIS ALSO BECAUSE OF THE EXPERIENCE I HAD IN REPRESENTING MANY IMMIGRANT WOMEN.

AS MANY PEOPLE MAY NOT BE AWARE, IT'S ENCOURAGING US TO TELL WOMEN TO TELL THEIR STORIES, MANY WHO WILL NOT COME FORWARD BECAUSE THEY'RE UNDOCUMENTED OR IN IMMIGRATION PROCESS. THIS PROTECTS THE VICTIMS OF CRIMES AND HELPS US TO PROSECUTE AND HAVE WITNESSES IN TRIAL FOR THE PROTECTED TO HAVE THEIR VOICES HEARD AND WILL PROVIDE A SPECIAL MECHANISM THAT OUR POLICE OFFICERS AND PROSECUTORS USE TO HELP PROVIDE THIS PROTECTION FOR A LOT OF THE WOMEN TO COME FORWARD. I THINK ALSO IT'S IMPORTANT TO ECHO MANY OF THE THINGS THAT MY COLLEAGUE HAS ALREADY STATED. THIS IS ABOUT ECONOMIC JUSTICE AS WELL.

THIS IS ABOUT A NATIONAL CONVERSATION WHICH I DON'T THINK COULD HAPPEN UNTIL 1994 WHEN BELA HAD PASSED WHERE THE NATION RECOGNIZED THAT VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN IMPACTED US ECONOMICALLY AND IN SUCH A HUGE WAY AND ON MULTIPLE LAYERS OF OPPRESSION, NOT BECAUSE MANY WOMEN FELT THE BELIEVEDDENT LEAVE, BUT MANY WOMEN WEREN'T GOING TO WORK, MANY WOMEN WERE LOSING JOBS BECAUSE OF MISSED DAYS AT WORK, LOSING THEIR JOBS OR BEING DISCIPLINED BECAUSE OF THE FACT THEY WERE LATE TO WORK OR DOING ALL SORTS OF WAYS TO COVER UP

THE ABUSE THEY WERE SUFFERING FROM.

SO THERE WAS AN ECONOMIC IMPACT AS WELL AND BEING ABLE TO PROVIDE THESE RESOURCES, THIS EDUCATION AND SUPPORT SYSTEMS WAS VITAL FOR US AS A NATION TO TAKE THAT STEP FORWARD. SO I AGAIN ECHO MANY OF THE COMMENTS THAT COUNCILLOR PRESSLEY HAS SAID AND I WANTED TO AGAIN JUST EXPRESS THAT MANY, MANY LEVELS OF WHICH THIS INCREDIBLE LEGISLATION HELPS PEOPLE, DOCUMENTED, UNDOCUMENTED, ECONOMICALLY WITH HOUSING AND TO MAKE SURE THAT WE SEE THAT VIOLENCE IS MULTI-FACETTED AND THAT IT ALSO IMPACTS WITH THEM ANYWAY. >> THANK YOU, COUNCILLOR EDWARDS.
